Deer & Turkey Hunts for People w/ Disabilities

In 1988, Mark Twain Lake started the first deer hunt for people with disabilities in the state of Missouri. This hunt occurs during Missouri firearm season. Since then, it has expanded to include an annual spring turkey hunt. Both hunts are hosted in the Indian Creek Recreation Area which offers a safe environment and an abundance of game. Hunters are offered transportation to and from the hunting areas, game retrieval, camping opportunities, meals, fellowship and tall tales. An average of 35 participants enjoys a quality outdoor experience that may not otherwise have an opportunity to do so. It is well supported by the local community by providing services and resources for the event. Mark Twain Lake partners include Bob Kendrick and the Monroe City Volunteers, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the Paris Lions Club.
