# **A Historical Analysis of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry in World War II 1941-1945**

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## Executive Summary

In August of 1998 The Slaughter by Carroll Case was published. The central theme of the novel is that the Army allegedly put more than a thousand men of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry to death at Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi in 1943 and have conspired to hide the evidence ever since. The Department of Defense and the Department of the Army received requests from Congressman Bennie Thompson (MS) and The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, to determine if there was any factual basis to the allegation. This report is being issued to put to rest any concern that these alleged events were even remotely possible. All parts of the report are complete with the exception of additional interviews of living veterans that will be added when finished.

The U.S. Army Center of Military History conducted a thorough and detailed review of available materials in the National Archives to examine the history of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry's service during World War II. Particular attention was paid to any indication of unusual or explicable loss of personnel during the regiment's wartime service. The review was based on thousands of documents of the regiment itself, its higher headquarters, and relevant War Department material. As is not uncommon of World War II units, many of its records were destroyed in the early 1950s to make room for records from the Korean War.

Despite this incomplete body of documents, a very clear history of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry can be established. Not only did the regiment report periodically to its higher headquarters, but three lengthy War Department inspector general investigations of the regiment and a detailed survey on racial attitudes were conducted between October 1942 and September 1943. Correspondence files of various War Department offices including those of the Civilian Assistant to the Secretary of War (the senior War Department adviser on policy toward African Americans) were consulted to determine policies that applied both to African American units in general and to the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry in particular. Pertinent records held by the National Personnel Records Center, St. Louis, Missouri, were reviewed and a database created of soldiers assigned to the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry during April through December 1943. This list was cross-checked against available personnel and other records to establish the status of these men at time of discharge. All of the nearly 4,000 men who were assigned to the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry in 1943 have been traced to their separation from military service.

The documentary record was not the only means used to verify the facts of the Regiment's service, interviews have been conducted as well. Summaries of the interviews conducted to date are included. This oral testimony, while limited by the age of these former soldiers and the natural difficulty with recall of events more than fifty years in the past, is consistent with the rest of the research. The Army is committed to the difficult task of finding more veterans to interview to complete the historical record of the 364<sup>th</sup>'s World War II experience.

**HISTORY OF THE 364<sup>TH</sup> INFANTRY**

## The Beginning

In the 1920s the Army began considering plans for the mobilization of African Americans in the event of war. Based on experience gained in World War I, the importance of African American manpower was obvious, but it was not until the approach of World War II that concrete plans, including the type and number of units to be formed, were made. By 1940 the Army leadership had decided to organize three separate infantry regiments of African American enlisted men as part of the Troop Basis, Protective Mobilization Plan, 1941. In November 1940, the War Department ordered the activation of the 366th Infantry Regiment at Fort Devens, Massachusetts; the 367th Infantry at Camp Claiborne, Louisiana; and the 368th Infantry at Fort Huachuca, Arizona.<sup>1</sup>

The 364th Infantry Regiment was initially formed as the 367th Infantry at Camp Claiborne on 25 March 1941 under the command of Colonel Ralph C. Holliday. A cadre of white Regular Army officers and African American noncommissioned officers (NCOs) was responsible for the training of nearly 3,000 inductees. This first draft of men, with no military experience, came largely from Florida, Louisiana, and Mississippi. The regiment received good reviews during its participation in the Third Army maneuvers in the Louisiana Maneuver Area in September 1941. The Third Army inspector general's report issued at the conclusion of the exercise noted: "Police of campsite and general appearance was superior. Discipline and appearance of the men was excellent. Inquiry into the conduct of the men in nearby communities indicates that this regiment has an exceptionally good record in this respect."<sup>2</sup> Colonel Holliday was justifiably proud of his regiment's achievements after a few short months of training and published them for circulation throughout the unit.

The stability of the regiment and its training program were soon disrupted by changing requirements after the outbreak of the war. A year after the 367th Infantry was organized it was drastically changed; half of its personnel were transferred. The 1st Battalion received orders for overseas movement on 26 March 1942. It would serve first in Liberia guarding an airfield and later in North Africa and the Mediterranean theater. The regiment was also ordered to send 860 enlisted men to the 24th Infantry at Fort Benning, Georgia, as replacements to ready it for imminent deployment overseas. These orders would not only leave the 367th Infantry at half strength, but without its 1st Battalion. The unit, redesignated the 364th Infantry, prepared to absorb new draftees and begin a new training cycle. Although replacements were not long in coming, most received little or no training until they arrived at Camp Claiborne. Complicating this turbulence was the impending reassignment of the 364th Infantry from Army Ground Forces to the Western Defense Command in Arizona. Another destabilizing factor was the change of command from Colonel Holliday to Colonel Fred Wickham in February 1942, a change that would prove both fateful and unfortunate for the 364th.

When the 364th Infantry was transferred in June 1942 to the Southern Land Frontier (a subordinate command of the Western Defense Command responsible for the

security of a large area of the southwest and based at Papago Park, outside Phoenix, Arizona), the situation rapidly deteriorated.

## Arizona

In 1942 the Western Defense Command was responsible for guarding the United States from attack by the Japanese. At the time the 364th Infantry was assigned to the Southern Land Frontier the fear of sabotage in support of an invasion, or seaborne raids, seemed very real. The 1st and 3d Battalions remained in the vicinity of Papago Park; the 2d Battalion was sent to the south with elements around Tucson, Douglass, Yuma, and Nogales. The effect of this dispersion would be difficult to mitigate under the best of circumstances, and these were far from the best.

The arrival of the regiment at Camp Papago in all probability lowered the men's morale. The only permanent buildings were tarpaper shacks for regimental headquarters and a mess hall. The men were quartered in tents in the desert without flooring. Adding to their frustration was the mission of providing static guards and roadblocks at various installations throughout Arizona. Training did continue, but it was hampered by a chronic shortage of officers, the dispersion of the battalions, and the lack of suitable infantry training areas. The combined factors of boredom and isolation undoubtedly took a toll, but failure of the regiment's leadership was to have tragic consequences.<sup>3</sup>

The War Department first learned that there were serious problems in the regiment in a letter written in October 1942 by Chaplain (First Lieutenant) Llewellyn Thornhill to the chief of chaplains, complaining about the conditions in the camp and about the violent and racist behavior of the 364th Infantry's executive officer, Lieutenant Colonel Hugh Adair. The complaint was forwarded to the Office of the Inspector General for investigation. The investigating officer, Colonel Carl L. Ristine, recommended Colonel Adair's relief.<sup>4</sup>

The issue did not end there; another investigation was conducted that month by Headquarters, Western Defense Command, prompted by a congressional inquiry from Senator Joseph Guffey that was forwarded by the War Department inspector general for appropriate action. Senator Guffey was concerned about the dire tone in a constituent's letter, complaining of brutal treatment and warning that a riot could happen at any time. The investigations reached similar conclusions: the erratic behavior of Colonel Adair could not be tolerated and a change in leadership was necessary. Southern Land Frontier recommended Colonel Wickham also be removed.<sup>5</sup>

These recommendations were not acted upon in time to prevent two incidents, which led to the 364th Infantry's acquiring, perhaps unjustly, the reputation of an undisciplined and mutinous unit. The first incident occurred on the night of Friday, 13 November 1942, when prisoners in the stockade refused to obey Colonel Wickham's order to get off its roof. Yelling and catcalls from the prisoners drew a crowd that also refused Colonel Wickham's order to disperse. Wickham later told investigators that he

thought the incident minor and that it would be forgotten. But it was clear evidence that the men would no longer willingly follow his orders. The second incident was far more serious and resulted in loss of life. It was rooted in a September 1942 change of policy by Western Defense Command that shifted the responsibility of policing soldiers on pass in Phoenix from the 364th Infantry to an African American Military Police (MP) company from the 733d MP Battalion. Colonel Wickham realized that the MPs would be resented by his men who had been policing themselves since arriving in Arizona and repeatedly tried to convince Western Defense Command to change this arrangement. What followed is usually referred to as the Phoenix Massacre.<sup>6</sup>

All three battalions of the regiment had returned to Papago Park after various guard details and training exercises. Colonel Wickham, in a well-meaning but ill-considered gesture, wanted the men to have a special Thanksgiving dinner followed by the first passes some of the men had had in weeks. All soldiers were required to eat in their mess halls, and a virtually unlimited quantity of beer was provided. Not surprisingly many of the men became drunk. The precipitating incident occurred when a soldier from the 364th Infantry, reportedly intoxicated, and his female companion were involved in an altercation outside a café in Phoenix. An MP from the 733d arrested the man and took him into custody. A group of soldiers from the regiment, in the café, witnessed the arrest. A crowd formed and the MPs fired one shot each into the air and one of them sent a second shot into the ground. The shot fired into the ground ricocheted and struck a 364th Infantry soldier. Two civilian police arrived on the scene at this time and dispersed the crowd. The trouble was not over.

Soldiers at Papago Park heard an exaggerated account of the incident, and a group of them eventually secured arms and ammunition and returned to Phoenix. During the course of the night several shooting incidents between the police and men of the 364th Infantry took place. Witness statements are confused at best, but the result was fourteen persons shot—two soldiers and one civilian were killed. The War Department Inspector General's Office immediately sent Brigadier General Benjamin O. Davis, Sr. (the senior African American officer in the Army and a deputy inspector general), and Colonel Joel R. Burney to conduct an investigation.<sup>7</sup>

The investigation concluded that the disturbance could be attributed directly to both lack of discipline and poor morale in the 364th Infantry. It also concluded that it was not the result solely of the events of the night of the 26th, but the culmination of problems that had been present for some time, including things as basic as a lack of adequate clothing and footgear for the soldiers and inadequate living conditions—in short, a failure of leadership. Also cited was the effect of exaggerated rumors that the 733d MPs were shooting the men of the 364th Infantry on the streets of Phoenix. Responsibility for the shooting deaths could not be clearly established because the police as well as soldiers from the 364th Infantry engaged in uncontrolled firing.<sup>8</sup>

A total of fifteen 364th Infantry soldiers were tried by courts-martial for disobeying orders, mutiny, and inciting a riot; fourteen were sentenced to varying terms of imprisonment of up to fifty years. One soldier, Private Joseph Sipp, was sentenced to

death. President Franklin D. Roosevelt personally reviewed Sipp's case and set it aside. All the other convictions were also eventually set aside, with the soldiers returned to duty in other units.

The investigators recommended that corrective actions be taken and that those responsible for conditions in the regiment be disciplined. The most significant step had already been taken: Colonel John Goodman replaced Colonel Wickham and assumed command of the 364th on 29 November 1942. Colonel Goodman was a West Point graduate (Class of '16) and an experienced infantryman. He immediately took the kind of steps that would be recognized today as the mark of a leader. He saw to the construction of permanent barracks and adequate latrines and bathing facilities as well as proper issue of clothing and equipment. Most important, he began the infantry training program from the ground up to correct deficiencies in soldier skills found by the Western Defense Command in its investigation.

By this time the potential threat to the southwest from attack or sabotage was seen to be slight. A new mission had to be found for the 364th Infantry. It was tentatively slotted to go to the European theater sometime in 1943 or 1944. In order to be ready for overseas movement the regiment had to go through an intense training cycle that could not be accomplished at Papago Park due to a lack of adequate training areas. The decision to send the regiment to its next duty station, Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi, was not for punitive reasons, as some writers have implied, but to ready it for deployment. An Army Ground Forces memorandum for the War Department G-3 put it clearly:

This headquarters concurs in the proposed reassignment of the 364th Infantry to the Army Ground Forces for final training preliminary to the employment of the regiment in an overseas theater. Upon directive from you, this headquarters will initiate necessary action to transfer the 364th Infantry from Phoenix, Arizona, to Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi, and to reassign it to the Army Ground Forces on arrival.<sup>9</sup>

Unfortunately, although the War Department and General Davis approved this transfer, it was to lead to more disruption within the unit and the further characterization of the unit as unreliable, even mutinous.

## **Camp Van Dorn**

The 364th Infantry arrived in Centreville, Mississippi, outside of Camp Van Dorn by train in two groups on 26 and 27 May 1943. Rumors of the unit's troubles in Arizona may have preceded it, but whatever the reason, its arrival in Mississippi led to problems almost as soon as it arrived. The demographic make-up of the regiment had changed fundamentally from its organization as the 367th Infantry. Most of the nearly 2,000 replacements came not from the south, as had almost all the initial draftees, but from the north. Although some men looked forward to the move as a chance to be close

to family and friends, to a majority it was a trip into a virtually unknown and foreign land where a man of color often had to fear for his life.

It may be easy to dismiss this fear today, but in 1943 it was all too real for many African Americans not used to living under the racial restrictions of Jim Crow laws enforced in the south. Although the Army itself was segregated, it was run by rules and regulations, and therefore predictable. The official War Department policy prohibited discrimination, while accepting separation. To many soldiers of the 364th Infantry, Mississippi represented a kind of no man's land where the law did not necessarily apply to them. Added to the natural fear of not knowing where the war would take them next, this perceived lack of legal protection created a climate in which disturbances could take place. All the painstaking efforts of Colonel Goodman to improve performance and morale were about to be undone.

