Flood Duty	1. Illness or injury to the worker.	1. Use good judgment 2. Be aware of traffic hazards, both driving and when out of vehicle. 3. Wear clothing suitable to the weather in the work area. 4. Be aware of water hazards around flooded rivers and streams. 5. Wear personal floatation devices (PFD) when working in water or near dangerous currents. 6. Never attempt to drive a vehicle through water over the road. 7. Be alert for health hazards including heat exhaustion or frostbite.
