1. ADM Grain Division, c/o Ms. Karena Musgrave, 4666 Faries Parkway, Decatur, Illinois 62526, (217) 424-5817, has applied:

a. To the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, St. Louis District Regulatory Branch, for authorization under Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act to conduct periodic excavation at ADM's existing Naples, Illinois river terminal. An approximate 70-foot-wide by 600-foot-long area would be excavated on an as needed basis to maintain adequate depths to allow uninterrupted barge access to the grain loading terminal. An excavator would be utilized to remove accumulated materials when low river conditions or excess river deposits threaten to shut down river terminal operations. The excavation would be conducted to maintain approximately 12 to 15 feet of river depth in the barge loading area. Excavated material would be loaded into contained hopper barges and delivered to the bank for offloading onto trucks. The material would then be transported to an approved, upland landfill. No excavated material would be redeposited into the Illinois River. The activity site is located in the Northeast ¼ of Section 12, Township 15 North, Range 14 West, at 1673 Growmark Lane, in Naples, Scott County, Illinois. ADM's river terminal is situated along the left descending bank of the Illinois River at approximate River Mile 66.1. The attached figures provide additional details.

b. To the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, Office of Water Resources for state approval of the proposed work in accordance with "an Act in relation to the regulation of the rivers, lakes and streams of the State of Illinois" (Ill. Rev. Stat.; Chap. 19, par 52 et seq.). Written comments concerning possible impacts to waters of Illinois should be addressed to Mr. Mike Diedrichsen, Illinois Department of Natural Resources, One Natural Resource Way, Springfield, Illinois, 62702-1271, with copy provided to the Corps of Engineers.

2. Based on our initial processing of the applicants' proposal, the action is not expected to result in any significant adverse effects on the quality of the human environment. However, a final determination of the need for an environmental impact statement will not be made until the St. Louis District has completed its full review of this application. The review will include our evaluation of any written responses received as a result of this public notice.

3. This permit will be processed under the provisions of Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act.

4. The St. Louis District will evaluate information provided by the State Historic Preservation Officer and the public in response to this public notice and we may conduct, or require a reconnaissance survey of the project area.


5. The proposed project is within range of the federally endangered Indiana Bat (*Myotis sodalis*), the threatened Eastern prairie fringed orchid (*Platanthaera leucophaea*) and Decurrent false aster (*Boltonia decurrens*). A preliminary determination, in compliance with the Endangered Species Act as amended, has been made that the proposed river excavation and associated landfill disposal is not likely to adversely affect species designated as threatened or endangered, or adversely affect critical habitat. However, in order to complete our evaluation, this public notice solicits comments from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and other interested agencies and individuals.

6. Any interested parties, particularly navigation interests, Federal and state agencies for the protection of environmental and cultural resources, and the officials of any state, town, or local associations whose interest may be affected by this work, are invited to submit to this office written facts, arguments, or objections on or before the public notice expiration date. The decision whether to authorize the proposed work will be based on an evaluation of the probable impact, including cumulative impacts of the proposed activity on the public interest. The decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. The benefits, which reasonably may be expected to accrue from the proposal, must be balanced against its reasonably foreseeable detriments. All factors which may be relevant to the proposal will be considered; among those are conservation, economics, aesthetics, general environmental concerns, wetlands, historic properties, fish and wildlife values, flood hazards, floodplain values, land use, navigation, shoreline erosion and accretion, recreation, water supply and conservation, water quality, energy needs, safety, food and fiber production, mineral needs, consideration of property ownership, and, in general, the needs and welfare of the people. Project authorization will be granted only if it is found not contrary to the public interest.

7. The Corps of Engineers is soliciting comments from the public; Federal, state, and local agencies and officials; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this proposed activity. Any comments received will be considered by the Corps of Engineers to determine whether to issue, modify, condition, or deny authorization for this proposal. To make this decision, comments are used to assess impacts on endangered species, historic properties, water quality, general environmental effects, and the other public interest factors listed above. Comments are also used to determine the overall public interest of the proposed activity.

8. Any person may request that a public hearing be held to consider the applicant's proposal, provided such request identifies significant issues that would warrant additional public review and comment. All replies to this public notice must be submitted in writing and sent to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, St. Louis District, 1222 Spruce Street, Attn: OD-F (Frerker), St. Louis, Missouri 63103-2833, or by electronic mail to charles.f.frerker@usace.army.mil, on or before the public notice closing date.