On the first night the 364th Infantry arrived at Camp Van Dorn, 27 May 1943, a group of soldiers entered a service club reserved for African Americans carrying beer, which was against the rules of the club. They refused to leave when asked by the hostess and remained for an hour after closing time. As with so many other incidents involving the regiment, it is important to make clear that although an NCO from the regiment identified many of the men as being from the 364th Infantry it is not necessarily true that all the men breaking the rules were from the regiment.

The following night, Friday, 28 May 1943, another incident usually associated with the 364th took place. After a group of soldiers in Post Exchange number 11 became noisy the exchange officer ordered the exchange closed. A crowd formed outside and began throwing beer bottles at the building. Eventually they forced their way into the exchange and helped themselves to the merchandise. The total loss was estimated to be in excess of \$800.00.<sup>10</sup>

On Saturday, 29 May 1943, an incident took place that was directly attributable to the men of the 364th. Early in the evening a group of soldiers, estimated as being up to seventy-five, marched into the town of Centreville. Again, rumor is likely to have exaggerated both the numbers and behavior, but townspeople complained that the men sang obscene songs and shouted insults. The men returned to post without incident and no one was injured.<sup>11</sup>

Sunday would bring both incident and injury. About 4:30 in the afternoon Sergeant Charles Hix, a Camp Van Dorn post MP, was in town with his partner on patrol. He stopped a group of African American soldiers for a routine spot check of uniforms and passes. One soldier, Private William Walker of Company A, 1st Battalion, 364th Infantry, refused to button a sleeve, perhaps because it was missing a button. The MP asked him for his pass. What happened next is not completely clear because the eyewitnesses are not in complete agreement, but some details are obvious. Sergeant Hix got out of his jeep and was reaching for his nightstick when Private Walker knocked him back into the jeep on his back and attempted to seize the MP's sidearm. At this point Hix's partner failed to come to his assistance and solve the matter quickly. Three local

law enforcement officers, including Sheriff R. Whitaker of Wilkinson County, witnessed the struggle. Private Walker saw the arrival of the police and got out of the jeep. Sheriff Whitaker swore under oath that he ordered Private Walker to stop. When Walker did not, Whitaker shot him. He never said whether he thought Private Walker was armed. Walker was put into the jeep and taken to the post hospital where he was pronounced dead.<sup>12</sup>

As was the case on Thanksgiving night in Phoenix, rumors started immediately. Several events occurred almost simultaneously. A group of soldiers started a disturbance at an exchange located near the 364th Infantry's barracks area. Groups of soldiers having heard of the shooting began to gather in the Company A area. About the same time soldiers broke into the Company C arms room and took several weapons including M1 rifles and a Browning automatic rifle.

The Company C arms room was also the scene of an act of conspicuous bravery. While several men forced their way into the supply room the supply sergeant, Technician Fourth Grade Booket Watkins, refused to surrender the keys to the locks on the rifle racks, forcing his assailants to break a rack to get a few rifles. Despite verbal and physical assaults Watkins held his ground, preventing the wholesale theft of weapons. For his dedication to duty and display of selfless physical and moral courage Watkins was awarded the Soldier's Medal. His award recommendation rightly says that his actions almost certainly prevented loss of life.<sup>13</sup>

Having heard of the trouble at the exchange Major Jewel Suddath, Camp Van Dorn's provost marshal, sent a section of African American MPs to break it up. He may have thought that following the shooting of Private Walker white MPs would seem like a provocation to the men, but he was unaware of the regiment's experience in Phoenix with the 733d MPs. Some soldiers watched the arrival of the MPs and began to shout, "Here they go again just like in Phoenix." Some men rushed the MPs and tried to get their weapons. The MPs fired several shots, one of which struck Private Raymond Johnson, an apparently innocent bystander, in the leg. Fortunately, the wound was not serious.<sup>14</sup>

Colonel Goodman realized something had to be done quickly before the situation got completely out of hand. Taking the regimental chaplain, Chaplain (Captain) Elmer Gibson, with him he went to the exchange and began talking to the men. He and the chaplain moved among them, defusing the situation. He gave orders to the battalion commanders to assemble their men and talk to them to calm the situation. The night closed without further trouble.<sup>15</sup>

The incidents of 27-30 May 1943 sent shock waves all the way to the War Department. Once again the Inspector General's Office sent an investigator to determine the facts. This time it was again Colonel Joel Burney, who had participated in the investigation of the Phoenix riot. All told three investigations were conducted into some or all of these incidents by the post commander, Colonel Robert E. Guthrie; the Third Army inspector general (Third Army was then the 364th Infantry's next higher headquarters); and the War Department inspector general.<sup>16</sup>

Third Army conducted the most comprehensive of the three investigations. Colonel C. C. Park, the investigating officer, recommended the battalions be reorganized and converted from infantry to service troops. He also recommended that Colonel Goodman be relieved. Lieutenant General Courtney Hodges, Third Army commander, accepted neither recommendation. Colonel Park did recognize that the facilities at Camp Van Dorn were inadequate for the 364th and recommended improvements in the availability of goods in the exchanges and use of post theaters—these recommendations were acted upon.

The Inspector General, Major General Virgil L. Peterson, was concerned when he read Colonel Burney's report and wrote a detailed memorandum on the 364th Infantry to the deputy chief of staff, dated 8 June 1943. In this memorandum he made it clear that he believed the recent events formed a pattern and stressed the need to take firm disciplinary action and discover the identities of the "ringleaders" of the incidents. In the inspector general's investigation, as in the Third Army investigation, finding the responsible parties proved impossible. The Acting Civilian Assistant to the Secretary of War, Mr. Truman Gibson, was given a copy of the inspector general's memorandum for comment. He took strong exception to the report and forwarded a detailed four-page memo of this own to the deputy chief of staff. In it he said: "Despite the very high regard and respect I have for the Inspector General I wish to respectfully disagree with his sentiments, particularly because they represent, perhaps, the majority opinion in the Army. . . . the use of harsh and repressive measures against Negroes is no solution to the problem."<sup>17</sup>

One technique the Army used to try to find the source of the problem was to infiltrate agents of the Counter Intelligence Corps, trained in countersubversion, into the unit. One such agent, George F. Kennedy, was infiltrated into the unit on 2 June 1943. Agent Kennedy was experienced and well regarded. His report of conditions in the 364th would be circulated throughout the War Department and played a significant role in later decisions on the employment of the 364th Infantry. In his agent report of 12 June 1943 Kennedy referred to the men of the regiment as "a group of undisciplined delinquents." He also wrote, "Trouble will spring up spontaneously at the slightest provocation where groups are gathered." It is significant to note what he did not say: as was confirmed by later intelligence reports, there was no evidence of subversive intent or outside agitation. These men were troubled, and Kennedy had seen them at their worst, but they were not organized in any way to promote trouble.<sup>18</sup>

A later intelligence report written by another CIC agent infiltrated into the regiment was circulated in November 1943. This report by Agent Homer B. Scretchings, based on his observations as a member of Company E, 2d Battalion, from 21 October through 7 November 1943, reinforces the conclusion that the men of the 364th were not subversive, nor were they being influenced by outside agitation. His report states:

The investigation indicated that all reported incidents were not premeditated and were not inspired by any subversive influences. It appeared to be caused solely through general laxity of military

discipline. It is the belief of this Agent that the reported incidents should be handled by local command action.<sup>19</sup>

Clearly both agents realized that while some of the men of the 364th Infantry were undisciplined the problem was not so great as to require the intervention of higher headquarters.

Camp Van Dorn was not unique in having problems with its troops in the summer of 1943. Camp Stewart, Camp Claiborne, and Fort Bragg had far more serious incidents than did Camp Van Dorn, including the loss of many lives. Chief of Staff George C. Marshall was concerned that there would be serious damage done to the war effort if it was not abundantly clear to all commanders that they had a responsibility to seek out the causes of racial incidents and to take active steps to prevent their occurrence. His 13 July 1943 memorandum sets out War Department policy, and command responsibility, in no uncertain terms:

A study of detailed report of many such cases indicates that there is general evidence of failure on the part of commanders of some echelons to appreciate the seriousness of the problem and their inherent responsibility. Also apparent is the lack of appreciation of the urgent necessity of continuous and vigorous action to prevent incidents of discrimination and the spread of inflammatory gossip and to take positive preventative measures to spike an impending outbreak. In some instances officers have not exercised that close supervision which is necessary to keep them aware of the pulse and temper of their unit.<sup>20</sup>

This letter, it should be noted, was drafted with the help of the Advisory Committee on Negro Troop Policies, the text approved by the Civilian Assistant to the Secretary of War, Mr. Truman Gibson.

Colonel Goodman now had to begin again the task of building up the morale and proficiency of his regiment. He again went back to basics with a rigorous program of training in fundamentals such as marksmanship, crew-served weapons qualification, and road marches. He also arranged for additional transportation for men on pass to be able to travel out of the vicinity of Camp Van Dorn to larger towns.

Morale did not improve overnight, however, and many men complained to their families or to African American newspapers about what they perceived as harsh conditions at Camp Van Dorn. Several congressional inquiries into conditions at the camp were directed to the War Department, including one from the influential senior senator from Virginia, Harry Flood Byrd. By the end of July 1943 the regimental chaplain noted in his monthly report that morale had begun to improve.<sup>21</sup>

The month of July was to bring the last incident involving the men of the 364th in a disturbance. On 3 July 1943, the hostess of the African American service club planned

a dance and invited about 200 young women of color from neighboring communities. Unfortunately she advertised the dance around a camp that had 8,000 African American soldiers. Naturally more soldiers arrived than could be accommodated. MPs arrived after hearing there was trouble, followed shortly thereafter by the field officer of the day (FOD). Believing the MPs inadequate for the situation the FOD called for the ready battalion of the 99th Infantry Division to respond. By the time it arrived, most of the soldiers had returned to their units. No one was hurt. Once again, it must be stressed that the 364th Infantry was not the only African American unit at Camp Van Dorn and it is not accurate to assign sole blame for incidents of indiscipline to it. In a letter dated 14 July 1943 to Mr. Gibson, Chaplain Gibson (no relation) wrote of the incident, "I am very proud to state that none of our men were directly involved in this affair."<sup>22</sup>

Training in the regiment continued through the summer of 1943 without incident. The regiment was going through a progressive unit training cycle to prepare to participate in the Third Army's fall maneuvers at the Louisiana Maneuver Area. The 364th Infantry did depart for the maneuvers on 17 November 1943 but would not stay to complete them. While the regiment had been training at Camp Van Dorn the War Department had been deciding its future.

### **Alaska Defense Command: The Aleutians**

When the 364th Infantry departed Arizona for Camp Van Dorn, it was tentatively slated to be employed in the European theater; however, by September 1943 that requirement had been deleted from Army plans. The effect of the inspector general's numerous investigations and the reports of CIC agents greatly reduced the confidence of Army Ground Forces and the War Department in the potential fighting qualities of the 364th Infantry. In September, Colonel Lathe B. Row of the War Department Inspector General's Office began a series of surveys on racial attitudes at posts, camps, and stations in the South, beginning with Camp Van Dorn.

His report was widely circulated for comment, and his conclusions about the 364th were influential in determining the regiment's future:

**That the presence of the 364th Infantry constitutes a threat to the normal peaceful conditions at Camp Van Dorn. That the 364th Infantry should be transferred at an early date from Camp Van Dorn for overseas duty. That other than the situation [in the 364th], the outlook for generally harmonious relations between white and Negro personnel at the camp is good.**<sup>23</sup>

The War Department G-3 (Director of Organization and Training), Major General Ray Porter, reviewed the report and wrote a short note dated 6 November 1943 that finalized the plan for the 364th Infantry:

As you know I am most anxious to have Negro troops sent to combat; however, the 364th Inf. does not appear to fit into any practical scheme. It will not be ready for shipment prior to March 1944. Many officers have rated the regiment as a menace. Perhaps it is wise to trade it to Alaska for a good white regiment & seek to have some other Negro unit sent to combat.<sup>24</sup>

At this point things began to move very fast for the regiment. It was brought back early from the Louisiana Maneuvers on 1 December 1943 and given three weeks to process for overseas movement. On Christmas Day 1943, the regiment entrained for Seattle to begin its journey to Alaska.

Finally, after two and a half years in the United States the 364th Infantry had a mission, the defense of several key installations in the Aleutian Islands. Although the Japanese had been defeated in a short and bitter campaign, the threat remained that they might conduct attacks against American bases. This solution of what to do with the 364th Infantry seemed to meet all the requirements the War Department had set: an early departure from Camp Van Dorn, an overseas assignment, and commitment to an area where combat was not imminent. In Alaska the regiment was to show its critics that when properly led and given a soldier's job to do, they were as good as any troops.

Regimental headquarters was established on the island of Adak, the site of a large harbor and an air base. As in Arizona the regiment was split up: 1st Battalion to Amchitka, 2d Battalion to Shemya, and 3d Battalion to Attu. The performance of the battalions is reflected in the reports of umpires during field exercises. For example, during a test alert on Shemya the 2d Battalion umpire commented: "Staff . . . was able to operate efficiently. Journal was kept properly. Speed of communications within the CP [command post] was satisfactory."<sup>25</sup> A similar alert exercise conducted on Amchitka with the 1st Battalion noted some deficiencies in command post operations, but concluded, "In spite of the miserable weather, the troops went into position and stayed there."<sup>26</sup> This only proves what General Davis had been convinced of all along: given a mission to perform as soldiers, the men would do all right.

