



ARRA 2009 Section 110 Project Overview

The 2009 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA)¹ Section 110 Project is one of three ARRA funded efforts undertaken by the Corps and managed by the St. Louis Engineer District's Mandatory Center of Expertise for the Curation and Management of Archaeological Collections (MCX-CMAC).²



For the ARRA 2009 National Historic Preservation Act, Section 110 Archaeological Investigations Project, three primary Cultural Resources Management (CRM) firms are under contract with the Corps to provide a variety of technical services and support to the 36 participating districts (*Table 1*), including:

- (1) Complete background investigations of properties.
- (2) Complete archaeological survey/inventory and evaluations on Corps fee-title lands.
- (3) Inventory and evaluate Historic Properties (i.e. buildings and structures).
- (4) Determinations of eligibility of Historic Properties to the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP).³
- (5) State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO)⁴ and Tribal Historic Preservation Office (THPO)⁵ consultation.
- (6) Curation of recovered cultural and archaeological materials.
- (7) Development of survey and inventory results for future Corps preservation planning and historic context efforts.
