

# Carlyle Lake Bike Trail

The Carlyle Lake Bike Trail is a 10.3 mile trail maintained by the Corps of Engineers and provides one of the most breathtaking views of the lake while riding across the Main Dam. The trail is generally flat and well-marked with signs providing a safe experience for all levels of riders.



# City of Carlyle Bike Route

The City of Carlyle Bike Route includes historic tree-lined streets, sidewalks and an established bike trail. From the Carlyle Lake Visitor Center, this route takes travelers through downtown Carlyle, displaying the unique shops and restaurants it has to offer. The route also leads to the General Dean Suspension Bridge, which spans the Kaskaskia River. The bridge is named after Major General William F. Dean, a native of Carlyle, who served during the Korean War. The General Dean Suspension Bridge is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.



### Carlyle Lake Extended Bike Route

If you are a skilled bicyclist ready for a challenge, consider the 65-mile Carlyle Lake Extended Bike Route that encompasses the entire lake. Be aware that this route utilizes county and township roads without dedicated bike trails or signage.

premier destination for bicyclists of all skill levels.

Bicycling surfaces within the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and State of Illinois parks are made up of trails and roads that are permitted for bicyclists. You may encounter vehicular traffic (including trailers and campers) and pedestrian traffic on roads and trails. Please always wear an approved helmet, safety equipment and obey the rules of the road.

Bicycling surfaces within the City of Carlyle are made up of sidewalks, trails, and streets. City sidewalks and streets are designed primarily for pedestrians and vehicles, but bicyclists are permitted users of both. You may encounter vehicular and pedestrian traffic on streets and sidewalks. City streets are currently not signed for bicyclists. Some city streets are periodically surfaced for maintenance with loose rock, which may make pavement surfaces slippery. Please supervise youth bicyclists.