The end of the war brought the gradual demobilization of the 364th Infantry and the return of the men to their homes and families. The regiment was inactivated in 1946. The remaining men were organized into two battalions: 1st Battalion became the 80th Infantry Battalion; 2d Battalion, the 81st Infantry Battalion. By then virtually all of the men who had been drafted into the regiment during the war were gone. Colonel Goodman relinquished command of the 364th Infantry in 1944 to become Commander of Troops Shemya, then, as a brigadier general, Commander of Troops Adak. He retired in 1946 and died the following year.

## Rumors

It was unfortunate for the 364th that it was often the victim of unfounded rumors, particularly during the troubled months from November 1942 through July 1943. Rumors played a role in the violence in Phoenix on Thanksgiving Day when some of the men believed the stories that the 733d MPs were beating and shooting their comrades. Rumors circulating after the shooting of Private William Walker in Centreville undoubtedly made the violence within the regiment worse that night. Rumors that may have preceded the regiment to Camp Van Dorn probably affected the way it was treated upon arrival.

There were other, far more sinister rumors that circulated around Camp Van Dorn when the regiment served there. Fourth Service Command (Camp Van Dorn's higher headquarters) intelligence files contain the text of several letters that allege killings and the kidnapping of white officers by African American soldiers. Apparently, rumors like this also circulated even after the 364th Infantry left for Alaska.<sup>27</sup>

Similarly, War Department files contain dozens of letters from soldiers, their loved ones, members of Congress, clergy, members of the African American press, and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), all wanting to know what was happening to the men of the 364th Infantry in Phoenix, and later at Camp Van Dorn. The War Department took these inquiries very seriously, and all were forwarded to Mr. Truman Gibson for his personal review. These files are now in the National Archives and clearly show the continuous dialog between the African American community and the War Department.<sup>28</sup>

There are several other valuable sources for information about the men of the 364th Infantry, the most significant being the NAACP files in the Collections of the Manuscript Division, Library of Congress. The NAACP's Camp Van Dorn file contains a great deal of correspondence that caused the organization concern. It communicated with Mr. Gibson on a regular basis to run to earth complaints and rumors and to encourage the Army to take corrective action when needed. There are letters from troubled soldiers and loved ones who had heard of the shooting of William Walker and were concerned about the soldiers' very lives. There are several letters from Chaplain Gibson, himself an NAACP member.<sup>29</sup>

Perhaps most important are the documents relating to an investigation of Army camps that the organization began in 1944. Coordinating closely with Mr. Gibson, NAACP members traveled all over the United States to evaluate the conditions of service of African Americans. They were very forthright in their condemnation of discriminatory practices wherever they found them. Their survey was targeted against the posts that they considered the worst for African Americans. Notably, although they list Camp Van Dorn as a camp about which they had received complaints they characterize these complaints under the heading of "general discrimination" not brutality or mistreatment. Camp Van Dorn was not visited during the investigation.<sup>30</sup>

The NAACP was not alone in its interest. African American clergy and the press were equally concerned with the treatment the men received. The shooting of William Walker was a front-page news story in the *Chicago Defender*.<sup>31</sup> The Reverend James Horace of Chicago conducted his own survey of conditions in November and December of 1943. He forwarded his results to the War Department, where they were widely circulated.<sup>32</sup> Although he did not visit Camp Van Dorn, he did travel through Mississippi and gave a detailed account of how the men were treated at nine posts throughout the south.

The significance of all these efforts is that the rumors about Camp Van Dorn so troubling in letters and gossip were never substantiated. The men of the 364th Infantry often gave voice to their complaints, just like other soldiers. Perhaps the rumors had a life of their own because the men were so vocal. It is important to remember that Camp Van Dorn was not an island — men came and went every day. The 364th was not alone; at any given time there were nearly 30,000 soldiers at Camp Van Dorn. Why then would rumors of shootings persist?

Rumors often have a basis in fact which makes them difficult to discount. In the case of the 364th this was true in both Phoenix and Camp Van Dorn. The rumors of mass shootings at Camp Van Dorn may have their basis in an incident that took place in 1944 in the same area occupied by the 364th Infantry the previous year.<sup>33</sup> Two African American soldiers got into a fight at the local exchange. A soldier from the 1697th Combat Engineer Battalion was stabbed. Soldiers from the victim's unit stole several rifles and some ammunition and fired on the barracks of the unit they felt responsible for the assault, the 394th Quartermaster Company. When the shooting stopped two men had been seriously wounded. Everyone on post or in Centreville would have heard the shooting. No one could have missed seeing the bullet holes in the buildings. Over time this relatively small, but serious incident could have taken on larger proportions. Whatever the source of the stories they have never been borne out by any evidence.

## Conclusion

The 364th Infantry endured a somewhat troubled service during World War II before it proved itself a competent and useful unit. Its history can be well established by careful examination of the available documentary record. Although not specially addressed in this paper the personnel records of men assigned to the 364th Infantry were also carefully reviewed. The record is clear that the regiment was plagued by a series of unfortunate incidents that gave it the appearance of an undisciplined unit. When finally given a chance to serve, the unit met the Army standard as soldiers typically do: quietly and competently. There is absolutely no reason to conclude otherwise.

## **Methodology**

Adequately researching the history of the 364th Infantry in the National Archives required a careful screening of many Record Groups. The lack of documents in regimental history files was mitigated by examining the records of posts where the 364th Infantry was stationed, the chains of command at those installations (Fourth Service Command, in the case of the Camp Van Dorn period), and the various headquarters to which the regiment was assigned, including Army Ground Forces, Third Army, the Western Defense Command and the Alaska Defense Command. The records of the Secretary of War, the Army Staff, the Adjutant General's Office, and the Office of the Inspector General were reviewed in detail. In addition, the records of the NAACP and African American newspapers held by the Library of Congress were studied. Nearly one work-year of research was conducted by professional Army historians; more than a quarter of a million pages of documents were scrutinized.

Subject: Investigation of Disorder in 364th Infantry Regiment.

To : Commanding General, Third Army, Fort Sam Houston, Texas.

I. AUTHORITY

1. This investigation was made at Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi, June 1 - 6, 1943, by Colonel C. C. Park, I.G.D., pursuant to verbal orders of the Commanding General, Third Army.

II. MATTER INVESTIGATED

2. The investigation was of certain disorders in and adjacent to the barrack area of the 364th Infantry Regiment. Inquiry also was made with respect to certain apparently related incidents and conditions within and in the vicinity of Camp Van Dorn.

III. FACTS ("Q" refers to numbered questions in Exhibit "B".)

3. Previous disorders involving personnel of the 364th Infantry.

a. Previous mutinous disorders on the part of Negro personnel of this regiment in Arizona are described in Exhibit "A" by Colonel Joel R. Burney, I.G.D., who investigated them.

b. Those disorders were followed by stern disciplinary action against known participants; they were also followed by a construction program which provided modern garrison facilities for the regiment.

4. Disorder in Service Club, Thursday, May 27, 1943.

During the evening of May 27, after troop trains of the 364th Infantry arrived at Camp Van Dorn from Arizona, a large number of men in work clothing entered the colored service club and created considerable noise and commotion. They brought beer into the club, which was against the rules, and used loud and profane language. They inquired whether their reputation had preceded them, whether these present had heard of what they had done at Phoenix, and announced that they took over wherever they went and that they would change things here. They did not leave until an hour after closing time and ignored the suggestions and requests of the colored hostess and master sergeant in charge. Though no identifications were obtained, the statements of the senior hostess and of the Negro master sergeant indicate that most of the men who created the disturbance were from the 364th Infantry (Q. 19; Exhibits "D", "E" and "F").

5. Disorder at Exchange No. 11, Friday, May 28, 1943.

a. During the evening a crowd of unidentified colored soldiers in front of Exchange No. 11 appeared to the Exchange Officer, Captain Tyson, to be on the verge of becoming boisterous. The Exchange Officer ordered the Exchange closed about 1915. The crowd then began throwing beer bottles at the sides and roof of the building, used disrespectful language toward the Exchange Officer, and dared him to come into the crowd. After Captain Tyson left to get help the crowd forced its way into the Exchange, ignored and threatened the manager, and helped themselves to the stock. A board of officers found a loss of merchandise valued at \$893.64. No individuals were identified. The Exchange Officer informed the investigating officer that from the fact that the dress of many of the soldiers was different from that which had been worn by colored soldiers at Camp Van Dorn, he believed that members of the 364th Infantry predominated (Exhibit "T").

b. Colored soldiers in the crowd jerked open the doors of a passing car, grabbing by her shoulder the driver who is the wife of an Army officer. Later they forced the car, then driven by the officer, off the roadway and threw stones and bottles against the car (Exhibit "W").

6. Disturbance in Centreville, Saturday, May 29, 1943.

During the evening the Provost Marshal received a call from Centreville to the effect that a large group of colored soldiers who had threatened trouble were enroute to Centreville. He went to the town, found about 75 colored soldiers in a group, and ordered them to go back to camp. They went without further disorder. No identifications appear to have been obtained. (Q's. 37, 41-44, 181-184).

7. Shooting of Private William Walker, Sunday, May 30, 1943.

On Sunday afternoon, May 30, at about 1630, on a highway just off the reservation, two MP's on patrol met four colored soldiers, one of whom, Private William (NMI) Walker, ASN 36170964, Company "A", 364th Infantry, they directed to button his shirt sleeve. When he did not comply, the MP Sergeant reached for his club and the Negro soldier sprang upon him in the 1/2-ton truck. While they were tussling, three civilian officers (a sheriff, deputy, and the Marshal of Centreville) approached, drew their guns, and scattered the three other colored soldiers. After an argument the colored soldier, who had the MP Sergeant down in the truck, got out and started toward one of the civilian officers who shot him. He was dead a few minutes after being taken to the hospital (Q's. 37, 45-93, 568; Exhibit "C").

8. Disorders in area of 364th Infantry, Sunday, May 30, 1943.

a. When the news of the shooting reached the 364th Infantry about 1700, considerable excitement occurred. Some soldiers collected in groups and were heard to make threatening remarks, particularly in the vicinity of the barracks of Company "A", of which Private Walker was a member. They were cautioned by the Company Commander, the Battalion

Commander, and by others to be orderly. As the crowd appeared to be breaking up it was discovered that some men had broken open the supply room and that several rifles had been removed. Noncommissioned officers were sent for these rifles and, so far as known, none left the Company area.

b. Shortly thereafter Negro soldiers at Exchange No. 221, adjacent to the area of the 364th Infantry, ejected 5 white soldiers from the Exchange and ordered the clerks to leave. Upon request of the manager, colored MP's were sent to the Exchange. A crowd of several hundred colored soldiers soon surrounded the MP truck, threatening to wreck it and to attack the MP's. Officers of the 364th intervened and ordered the men back. However, some men in the crowd let the air out of the tires of the MP truck, rocked the vehicle, and threatened to turn it over. One soldier snatched a pistol from an MP's holster, another MP took it from him, and the crowd closed in, whereupon an MP fired two shots, one of which struck Private Raymond (NMI) Johnson, ASN 34066051, Company "C", 364th Infantry, in the thigh. The crowd then fell back, Colonel Goodman, Commanding Officer of the 364th Infantry, arrived on the scene, and the crowd dispersed. Colonel Goodman then ordered the men assembled by battalion and tried to calm them down.

c. Immediately following the shooting of Private Johnson, a group of soldiers rushed into Company "C" supply room where three lieutenants and the supply sergeant were removing firing pins from the rifles. They grabbed rifles over the opposition of these officers and supply sergeant, pushed one of the officers out of their way, struck the supply sergeant, and scattered. Noncommissioned officers were sent to get these rifles and, so far as known, none were taken outside the company area (Q's. 97-680; Exhibits "F", "K", "M", "U", and "V").

d. In the general confusion which followed the shooting, troops removed merchandise and cash from Exchange No. 221 to the extent of \$126.16 in merchandise and \$236.85 in cash (Exhibit "U").

#### 9. Identification of those participating.

a. Little effort was made during or immediately following the disorder to identify those who took an active part in it. When the investigating officer began interviewing witnesses to secure identifications, effective steps to this end were taken by responsible commanders in the 364th Infantry.

b. When the investigating officer left, the investigation within the regiment was under way and twenty-one (21) enlisted men who were identified as participants had been confined. Evidence then available against individual enlisted men is shown on Exhibit "AA".

c. Several men tentatively identified as participants were then AWOL and one was absent on pass. Other definite identifications were expected (Q. 573).

d. Evidence had been obtained as to misconduct of Negro officers as shown on Exhibit "AB".

#### 10. Limited Exchange Facilities.

a. On Saturday night, June 5, 1943, the investigating officer visited the two exchanges then serving Third Army non-divisional troops. They were very crowded and unattractive. Men were standing in lines, some in long lines, waiting to be served. The stock was limited and service slow and inadequate. Most of the demand was for bottled goods, but this interfered with purchase of necessities. The exchange next to the 364th Infantry Area had been closed following the disorder of Sunday evening and was still closed (the Camp Commander stated because of inability to secure employees to work in it). This left one exchange (in a mess hall type of building) to serve approximately 9,000 Negro troops.

b. Some exchanges in the 99th Division area had outside beer gardens, which materially relieved the congestion there. The Exchange Officer said that it was planned to provide these outside beer gardens for all exchanges (Q's. 4-7, 13; Exhibit "I").

#### 11. Theatres.

The theatre adjacent to the area of the 364th Infantry, which was used for both white and Negro soldiers, had been closed pending a decision as to whether it should be used for both races. This left but one theatre for Negro soldiers on June 5, 1943.

#### 12. Status of training.

The status of training of the 364th Infantry is indicated by Exhibit "Y". The training in progress during the week May 31 - June 5 is shown by Exhibit "Z". The appearance and saluting of this regiment are excellent. It is now undergoing three weeks' preparation for MTP tests. It had been doing guard duty and its training, some of which is more advanced than the thirteen week course, has been lacking in thoroughness. This is now being corrected. Its principal weakness is reported to be a lack of non-commissioned officers who are reliable.

### IV. DISCUSSION

#### 13. Scope of investigation.

a. Boards of Officers. In addition to the investigations ordered by Colonel R. E. Guthrie, Commanding Officer, Camp Van Dorn (Exhibits "C" and "V"), investigations of the death of Private Walker and the shooting of Private Johnson were ordered by the Commanding Officer, 364th Infantry, and by the Commanding Officer, 12th Headquarters Special Troops, Third Army. The investigating officer examined the evidence obtained by each of these boards of officers in each case. The evidence generally was similar to that shown in Exhibits "C" and "V". A number of witnesses before these boards were examined by the investigating officer, but their testimony has been incorporated only where it seemed to throw additional light on the matter.

b. Witnesses to disorders of Sunday, May 30th. The investigating officer interviewed numerous witnesses who could only corroborate other testimony, or who could give nothing of material value. Their testimony is not included in this report.

c. Inconsistent testimony. Numerous inquiries were made with respect to apparent inconsistencies, a few examples of which follow:

(1) With respect to the statements of the Negro soldiers (Exhibit "C"), to the effect that Private Walker stated he had no buttons on his sleeves, the investigating officer ascertained that the shirt worn by Private Walker had buttons on both sleeves. This lends credence to the testimony of the MP's that Private Walker refused to button them.

(2) Though certain statements indicated that the Provost Marshal knew much of the disturbances at the two exchanges, his testimony (Exhibits "T" and "U") shows that he was not present during either of these disturbances and there is no evidence that he was present (Q. 41).

(3) Some testimony indicates that an officer was dispatched with the MP Platoon sent to Post Exchange No. 221 during the disturbance there. The investigating officer interviewed the Platoon Sergeant who was in charge, and he stated that no officer accompanied him.

#### 14. Attitude of officers.

a. The white officers of this Regiment appear to be average or better, and there is no indication of misconduct on their part during the disturbance. However, they gave the impression of discouragement and loss of perspective, and most of them feel that the colored noncommissioned officers are not reliable. At first they seemed relieved that there had been no more serious violence and were inclined to accept the attitude of the soldiers as inevitable in view of the chain of circumstances. However, before the investigating officer left they began taking definite action to identify and discipline offenders and to assume a more aggressive attitude. The Commanding Officer stated to the investigating officer that he felt the following officers should be replaced, without prejudice to them, because they had lost confidence and perspective:

To this list the investigating officer would add, for the same reasons, the names of the following officers:

Captain John A. Sommerville, Jr., 0354599, Adjutant, 364th Inf.

b. Reclassification proceedings have been instituted against Captain Charles L. Ellis, Company Commander, Company "A", and against one white lieutenant and one Negro lieutenant. The battalion commander who instituted them emphasized that the reasons were not especially related to the disorder of May 30, but were based upon observed lack of capacity.

c. Negro Officers. There are thirty-nine Negro officers with the 364th Infantry, most of whom are second lieutenants. The Negro Chaplain and the field officers were unanimous in their expression of disappointment in the capacity of these officers. They reported that many of them lacked basic training and that they did not seem to bridge the gap between an enlisted man and what an officer should be. One battalion commander stated that he had one particularly good officer (a former Olympic track star) out of fifteen (15) Negro officers, but that some of them seem to be thinking more of racial uplift than of military efficiency. Another said he had heard several of them say that whites and Negroes should intermarry. Several Negro officers appear to be guilty of misconduct during the recent period of disorders.

#### 15. Intelligence of Soldiers.

a. Of the approximately 3,000 men in this regiment, it was reported that 1109 are Class IV and 1277 are Class V.

b. Many of the officers interviewed suggested that Negro soldiers from the northern cities should not be mingled with those from southern rural districts. They stated that southern Negroes feared those from the North and were dominated by them, and that many northern Negroes have a contempt for those from the South, intimidate them and induce them to participate in illegal acts which the more cunning conceivers themselves avoid.

#### 16. Other incidents.

a. (1) Private Mitchell Askew, Company "H", 364th Infantry, reported to his commanding officer that on Monday evening, May 21, he was arrested by MP's in Centreville for lack of a proper pass, taken to a back room, beaten with a strop, and then released. Inquiry was made by the Commanding Officers of 12th Headquarters Special Troops (Colonel Smith) and 364th Infantry (Colonel Goodman), who interrogated a white soldier confined in another room at the MP Headquarters at the time. He told them he heard sounds like a beating and someone pleading to stop it, but he could not see what was going on. Private Askew was examined by a medical officer who could find no evidence of the beating, which was denied by the three MP's.

(2) The investigating officer learned of this incident and asked Colonel McIntyre, Post Executive, who was investigating it, to provide a copy of his report. This he promised to mail on Monday, June 7.

(3) When it was not received on Saturday, June 12, a telephone call was made to the Commanding Officer, Camp Van Dorn, who stated to the investigating officer that he saw no purpose to be served by it, as it was the word of a colored soldier against that of three MP's of good reputation.

(4) It seems improbable from the evidence available, as checked by Colonels Smith and Goodman, that disciplinary action against these MP's could be sustained (Q's. 194-198).

b. As the investigating officer was leaving Camp Van Dorn on Sunday, June 5, Colonel Goodman, Commanding Officer, 364th Infantry, verbally transmitted a report from Captain Peabody of his Regiment, who had just returned from Baton Rouge where he had been on duty, to the following effect: As Captain Peabody, in a truck with a Negro soldier driving, passed through the town of Clinton (estimated population 300), about 21 miles south of Camp Van Dorn, they were forced off the road by a civilian car. Two (2) men got out of the civilian car, with drawn guns, and directed that Captain Peabody get the Negro soldier out of town at once. The men were excited, refused to discuss the matter, and stated they would "kill any niggers who come here". Colonel Goodman stated he was sending his Regimental Provost Marshal to visit the town and ascertain the attitude there.

#### V. CONCLUSIONS

17. The following conclusions are reached:

a. That disciplinary action should be initiated with respect to the persons listed on Inclosures "AA" and "AB".

b. That efforts to identify those and others guilty of misconduct are continuing within the regiment.

c. That exchange facilities for Third Army non-divisional troops at Camp Van Dorn are inadequate.

d. That recreation facilities could be improved by opening the theatre adjacent to the 364th Infantry area.

e. That the 364th Infantry has a bad reputation which may last a long time.

f. That a number of the personnel of the regiment have given indications that they desire to sustain this reputation.

g. That many of the officers lack confidence in the non-commissioned officers and have become discouraged.

h. That officers who have lost perspective should be replaced.

VI. RECOMMENDATIONS

18. The following recommendations are submitted:

a. That the three battalions of this regiment be designated as service units and stationed at separate camps, thus losing the unsavory reputation of this regiment.

b. That prompt disciplinary action be taken against the personnel listed in Exhibits "AA" and "AB" and all others found to have been guilty of misconduct.

c. That the officers listed in paragraph 14 a, above, be replaced, without prejudice, as soon as practicable.

d. That adequate exchange facilities be provided for Third Army non-divisional troops at Camp Van Dorn.

e. That the theatre adjacent to the 364th Infantry be opened for Negro troops.

f. That the military police be instructed to identify and report those guilty of minor violations of regulations as to uniform, bearing, and courtesy, and to avoid use of physical force except where necessary to apprehend or restrain trouble-makers.

Subject: NEGRO CONDITIONS,  
Camp Van Dorn, Miss.

Re: Investigation of Subject.

On Wednesday June 2, 1943, this Agent, entered Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi on an undercover assignment as a Pfc., in connection with the investigation of Subject as requested by the Director, Intelligence Division, Hq 4th Service Command, Atlanta, Ga.

This Agent was advised by the Post Intelligence officer, Lieut. Merriweather Camp Van Dorn, Miss., on June 2, 1943, to conduct an intensive investigation of the 364th Inf. Regt. (Cld) to ascertain positively whether or not, disturbances within that Regt., resulted from the work of subversive influences. Investigation of the 364th Inf. Regt. disclosed the following pertinent information.

The 364th Infantry Regt., formerly stationed at Papago Park, Phoenix, Arizona and at present a part of the 3rd Army while stationed at the above mentioned installation, did participate in a riot in the city of Phoenix, Arizona, in which several enlisted men and one officer were killed. Those responsible for causing said trouble were court martialed and received sentences ranging from twenty to fifty years. The 364th upon arrival at Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi were considered as being a group of tough soldiers.

On or about May 29, 1943, a Negro soldier of the 364th Inf. Regt., was shot and killed at Camp Van Dorn, Miss., by the sheriff of Centerville, Miss., who stated; that he shot the Negro soldier while said soldier was resisting arrest after being taken into custody by a white Military Policeman of Camp Van Dorn. On or about May 30, 1943, another member of the 364th Inf. Regt., was shot by a negro Military Policeman of Camp Van Dorn during a disturbance in front of the Cld. Post Exchange. It is pointed out that both resulted from misconduct on the part of Negro soldiers involved.

As a result of the former incident mentioned above the newspapers of Louisiana and Mississippi published articles mentioning the affair and added; that the Negro soldiers of the 364th Inf. Regt., had come from Arizona to Mississippi with the intention of cleaning up the state of Mississippi. These indiscreet Publications had the following effect upon the civilians of Mississippi and members of the 364th Regt.

The civilian populace of communities near and adjacent to Camp Van Dorn were aroused and immediately took such steps as necessary for their protection by the procurement of arms. Out of this condition of excitement sprang innumerable rumors which resulted in the Governor of the State of Mississippi promising to petition the War Dept. to remove the members of the 364th from the State of Mississippi.

Members of the 364th Inf. Regt., enjoy the reputation of being tough and were very much flattered to be the recipients of so much publicity; believing, that they were feared by the Whites in the section.

Investigation revealed that at present there are no indications of an individual or individuals, who are responsible for, or actively engaged in agitation among the troops. However, the following enlisted men are doing much business in the sale of illicit whiskey that is responsible for trouble that might be avoided if the consumers were sober. Further, the men listed below are selling mentioned whiskey at \$4.50 per pint and \$5.00 per pint on the reservation contrary to regulations.

The incidents mentioned previously in this report resulted from misconduct on the part of the Negro soldiers involved rather than from any directed agitation. It is likely that there will be recurrences of similar nature from time to time because of the following existing conditions.

1. The enlisted men (Cld) of the 364th Inf. Regt., are a group of undisciplined delinquents. This is shown by the fact that mentioned personnel has no regard whatsoever for authority or their superior officers. This fact is evident by the failure of enlisted men to properly render a salute to officers. If they don't feel like saluting, they dont. Non commissioned officers and privates go AWOL at will, in large numbers irregardless of the fact that the entire regiment has been confined to the area. Groups of enlisted men can be seen throughout the day shirking their duty and comfortably resting in the shade or in the barracks. Gambling is carried on at all hours of the day and night beside the barracks, in the latrines and barracks. When bed check is made at 11:00 P.M. groups can be found in the latrines gambling with the door locked and the lights on. Non-commissioned officers do not even pretend as if they are performing their duties for the better interest of the government and with few exceptions suit themselves. An example is the case of 1st Sgt. Patton of Co. "C" 364th Inf. Regt. Sgt. Patton forged passes for this Agent and Pvt. Gillard to go to Natchez, Miss., left himself on a three day pass and was gone AWOL for two days along with 63 other enlisted men. This conduct of the non commissioned officers is obvious throughout the Regt.

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2. Incompetent officers. Conditions referred to in paragraph 1. substantiate the opinion that the officers of the 364th are incompetent. If said officers were competent flagrant violations of regulations would not be permitted. The reasons for lack of discipline by the officers can be attributed to these facts:(a.) Within the regiment are colored and White officers. The Negro officers are 2nd Lieutenants, with one exception, young, inexperienced, immature and lacking in physical strength of personality to assert their authority. The White officers are tolerant and do not enforce discipline properly. They believe any disciplinary action taken by them would be considered by the enlisted personnel as a discriminatory measure and in itself would be responsible for trouble.(b.) The enlisted men of the 364th are cognizant of the situation of their officers and are taking advantage of it.

3. Morale. The 364th is conspicuous because of its utter lack of Morale. Capt. C.H. Gibson, Chaplain (Cld) has reached the point where it is apparent that he has accepted a defeatist attitude. This opinion is confirmed by the fact that Chaplain Gibson informed this Agent that he was thinking of requesting a transfer or resigning. Chaplain Gibson is most unpopular among the men of the Regt., and has no influence whatsoever over them. Inasmuch as the Chaplain should be enjoying the best relationships with the enlisted men, enjoying their confidence and respect; failure is a sign of incompetence and Chaplain Gibson should be removed. Mrs. Allen, senior hostess of the Cld. service club, inexperienced and totally unsuited for the job fails to make any contributions to the morale of the men. Mrs. Allen knows nothing about planning programs for the entertainment of the soldiers and loses an opportunity to interest the soldiers to the extent that they would come to the service club and enjoy clean recreation rather than sit around after duty hours idle. The presence of sex perverts in the organization further has a tendency to disrupt the morale of the men. The capable work of Capt. Fink, Special Services officer and his assistant S/Sgt. Andrew J. Lewis, is doing much to boost the morale of the men by having entertainments at the recreation hall. It is pointed out that Capt. Fink. & Sgt. Lewis are recognized with the highest respect by the greatest majority of enlisted men in the 364th Regt.

Agent's Note:

It is the opinion of this Agent that further disturbances will occur amongst the men at Camp Van Dorn until such time that proper discipline can be introduced into the 364th Inf. Regt. Trouble will spring up spontaneously at the slightest provocation where groups are gathered. Officers should report to proper authorities all irregular occurrences within their command without consideration of the fact that any reflection might be cast upon their ability as officers. A repudiation of the statements made by the press would have much to do in alleviating the tension of civilians in the vicinity of Camp Van Dorn, and future articles of this nature should be censored.

Subject: SURVEY RELATIVE TO EXISTING CONDITIONS AT CAMP VAN DORN, MISS.

Summary of Information:

In compliance with Letter Orders dated 15 October 1943, Hq 4th Service Command, Atlanta, Georgia, a survey of existing conditions among the Colored Troops stationed At Camp Van Dorn, Miss., was conducted by this Agent with the view of finding the facts concerning reported activities among said troops.

This Agent was assigned to the 364th Inf Regt, Co E during the period of October 21, 1943 to November 7, 1943, inclusive. Contact was made daily with the soldiers of the organization to which this Agent was assigned, and with other Colored Soldiers stationed at Camp Van Dorn. This contact was made at Service Club #3, The Recreation Hall, Theatres, in Natchez and McComb, Miss., and such places in the vicinity that was frequented by the Colored Troops.

The investigation indicated that all reported incidents were not premeditated and were not inspired by any subversive influences. It appeared to be caused solely through general laxity of military discipline. It is the belief of this Agent that the reported incidents should be handle by local command action.

It was reported that the 364th Inf Regt has caused trouble at Camp Van Dorn, Miss. by such acts as: raiding the Post Exchange; disrupting the performance of a moving picture; ejecting an Officer from his automobile; attempting to raid an ammunition dump; and the actual attacking of an Officer.

The raiding of the Post Exchange was reported to have been caused by the fact that a civilian (White) clerk refused to serve the Colored Troops. Upon said refusal a Colored Soldier struck the civilian clerk, and such a commotion caused the other Colored troops

to join in the fight. The results being that the troops took whatever they desired from the Post Exchange.

The incident which caused the attempted seizure of control of the ammunition dump was due to the fact that a White M.P. and a Colored soldier became engaged in an argument in or near Centerville, Miss. The soldier and the M. P. began a fist fight, which was later interrupted by a civilian police, who parted the M. P. and soldier, then shot and killed the soldier. When the Colored troops of Camp Van Dorn learned of the incident they attempted to seize an ammunition dump. Upon the attempt by some of the Officer to prevent such action the Officers were actually attacked and others were ejected from their automobiles. The investigation disclosed that the above action of the troops was not premeditated, but more or less of a spontaneous nature.

The investigation revealed the fact that the CS system is not functioning properly, in-as-much as the identity of the operators in some of the companies are known, and that there is a laxity in military discipline which has existed over a great period of time. It is the opinion of this Agent that the existing conditions at Camp Van Dorn, Miss is a local command problem, inasmuch as no subversive influence is believed to be prompting the disturbances amongst the Colored troops at this post.

Summary of Information:

First Lieutenant J. B. Meriwether, Intelligence Officer, Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi, telephoned the following information to this office this date:

On Saturday, 3 July 1943, at about 9:30 the following incident occurred.

A group of colored soldiers gathered around the colored Service Club and would not leave. There was nothing racial about the incident at all. The Service Club was giving a dance Saturday night and the men got tired of milling around and when they wanted to clear the Club to get ready for the dance, the men couldn't be gotten out. They would not leave. They finally got them out after a couple of hours, however. The crowd got so large and noisy that the dance was called off. No one was hurt and no guns were fired.

Subject: NEGRO DISTURBANCE, Camp Van Dorn, Miss., 15 July 1944.

Summary of Information:

The following information was telephoned to this Headquarters by Capt. John B. Meriwether, Post Intelligence Officer, Camp Van Dorn, Miss., at 1240 on 17 July 1944:

Jealousy between the Negro 1697th Combat Engineer Battalion and Negro Quartermaster units flared into open hostilities at 2200 on 15 July 1944. The trouble, which centered in the vicinity of the Negro Post Exchange, was the outgrowth of a fight between two Negro soldiers, one of whom was cut with a knife. Shortly thereafter members of the 1697th Combat Engineer Battalion secured rifles and a small amount of ammunition. Hiding in the weeds adjacent to the units area, the engineer troops fired wildly 25 to 40 shots in the direction of the area occupied by Negro QM units. Since members of the QM unit did not have arms or ammunition, no return shots were fired.

Two Negro soldiers, members of the 394th QM Co., were seriously injured. A third Negro soldier received minor injuries.

Upon the arrival of the Camp Commander and the Provost Marshal, all personnel had dispersed and there was no further disturbance. No white troops were involved. The situation is well in hand and no further trouble is anticipated. A shakedown inspection took place the following morning and all the guns were found under one of the barracks.

SUBJECT: Staff Sergeant Fred R. Hunter.

1. I again refer to your memorandum of 20 September 1944, in which you request information concerning Staff Sergeant Fred R. Hunter.

2. The records show that Staff Sergeant Fred R. Hunter, Army serial number 36399256, now confined at Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi, was convicted by general court-martial of committing a riot with other soldiers by unlawfully and riotously, and in a violent and tumultuous manner, assembling to disturb the peace, unlawfully, riotously, and in a violent and tumultuous manner obtaining rifles and carbines and unlawfully, and in a violent and tumultuous manner, discharging such firearms resulting in the wounding of others, to the terror and disturbance of others, and was sentenced to dishonorable discharge, forfeiture of all pay and allowances due or to become due and confinement for life. The reviewing authority reduced the period of confinement to ten years, and suspended the execution of the dishonorable discharge until the soldier's release from confinement. This action was taken in order to afford General Prisoner Hunter an opportunity to be restored to duty and earn an honorable discharge, provided his conduct while in confinement warrants such action and he is otherwise qualified. The sentence became effective 12 August 1944, and with allowance for good-conduct time will be due to expire 11 June 1951. The Fourth Service Command Rehabilitation Center, Fort Jackson, South Carolina, was designated as the place of confinement, but no report as yet has been received of his arrival at that place.

## 1. INTRODUCTION

### 1.1 AUTHORITY

In April 1999, the U. S. Army Center of Military History tasked the St. Louis District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to assist in researching the former Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi and the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment. The Center of Military History is gathering information to respond to allegations that the Army was responsible for the murder of over one thousand African American soldiers assigned to the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment at Camp Van Dorn in the fall of 1943. This research is in support of the Assistant Secretary for Manpower and Reserve Affairs to determine the facts surrounding the allegations. These allegations gained national attention with the 1998 publication of Carroll Case's fictional account of the 364<sup>th</sup> at Camp Van Dorn, *The Slaughter: An American Atrocity*. Subsequently, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) launched a major research effort to determine the veracity of Case's claims and the details concerning the 364<sup>th</sup> at Camp Van Dorn.

The Ordnance and Technical Services Branch of St. Louis District (CEMVS-ED-P) prepares Archives Search Reports (ASR) in support of the Defense Environmental Restoration Program (DERP) at Formerly Used Defense Sites (FUDS). They prepared an ordnance and explosives ASR on Camp Van Dorn, project number A04MS002402, under the FUDS program in September 1998. The ASR collected archival aerial photography for analysis relating to that effort.

### 1.2 SUBJECT AND PURPOSE

Camp Van Dorn consisted of 41,544.02 acres near Centreville, Mississippi, located in Wilkinson and Amite Counties. The Army built Camp Van Dorn as a training camp for ground force divisions, activating it on 20 September 1942. The cantonment area covered the western portion of the base, with the remainder of the installation to the east consisting of various ranges, training areas and impact areas for weapons ranging from small arms to 155mm artillery. The site was declared surplus on 1 October 1945, deactivated 31 December 1945 and transferred to the War Assets Administration 18 March 1946.

The 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment arrived at Camp Van Dorn on 27-28th May 1943 from Papago Park (i.e. Phoenix), AZ. The regiment departed Camp Van Dorn on the 25<sup>th</sup> of December in route to the Alaskan Defense Command. Case's account, *The Slaughter: An American Atrocity* alleges that roughly one third of the African American troops in the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment were massacred at Camp Van Dorn sometime during this period.

As of this writing, there have been no victims of this massacre identified or an actual date of occurrence. This investigation and report will identify and document all of the members of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment who served at Camp Van Dorn during World War II. This

information will provide a framework for analysis of other gathered data to support or disprove the massacre allegations<sup>1</sup>.

### 1.3 SCOPE

This investigation focused on reviewing the files of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment which are held at the National Personnel Records Center, Military Personnel Records (NPRC, MPR) in St. Louis, MO. The NPRC, MPR is under the jurisdiction of the National Archives and Records Administration's Regional Records Services. It is a repository for the individual service records of former military personnel. The files reviewed included monthly unit payroll rosters, Official Military Personnel Files (OMPF) and individual final pay vouchers. Based on the records at the NPRC, MPR, this investigation identified all the members of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment while at Camp Van Dorn, including their:

- Army Service Number (ASN)
- rank
- unit
- entry date
- date transferred to Camp Van Dorn
- date transferred from Camp Van Dorn
- date and type of discharge from service
- if they died while at Camp Van Dorn
- personnel actions reflected in the payrolls from April to December 1943

Portions of the information obtained concerned adverse personnel actions, character or type of discharge or circumstances of death are not generally releasable under the provisions of the Privacy Act of 1974. To avoid violations of the Privacy Act, this report will not provide this information on the individual soldier. Although present in many of the files reviewed, this investigation did not record any information concerning the medical condition of the individuals in the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment<sup>2</sup>.

Appendix A contains an alphabetical list of all the members in the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment between April and December 1943. Additional columns list the individual's Army Service Number (ASN), Entry Date, Discharge Date (if enlisted), Rank, and Unit at Camp Van Dorn.

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<sup>1</sup> The Wilkinson County Sheriff shot to death Private William Walker on 30 May 1943 outside the gates of Camp Van Dorn. Although the circumstances surrounding this shooting are questionable and undoubtedly caused tension at Camp Van Dorn, his death has been a matter of public record since it occurred. This incident is not being considered as part of the alleged massacre.

<sup>2</sup> As part of the agreement to review these documents, the Department of the Army Office of the Surgeon General required the following statement: "The use of Army Medical Records in the preparation of this material is acknowledged, but is not to be construed as implying official Department of the Army approval of the conclusion presented".

## **2. RESEARCH METHODOLOGY**

### **2.1 NATIONAL PERSONNEL RECORDS CENTER, MILITARY PERSONNEL RECORDS**

The National Personnel Records Center, Military Personnel Records (NPRC, MPR) in St. Louis, MO is under the jurisdiction of the National Archives and Records Administration's Regional Records Services. It is the repository for individual service records of military personnel who no longer have a service obligation. The NPRC, MPR has records for military personnel for most of the 20<sup>th</sup> century,<sup>3</sup> and would include all those of personnel in the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment at Camp Van Dorn.

Due to the private nature of personnel records, these records are not available for review or inspection by the general public. Complete review of these records is exempt from the Freedom of Information Act requests except by the individual or next of kin. The U.S. Army Center of Military History received special permission from the U.S. Army Reserve Personnel Command and the Office of the Surgeon General Department of the Army to allow the St. Louis District personnel to review these records.

The Senior Archivist of the Military Operations Branch, William (Bill) Seibert, at the NPRC, MPR provided advice and guidance on the most expeditious and efficient methods to gather the desired information. This report would not have been possible without the guidance and assistance of the staff at the NPRC, MPR.

### **2.2 CREATION OF 364<sup>TH</sup> INFANTRY REGIMENT ROSTER**

The research began by determining the units within the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment, which were:

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<sup>3</sup> The earliest OMPFs at the NPRC, MPR depend upon the branch of service. The Army records begin with enlisted personnel separated after 1 November 1912 and Officers separated after 1 July 1917. Earlier records are on file at the National Archives and Records Administration, Old Military and Civil Records Branch (NWCTB), Washington, DC 20408.

- Company L
- Company M
- Headquarters 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion
- Headquarters 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion
- Headquarters 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion
- Headquarters Company
- Medical Detachment
- Service Company

The NPRC, MPR pulled microfilm of the monthly payroll, or unit rosters for each unit of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment while at Camp Van Dorn. The St. Louis District copied them beginning with the unit rosters in April 1943, a month before the 364<sup>th</sup> arrived at Camp Van Dorn, continuing through until December 1943, the month they departed in route to the Alaskan Defense Command. The information from the payroll rosters was then used to create a master roster database of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment<sup>5</sup>. The information provided by the payroll rosters included:

- Army Service Number
- Last Name
- First Name
- Middle Initial
- Entry date
- Rank
- Unit
- Transfer Data (into or out of 364<sup>th</sup> or specific unit)
- Promotion or demotion information
- Disciplinary actions effecting pay (e.g. AWOL, court-martials, confinement, hard labor, stockade, etc.)
- Absence to hospital or school training

Creation of an accurate database was hampered by the diminished clarity of the copied rosters. Most appeared to be the second or third carbon copy of the unit roster. Microfilming and copying the image further degraded the typing resolution. Particular difficulty arose in

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<sup>4</sup> By custom the Army does not form a Company J within units.

<sup>5</sup> An alternate, suggested method for creating a master roster for the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment was to review the daily morning reports for each unit. Among the reasons for an individual being listed in this report are: transfer into the unit; promotion or demotion; killed; transfer to another unit; hospitalization; training, AWOL and desertion. Since, these reports are an “exception based” accounting of the individuals whose duty status has changed from the previous day; not all the soldiers in the unit would be listed for any given month. The monthly unit payroll rosters provided the desired information in a complete and concise format. Review of the morning reports would be required to follow any Army unit from 1944 to 1946, since the monthly unit rosters for that period for ALL Army organizations were destroyed in 1975 in accordance with established records disposition authority of the time.

differentiating the numbers “3” and “5”, as they looked nearly identical on many of the rosters. Accurate ASNs and names were often determined from the September 1943 unit rosters, which were the most legible. However, for those soldiers who transferred into the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment after September, which included the December transfer of soldiers both to and from Fort Huachuca prior to the Alaskan Defense Command deployment, deciphering the name and number proved more difficult.

Using the NPRC, MPR’s database of all the former military personnel names and ASNs (or Social Security Number), the research team was able to match names with the correct ASNs. This isn’t as straightforward as it sounds. Given the millions of names in the NPRC, MPR database, even relatively obscure names will have several people listed. For common names like “James Brown”, of which there were nine in the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment while at Camp Van Dorn, there would be thousands of people listed. When both the name and ASN were unclear, NPRC, MPR personnel tried variations of the names and numbers against their main databases. On occasion, the ASN on the monthly payroll was off by a digit, the last name misspelled (e.g. Henderson-Fenderson, Hull-Null) or the first and last names of the soldier were transposed. In one case, John Baynard, the ASN on the payroll was a cover for a Counter Intelligence officer working undercover at Camp Van Dorn between October and December. In that case, the ASN listed was for another soldier not at Van Dorn, while Baynard’s records were listed under his true service number. Eventually, through great effort and tenacity, the NPRC, MPR personnel matched the list of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment at Camp Van Dorn with the appropriate files.

### 2.3 DETERMINING MILITARY SEPARATION DATE

Given the nature of this investigation, determining the date when each soldier left military service seemed crucial to supporting or disproving the massacre allegations. The reviewed unit rosters show that all but a fraction of the soldiers of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment remained in service while at Camp Van Dorn. The research team pulled the Official Military Personnel Files (OMPF) for each enlisted member<sup>6</sup> of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment in order to determine their separation date, whether as a result of discharge, retirement or death. Ideally, this information would be fairly easy to extract from the OMPF records; however, many of the files no longer exist and those that do exist are in generally in poor condition.

The NPRC, MPR had a fire on 12 July 1973 that destroyed approximately 16-18 million OMPFs. This included approximately 80 percent of the records of Army personnel discharged between 1 November 1912 and 1 January 1960. This fire also destroyed about 75 percent of the records of Air Force personnel with surnames from Hubbard through “Z” discharged between 25 September 1947 and 1 January 1964. The service departments never created duplicate copies of these records.

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<sup>6</sup> Although this investigation compiled a roster of all the members, both enlisted and officers, of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry regiment, the date and end of service was not determined for the officers. The allegations of the massacre centered on the African American enlisted personnel of the 364<sup>th</sup> and not the officers. Since the vast majority of the officers in the 364<sup>th</sup> were Caucasian, the additional effort required to pull the officers OMPF or final pay vouchers was deemed unwarranted.

In the 26 years since the fire, the NPRC, MPR has reconstructed a portion of the lost records; approximately three million individual files have been reconstructed (just over 15%). At the start of this investigation, only half the soldiers in the 364<sup>th</sup> had a personnel file, and many of these are incomplete or in exceptionally poor condition. Most of the original records that survived the fire are partially burned and water damaged. The reconstructed records frequently contain only a few sheets of information.

For individuals whose OMPF did not contain discharge information as well as for those whose OMPF had not been reconstructed, the NPRC, MPR pulled copies of the final pay voucher for each soldier. The pay vouchers would not normally be included as part of an OMPF, but the 1973 fire required alternate methods to prove military service. The pay vouchers were originally created by the War Department and later audited by the General Accounting Office (GAO). The GAO retired these pay vouchers to the Federal Records Center in St. Louis (currently the National Personnel Records Center Civilian Personnel Records), where they were scheduled for eventual destruction. After the fire, a team of record center personnel went through millions of pay vouchers of all types and pulled the final pay military vouchers for each individual. The vast majority of final pay vouchers were preserved as back-up documentation, but some were missed during the pay voucher review in the 1970s, causing gaps.

As another method of tracking those individuals, the staff at the NPRC, MPR ran the list against a Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) database to try and locate any VA claim folders for the soldiers in question. A VA claim would include medical treatment requests or death benefits. The VA records may also contain a Form 3101, Request for Army Information, verifying military service from a soldier's OMPF made by the NPRC, MPR prior to the 1973 fire. The VA's Beneficiaries Identification Records Locator System (BIRLS) database showed claim folders for many of the individuals without separation dates. These files reside in Federal Records Centers across the country and in some cases took several weeks to locate. The VA claim records do not always contain separation date information, though most included date of death as a civilian or medical claim well after 364<sup>th</sup>'s time at Camp Van Dorn. Proof of later activities was deemed as sufficient for the purposes of this investigation.

### 3. ANALYSIS OF 364<sup>TH</sup> INFANTRY REGIMENT PERSONNEL DATABASE

#### 3.1 DEATHS IN THE 364<sup>TH</sup> INFANTRY REGIMENT

This investigation identified four soldiers of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment who died between May and December 1943 while stationed at Camp Van Dorn. The four soldiers were:

The reconstructed OMPFs for these soldiers did not contain details concerning the circumstances surrounding their deaths.

This investigation identified 27 other soldiers of the 364<sup>th</sup> who died in military service, but not at Camp Van Dorn. Four men of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment died between April and June 1943. However, these 4 men, Lawrence Jones, Willie Oates, Jessie Turner and Eddie Wheeler, did not transfer to Camp Van Dorn in May with the regiment. An additional 23 soldiers of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment died in service following their time at Camp Van Dorn from 1944 to 1955. These 27 deaths do not support the massacre allegation at Camp Van Dorn.

#### 3.2 THE 364<sup>TH</sup> INFANTRY REGIMENT BETWEEN APRIL & DECEMBER 1943

Appendix A contains an alphabetical list of all the members of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment between April and December 1943. Additional columns list the individual's Army Service Number (ASN), Entry date, Separation Date (if enlisted)<sup>7</sup>, Rank, and Unit at Camp Van Dorn. The first entries are officers followed by enlisted personnel.

Some general facts concerning the soldiers of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment between April and December 1943 based on the information contained in the database, includes:

Total number of individuals in the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment between April and December 1943:

Total number of officers in the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment between April and December 1943:

Total number of enlisted personnel in the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment between April and December 1943: **3,852<sup>8</sup>**

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<sup>7</sup> Many of the soldiers reenlisted and hence have more than one discharge date. For those individuals with more than one discharge date, the earliest one is included in this table.

<sup>8</sup> The number of enlisted and officers add up to more than the total as there are two cases of a soldiers becoming warrant officers while at Camp Van Dorn (i.e. Albert A. Cunningham and Homer L. Roberts), so they are included in both lists.

From an analysis of the database, 104 soldiers in the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment were never physically at Camp Van Dorn. Some were separated from military service in April or May 1943, prior to the unit being transferred from Papago Park. Others remained on the roster but never physically arrived at Camp Van Dorn. The soldiers remained on the pay rosters for various reasons: hospitalization elsewhere with eventual discharge; AWOL or desertion; detailed to another base, disciplinary action elsewhere, pending court-martials, etc. Appendix B lists these soldiers in the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment between April and December 1943, but who never were physically at Camp Van Dorn. The comments describe the reasoning for this assessment. Subtracting these from the original database leaves the following:

Total number of individuals in the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment at Camp Van Dorn: **3,981**.

Total number of enlisted individuals in the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment at Camp Van Dorn: **3,748**.

Appendix C contains an alphabetical listing of the soldiers who transferred out of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment while at Camp Van Dorn. Some of them departed for other installations, while others remained at Camp Van Dorn, transferring into another unit. The comments should indicate where they went. This list does not include transfers within the regiment (e.g. from Medical Detachment to Company L) or those transfers into the 364<sup>th</sup> (i.e. gains) while at Camp Van Dorn. That information is contained within the database and can be queried if required.

For the Enlisted personnel on the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment's monthly payroll rosters between April and December 1943, this investigation determined the military separation dates as follows:



The St. Louis District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers collected and analyzed archival aerial photography during and following the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment's time at Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi (1943-1970s). The historic ground conditions and land use of the southwest portion of the base was analyzed to determine if the observable features support or disprove mass burial allegations made in *The Slaughter: An American Atrocity* and other media sources. The allegations are that over a thousand African American troops of the 364<sup>th</sup> were massacred in 1943 while at Camp Van Dorn. The bodies of the victims were allegedly buried in an area southwest of the cantonment area, and possibly later covered by a lake.

None of the discerned features on the imagery support the mass burial allegations. The observed ground scars or devegetated areas are all within 500 feet and readily visible, from the major 1943 road and rail lines. The size and shape of the ground features also do not match the photographic signatures of mass burials. None of the vegetated areas appear stressed, as would be expected from a limed, mass burial site. The ponds constructed on the former Camp Van Dorn after 1943 are not greater than 2 acres. The rail line forms the northwest boundary of the cantonment area, with no spurs leading into the interior of the installation.

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5	<b>Analysis of Southwest Portion of Camp Van Dorn - 1964 Aerial Photo</b>

## 1. INTRODUCTION

### 1.1 AUTHORITY

In April 1999, the U. S. Army Center of Military History (CMH) tasked the St. Louis District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to assist in researching Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi and the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment. The CMH is gathering information to respond to allegations that the Army was responsible for the murder of over one thousand African American soldiers assigned to the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment at Camp Van Dorn in 1943. This research is in support of the Assistant Secretary for Manpower and Reserve Affairs to determine the facts surrounding the allegations. These allegations gained national attention with the 1998 publication of Carroll Case's fictionalized account of the 364<sup>th</sup> at Camp Van Dorn, *The Slaughter: An American Atrocity*. Subsequently, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) launched a major research effort to determine the veracity of Case's claims and the details concerning the 364<sup>th</sup> at Camp Van Dorn.

The Ordnance and Technical Services Branch of St. Louis District (CEMVS-ED-P) prepares Archives Search Reports (ASR) in support of Defense Environmental Restoration Program (DERP) at Formerly Used Defense Sites (FUDS). They prepared an ordnance and explosives ASR on Camp Van Dorn, project number A04MS002402 under the FUDS program in September 1998. The ASR collected archival aerial photography for analysis relating to that effort.

### 1.2 SUBJECT AND PURPOSE

Camp Van Dorn consisted of 41,544.02 acres near Centreville, Mississippi, located in Wilkinson and Amite Counties. The Army built Camp Van Dorn as a training camp for ground force divisions, activating it on 20 September 1942. The cantonment area covered the western portion of the base, with the remainder of the installation to the east being covered by various ranges and training areas for weapons ranging from small arms to 155mm artillery. The site was declared surplus on 1 October 1945, deactivated 31 December 1945 and transferred to the War Assets Administration 18 March 1946. Plate 1 in the report plates section shows the general location of Camp Van Dorn.

The 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment arrived at Camp Van Dorn on 27-28th May 1943 from Papago Park (i.e. Phoenix), AZ. The regiment departed Van Dorn on the 25<sup>th</sup> of December in route to the Alaskan Defense Command. Case's fictionalized account, *The Slaughter: An American Atrocity*, alleges that African American troops were massacred in 1943 while at Camp Van Dorn. Included as an account in that book or expressed verbally in media sources since its publication, are reports that the bodies of the alleged massacre victims were buried on base. The burial sites were alleged to be in an area southwest of the cantonment area, in the vicinity of the former Igloo Area (i.e. ammunition storage magazines). This allegation was based on hearsay accounts that the Army has not been able to confirm. This report is meant to analyze the historic ground conditions and land use of the southwest portion of the base to determine if the observable features support or disprove the mass burial allegations.

### 1.3 SCOPE

This investigation focuses on determining the land use changes of the area in question to determine potential burial sites. This report includes:

- a review of the records and archival imagery repositories searched for aerial photography
- a narrative analysis of the land use changes
- historic maps collected of the former Camp Van Dorn
- annotated aerial photo image plates delineating land use changes and other items of interest

An inspection verifying the current site conditions was beyond the scope of this investigation.

## 2. AERIAL PHOTOGRAPHY RECORDS REVIEW

The Archive Search Report (ASR) research team searched the following locations for aerial photography covering Camp Van Dorn for the time period during and following military use. Each of these repositories contains aerial imagery primarily from federal sources and does not generally include photography from private contractors, except the last one. Efforts to locate other imagery from private sources proved unsuccessful.

Aerial-photo mosaic 5-Minute series maps at a scale of 1: 25,000. Camp Van Dorn covers Gloster Sheets 6, 8 & 9 and Street sheets 4, 5, 7 & 8. The 1942 maps were created from aerial imagery flown in 1941 by: AAA, Aerial Survey Corp March April 1941 and Aero Exploration corporation Nov-Dec 1941. The 1944 maps were created from aerial imagery flown by the US Army Air Forces in October 1943. The current location of the 1943 photos, or their negatives, could not be found so the researchers photographed the photo mosaics for analysis.

The research team also consulted *Aerial Photographs in the National Archives-Special List 25*, dated 1990, for Wilkinson and Amite Counties. They did not locate any imagery for Camp Van Dorn, which was not available from less expensive sources (i.e. USDA and USGS see below).

The research team also consulted the coverage overlays for the site in Record Group 373 (Records of the U.S. Defense Intelligence Agency) but did not find any imagery at a scale of 1:20,000 or better.

### 3. AERIAL PHOTOGRAPHY ANALYSIS

#### 3.1 METHODOLOGY

The aerial photography for this analysis covers Camp Van Dorn in 1943 and for three decades following military use. The imagery acquired is in photographic print format. The analyst performed the interpretation using the following source materials:

The shaded imagery, although acquired, was not included in this analysis because of the poor scale (i.e. 1:40,000) or the imagery covered only Amite County and the eastern portion of the Camp Van Dorn.

The analyst delineated imagery containing important areas on hard copy plots and digitized it using Computer-Aided Drafting and Design (CADD) software. The digitized features overlay scanned aerial photography, resulting in the final plots (see Plates 2, 3, 4, and 5). To create the annotated photo plates, imagery from all the years were scanned at 600 dots per inch, mosaicked together. Notable features, landmarks and recent street names are depicted and labeled on the photo plates.

The imagery analysis involved stereo viewing of photography when possible<sup>10</sup>. This allows for more accurate identifications than monoscopic interpretations. Resolution and scale of the imagery limited the identification of features discussed in this study. The analyst used the word “probable” when discussing features for which identification is reasonably accurate. The analysis used the term “possible” when identification was not positive, but the object/area matched known features/locations on other sources. Analysis of the aerial photographs referenced the site maps included in Appendix B. The bolded numbers or letters in parentheses referenced in the sub-paragraphs below refer to the feature descriptions on the

<sup>10</sup> Stereo coverage was not available for the 1943 imagery. As noted in section 2.1, only prints of photo mosaic maps of Camp Van Dorn could be located. These photo mosaic prints were photographed offering imagery for analysis but of poor monoscopic quality. The original negatives of this imagery from the Army Map Service are not in National Archives. Much of the negative film stock from the Army Map Service and other similar reconnaissance groups from that time period was destroyed decades ago to reclaim the silver.

annotated aerial photography plates. The sub-paragraphs 3.3 through 3.7 below describe the relevant features identified on the imagery:

### 3.2 AREA OF INTEREST DESCRIPTION/MAP ANALYSIS

Camp Van Dorn is located just to the south of the town of Centreville in Wilkinson and Amite Counties, in southern Mississippi (see Plate 1). The cantonment area is located at the western portion of the camp in Wilkinson County. The ranges and impact areas are located in the central and eastern portions of the camp in Amite County. The area of interest (AOI) is located on the southwestern portion of the former Camp Van Dorn (see Plate 1) and includes approximately 4,300 acres. A 1943 site plan, see Appendix B-1, shows Mount Olive Road trending roughly northwest to southeast. The road serves as the southwestern boundary of the base and it divides the AOI between Camp Van Dorn, about 2,300 acres of the AOI, and private property. The northwestern boundary of the Camp Van Dorn and the AOI is state highway 33 and the railroad. The railroad only has spurs leading into Camp Van Dorn along the northwestern boundary of the cantonment area. There are no rail lines or spurs leading into the AOI or the rest of the installation. The developed cantonment portion of Camp Van Dorn covers the northern and northeastern portions of AOI. It consists of a road network with blocks that cover approximately 11 acres. The eastern portion of the AOI is dominated by the ammunition storage area, east of 16<sup>th</sup> Avenue<sup>11</sup>, currently Gaulden Clinton Road. Contemporary maps referred to the ordnance storage area as the "Depot Area", with 19 magazines located in the "Igloo Area" in the center. The 1943 site plan shows the Depot Area as a fenced in area, 5,310 by 5,081 feet in size. The Igloo Area is as another fenced in area, 1,450 by 1,221 feet in size, and bounded by a barbed wire fence. The remainder of the AOI within the Camp Van Dorn is not shown as developed on contemporary site plans. Recovered historic maps do not detail the land use or features beyond the installation border, except for the road and rail lines. The Little Comite Creek drains this portion of Camp Van Dorn, as well as the area along Mount Olive Road. Sharps Creek drains the area to the west near the railroad and highway 33.

### 3.3 1943 IMAGERY

The quality of the 1943 imagery is poor. Still photos were taken of the available 1943 photo-mosaic map, which provided poor resolution, monoscopic imagery for analysis. Notable tone differences exist between the various photos, which make up the 1943 photo-mosaic maps. For instance, a vegetated area may appear dark on one photo and light on the adjacent photo. The east-west line across the center of the photo plate is a result of two different tones for the same area. Furthermore, this portion of Camp Van Dorn falls on the border of two photo maps, as indicated by the north-south line nearly dividing the plate in half. The grid lines on the two photomaps do not line up though the roads and vegetation do match each other.

The resolution of this imagery and of the original photo-mosaic, precludes a detailed analysis of the area, though certain land cover and land use patterns can be discerned on the photos. Transportation features can be seen on the photos, such as the railroad, Route 33, Amite

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<sup>11</sup> The roads at Camp Van Dorn are numbered beginning with 1 in the northwest corner and increasing sequentially to the southeast. North-south roads are Avenues and east-west trending roads are Streets (See Appendix B-1).

County Line Road, Mount Olive Road, and the road network through the barracks. The barracks and igloo area are also very distinct. However, some of the specific features of the igloo area shown on the contemporary site plans are not discernable, such as the fences surrounding it, the gatehouse, sentry box and a guardhouse. The fence lines are depicted on the photo plate to clarify its boundary.

The most significant ground scar is a quarry, which is located amidst a rather large forested area along Mount Olive Road near the barracks. The exact boundary of the quarry cannot be discerned from these photos. The shape shown on plate 2 is based on 1951 imagery and it is assumed that the quarry is no larger than the nine acres delineated in 1951. The presence of other ground scars besides the quarry can not be delineated due to the poor resolution of the available imagery.

Sharps Creek and Little Comite Creek and their numerous small branches flow south through the area of interest. Generally, trees line these creeks with thicker vegetation apparent further to the south. Inside the camp boundary, a large nearly treeless area extends from the barracks in the north along the Gaulden Clinton Road, almost to the igloo access road. As noted before, the resolution of the imagery does not allow for delineation of any ground scars in this area. However, a clearing is visible from the roads around the south end of the cantonment area and from 16<sup>th</sup> Avenue, currently Gaulden Clinton Road.

Outside the camp boundary, the land uses appears to be primarily for agriculture, with more densely vegetated areas following the drainage channels. Though they cannot be discerned on the 1943 photos due to the photo resolution, small farms line Route 33 and numerous small ponds dot this area in the 1951 photos.

### 3.4 1951 IMAGERY

The 1951 imagery (Plate 3) shows the condition of the site six years after military use. Because of the improved resolution of the 1951 photos, more detail can be seen than on the earlier photos. By 1951, most of the buildings have been removed from Camp Van Dorn, though the footprints of their concrete pads and the road network through the cantonment are highly visible on the photos. Some small buildings still remain at this time, spread throughout this portion of the cantonment. Trees and other vegetation are beginning to grow in certain areas of the former cantonment blocks. Trees are beginning to grow in the quarry (1) as well.

Gaulden Clinton Road has been straightened to Amite County Line Road. Numerous trails (TR) connect the igloo area to the former barracks at 27<sup>th</sup> Street, Gaulden Clinton Road, and also Amite County Line Road in the south. A cleared area is accessible from the access road to the igloos. Trails also lead through the forested area near the intersection of Gaulden Clinton Road, Amite County Line Road, and Mount Olive Road. About twenty circular and oval depressions, possibly craters, (CR) are discernible on a nearly treeless hillside above a western branch of Little Comite Creek. Mount Olive Road is approximately 500 feet away to the southwest of these depressions and it appears that they would be visible from the road. Small ground scars (GS) occur in the treeless area west of Gaulden Clinton Road on slopes leading to Little Comite Creek. These ground scars appear to be visible from the road.

Outside the camp boundary, some small farms and five small ponds are visible along Route 33. The ponds range in size from approximately 0.42 acres to 1.55 acres and are probably used for agriculture. A small quarry (2) approximately 0.64 acres is also visible along Route 33. Numerous small ground scars (GS) of unknown origin also occur within a few hundred feet of the intersection of Route 33, Mount Olive Road, and the railroad tracks. The trails, craters or depressions, ground scars, ponds, and the quarry are not discernible on the 1943 imagery because of the poor resolution of the photos. Farms and cultivated fields are also visible along Amite County Line Road. These would correspond mostly to the cleared, or at least treeless, areas visible on the 1943 photos.

None of the discerned features on the 1951 imagery support the mass burial allegations. They all are within 500 feet, and apparently readily visible, from the major road and rail lines, which were in place and discernable in 1943. The size and shape of the ground features also do not match the photographic signatures of mass burials. None of the vegetated areas appear stressed, as might be expected if it covered limed, mass burial sites.

### 3.5 1956 IMAGERY

The most notable change since 1951 (Plate 4) is the increased vegetation growth and the increasing number of fields being used for agriculture, including inside the former camp. A large forested area between the western branch of Little Comite Creek and Mount Olive Road has been filled in with trees as well as several blocks of the former cantonment area and the igloo area. The sewage disposal plant has also been overrun with vegetation. The southeast corner of the igloo access road and Gaulden Clinton Road has been logged of trees. The trails (TR) east of Gaulden Clinton Road between the barracks and igloo area are also still visible but have fallen into disuse. The ponds have all changed in size, some increasing and others decreasing in size. Six new ponds have been created since 1951, including three inside the camp. The quarries are the same size though trees are growing in the large one, indicating disuse of the quarry. The depressions or craters (CR) are still highly visible on the photos. The ground scars (GS) along Gaulden Clinton Road are visible but not too prominent. The ground scars (GS) near the intersection of Route 33, Mount Olive Road, and the railroad tracks remain highly visible. As in 1951, none of the features described coincide with the mass burial allegations.

### 3.6 1964 IMAGERY

Similar types of land use patterns are discernible on the 1964 imagery (Plate 5). More ponds have been created inside and outside the former camp indicating increased use for agriculture and/or grazing. The sizes and shapes of other ponds continue to change. Vegetation continues to fill in certain regions while logging occurs in others. The large forested area surrounding the quarry and bordered by Mount Olive Road has been logged since 1956. No obvious ground scars are visible on the photos and the craters are much less distinct than in 1956.

### 3.7 1970S IMAGERY

Imagery from the 1970s was not used for this project. The 1:40,000 scale of the imagery would preclude detailed analysis of the project area. Land use changes between 1964 and the 1970s were deemed to have no impact on the investigation.








CAMP VAN DORN, MISS.

Thematic Computer-Aided Design and Drafting (CADD) map files completed in association with this Archives Search Report are based on historic cartographic, aerial and site visit data collected during this investigation. The thematic maps were created using Intergraph's Microstation.

The thematic maps were created by scanning and warping selected historic data to reference points collected from non-stable selected base maps such as U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) 7.5 minute, quadrangle sheets or National Imaging and Mapping Agency (NIMA) maps. The horizontal scale and horizontal datum of the base maps is generally known. In this case the datum used was North American Datum (NAD) 1927. Attempts have been made to rectify the data to the referenced base maps. However, distortions in scale and contortions of the features are present. These distortions are a result of inaccuracies in the source data, as well as the processes of scanning and rectifying the data. Much of the data on the maps lack sufficient information to support a determination of accuracy.



Many of the historic maps used were hand-drawn or built on locations that were inaccurate by modern standards. In general, historic map inaccuracies are unknown and not quantifiable. The unknown inaccuracies may then be magnified by the georeferencing process. Therefore, thematic maps generated from historic maps and drawings will have accuracy no greater than the least accurate source.

The historical aerial photography has been semi-rectified (georeferenced) to the base map; however, the photos have not been corrected for photogrammetric displacements such as those due to topography or the altitude of the aircraft at the time of imaging. They are not orthorectified images. Locations of features noted on aerial photography are not exact due to the rectifying of both the image and the base map.

The horizontal and vertical locations of selected features noted in the ASR and located on the thematic maps have been established utilizing Global Positioning System (GPS) technology. These coordinates were acquired using the Federal Version PLGR96+ GPS receiver. Features located utilizing GPS techniques are so noted in the ASR. The PLGR+96 uses the Precise Positioning Service (16 m SEP) and Wide Area GPS Enhancement (WAGE) 4 m CEP.


Copies of the thematic maps are included on the companion CD diskette to this report. The lineage and source of the historic data used to generate the thematic maps is unknown. The majority of Federal Geographic Data Committee (FGDC) Metadata fields are therefore unknown. A metadata file that gives all available pertinent information has been provided with this product. The statements above are inclusive of all available information regarding the

historic data sources and the thematic maps generated. The thematic maps are not original digital mapping data; are scanned and warped data with selected unique feature annotation. The intended purpose of the mapping data is for photo-interpretation and not design. The vector data and associated symbology is unique to the intended purpose. The majority of the digitized features are not part of the current Tri-Service CADD Standards list of features and associated line types and symbology (i.e. range fans, pits, disturbed land). The mapping data produced does comply with applicable Tri-Service Standards.



## 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Interviews

In order to verify the findings of the archival research into the history of the 364<sup>th</sup>, oral history interviews were conducted with a sample of surviving veterans who had served in the 364<sup>th</sup> at Camp Van Dorn. Interviewees were selected randomly by comparing the list of all personnel serving in the Regiment at Camp Van Dorn (Tab B, Appendix A) with Department of Veteran's Affairs records of veterans currently receiving benefits. To date 116 former soldiers have been identified and approximately half have been contacted. Due to the average age of these veterans not all could participate in the interview process for reasons of health or a lack of detailed memory of the Regiment's time at Camp Van Dorn.

A total of fifteen interviews have been conducted, representing a cross section of every battalion in the regiment. Fourteen former enlisted men and one officer have participated in this project. We are continuing the process of contacting as many veterans as can be interviewed.

None of the men had any knowledge of a mass killing of soldiers from the unit. Only one said he had heard a rumor about men being killed, but no one he knew was missing when the regiment left Camp Van Dorn. The other three soldiers from his battalion interviewed were positive that no incident could have occurred at Camp Van Dorn without their knowing about it. Several had heard about the book, The Slaughter, or had read newspaper articles about it.

A copy of the questions used for these interviews is attached. The summaries of each interview follow.

## **364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Interview**

### **Mr. Joseph Armstead, Sr.**

Mr. Joseph Armstead, Sr. was interviewed via telephone at his home in New Orleans, LA, by Mr. Frank R. Shirer, CMH, on August 9, 1999.

Mr. Armstead was drafted into the Army on June 9, 1943 from Colfax, Louisiana. He took basic training at Ft. McClellan, Alabama. After basic training he was sent to the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment at Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi. After his arrival at Camp Van Dorn that summer, he was assigned to the Antitank Company (A/T Co.). He spent the remainder of his military service with the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry. His highest rank was Private First Class. He was discharged from the Army on March 28, 1946 at Ft. Sam Houston, Texas. He stated that the 364<sup>th</sup> had been designated the 367<sup>th</sup> Infantry at some time before his assignment to the regiment.

He was at the following installations: Fort McClellan, Camp Van Dorn, Camp Lorden in Seattle, Washington, Adak Alaska, a hospital at Camp Shelby after getting sick when home on leave from Alaska, then back to Alaska, and finally discharged from Ft. Sam Houston.

He does not remember the name of his company commander. He does not have any specific memories about his commander. He said that, to the best of his recollection, the anti-tank company had 54mm howitzers. He spent his service assigned as an anti-tank gun crewmember or doing company details.

He was assigned to the 364<sup>th</sup> after it was at Camp Van Dorn. He had no knowledge of what happened while the unit was in Arizona. He had no recollection of hearing about the shooting of Private William Walker, which happened before he arrived. He said he heard that there had been "a light riot in town," but it happened before he arrived. He said that trouble at a dance at Camp Van Dorn "sounded familiar" but he did not remember any details.

He remembered going on maneuvers in Louisiana, near Merrillville, he thought. He had no specific memories of it except for being on bivouac in the woods.

He stated that he had nothing to do with the Military Police at Camp Van Dorn. He knew that there were white units on post, but they did not interact. He did not know if the Black soldiers were housed or treated any differently than the whites, because he didn't associate with them. He did not know anything about other Black units at Camp Van Dorn other than there were some there.

He had no knowledge about the sheriff or citizens of Centreville and did not go into town. He went to Natchez on leave or pass.

He served on Adak Island in Aleutians. He said it was cold and snowy most of the time. They stayed on alert and guard duty. He does not remembering firing their antitank gun while in Alaska. He drove a truck carrying supplies from ships to the warehouses when he first arrived. He did not do any work as a stevedore. He later was selected to drive the Captain's jeep when he went around collecting money from the donut shops. The huts they lived in were warm and dry. He does not remember the material they were constructed from. He said the huts were round and long.

He remembers that COL Goodman was the regimental commander. He said that the COL "was alright, and never gave me any trouble." He remembers there being a Chaplain Gibson, but nothing else about him.

Regarding the "Slaughter" allegation, he said he saw an article (recently) in the local paper about it. He stated that it didn't happen when he was there. Also he had never heard about it before he read the newspaper article.

Mr. Armstead liked being in the Army. He said he would have stayed in if he had not gotten hurt. An ammo box fell on his knee and kept him from staying in after the war.

He remembers a SGT James Battles, another guy from South Carolina, and there was a SGT Coxman, but he was from Ft. McClellan and not the 364<sup>th</sup>. He has not had any contact with anyone from the regiment since he was discharged.

He has some photographs taken while he was in Alaska

## **364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Interview**

### **Mr. Andrew J. Byas**

Mr. Andrew J. Byas was interviewed via telephone at his home in Evanston, Illinois by Mr. Frank R. Shirer, CMH, on August 18, 1999.

Mr. Byas was drafted into the Army on April 24, 1941. He lived in Birmingham, Alabama and was sent to Camp Shelby, Mississippi for induction processing. He was sent to Camp Claiborne where he received basic training and then was assigned to the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment. Camp Claiborne was a new camp and they lived in huts and tents, the barracks were not yet built.

He was assigned to the regimental Anti-tank Gun Company. They were equipped with 57mm. anti-tank guns, which he called howitzers.

He served with the 364<sup>th</sup> from his arrival at Camp Claiborne until some time in 1944 or 1945 when he was transferred from the regiment to the 512<sup>th</sup> Quartermaster Trucking Co. This occurred after he had been sent to Adak Island with the 364<sup>th</sup>. He said that approximately 150 other men from the 364<sup>th</sup> were transferred to the 512<sup>th</sup> QM Truck Co. at the same time.

His highest rank was Private First Class (PFC).

He did not remember his company commander's name (AT Co.), but the First Sergeant was named Alexander. ISG Alexander was from Ft. Huachuca. His platoon sergeant was SGT Hunter. His platoon leader was 1LT Carvin, who was from Philadelphia, PA.

He did not serve at Camp Livingston. He said that there were three camps near the same town. Camp Livingston was to the north, Camp Claiborne to the south and a third camp to the west.

He went to Papago Park with the regiment. His main memories were that the weather was nice there, it did not rain much. He said they were there for three to four months. They lived in barracks while they were there. He does not remember any riots; "it was quiet." While there he mainly drove officers around the state in the Dodge Recon Car, otherwise he drove the truck that pulled their anti-tank gun.

He does not specifically remember the murder of Private Walker at Camp Van Dorn, but does remember hearing about a shooting incident that happened there. He does not recall any dances being held for the men at Camp Van Dorn. He went to Natchez on Pass. He remembers his sister and her husband coming up to visit him from Natchez.

He remembers going to Lake Charles, Louisiana for maneuvers while they were at Camp Van Dorn. They did routine training and practiced firing their anti-tank guns.

Regarding the MPs at Camp Van Dorn he remembers that they were nice, "what few they had." He also recalled that he served as a regimental MP several times while they were in Phoenix.

He did not have any interaction with white soldiers while at Camp Van Dorn. The unit did not train with white units. His company had all white officers, except for one Black lieutenant. He does not remember if there was any other Black units at Camp Van Dorn.

He had no memory of the sheriff of Centreville. He also said he never went into Centreville, but usually went to Natchez on pass.

After Camp Van Dorn they were sent to Ft. Lawton, Seattle, Washington for three or four months before they were shipped to the Aleutian Islands. His company was assigned to Adak Island in the Aleutians. He spent 20 months there and then was sent to Attu Island. He does not remember when he was transferred from the 364<sup>th</sup> to the 512<sup>th</sup> QM Truck Company.

The post was isolated and rugged in the winter. He remembers that some of the mountains had snow on them year round. They had good arctic clothing and boots. He remembers "getting threatened" by the Japanese dropping bombs.

They lived in Quonset Huts instead of barracks, with five to seven men per hut. They had oil heat, which kept them warm. He spent some time in the hospital there with pneumonia. He does not remember them ever firing their anti-tank guns while in Alaska. They used their 6x6 trucks for hauling food and supplies around the island, from the docks to the various posts. He drove on the night shift.

He did not remember who the regimental commander was. He did remember Chaplain Davis and going to services.

When asked about the allegations in the book The Slaughter, he did not recall it happening. He stated that everyone in his company left on the troop train for Seattle.

He especially remembers his time in Phoenix due to the climate and being able to see travel around the state. His worst experience was going to the funeral of his twin brother who was killed in an automobile accident. His brother was a civilian. He got a pass to go home, from Camp Claiborne, for the funeral.

He remembered a Corporal Mills as being a friend from his company. He did not keep in contact with anyone after the war ended. His picture of the entire battalion was destroyed in a fire; it had been his only souvenir. He does still have his honorable discharge papers.

## **364<sup>th</sup> INFANTRY RGT INTERVIEW**

### **CSM Richard E. Douglass (Ret)**

CSM (Ret) Richard E. Douglass was interviewed at his home in Chicago, Illinois, via telephone by Frank R. Shirer, CMH, on June 29, 1999.

CSM Douglass was drafted on Sep. 18, 1941 from Chicago, Illinois. He was sent to Camp Wolters, Texas for basic infantry training after which he was transferred to Camp Claiborne, Louisiana. He was at Camp Claiborne when 2 infantry battalions of trainees were transferred into form the basis of the 327<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment, which was later redesignated as the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment. His highest rank during World War II was Private First Class (PFC).

He was assigned to the intelligence section of HHC, 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, 364<sup>th</sup> Inf Rgt. He also served additional duty as manager of the Regimental Post Exchange (PX) at Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi and on both Adak and Amchitka Islands in the Aleutian Islands. He worked as a clerk in the Regimental PX while the unit was at Papago Park, Arizona.

In June 1942 the 364<sup>th</sup> left Camp Claiborne for Phoenix, Arizona. The regiment (less one battalion and one company) was stationed at Papago Park, Arizona, on the outskirts of Phoenix. The detached battalion was guarding Davis-Monthan Army Airfield at Tucson, and the detached company was on guard duty at Yuma. In May 1943 the 364<sup>th</sup> was transferred to Camp Van Dorn for the 1943 Louisiana Maneuvers and preparation for shipment overseas. On Christmas Day, 1943, the regiment departed Camp Van Dorn by train for Fort. Lawton, Washington, enroute to being shipped overseas. The 1<sup>st</sup> Bn departed Fort. Lawton for Adak Island, Alaska in Feb. 1944; the 1<sup>st</sup> spent one year on Adak. It was then transferred to Camp Chitka on Amchitka Island. CSM Douglass was transferred from there in November 1945 to Camp Grant, Illinois where he was discharged from the Army on Deceember 18, 1945.

He does not remember his company commander's name, he was in Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion during his entire time with the 364<sup>th</sup>. He did say that he did not get along with the company commander because he (Douglass) was known as "the Colonel's [Colonel Goodman] boy" because he was detailed to manage the regimental PX. Because of this perceived favoritism, his company commander told him that he would never be allowed to transfer out of the unit. Although he volunteered for the paratroops and other special calls for volunteers, the captain denied all his requests. Note that he turned down promotions above PFC because that would have required him to leave his position as PX manager.

He has little recollection of Camp Claiborne, Louisiana, because he was only there during April and May, 1942. There were very little problems on the installation, but there were problems when the troops went into town. "A good many of the fellows were from the North and had never been exposed to segregation," thus that was new and there were problems. "But no problems on the installation."

They arrived at Papago Park where they replaced a pack artillery unit. They lived in tents, inherited from the artillery unit, until wooden barracks were built. The tents were an improved type with wooden floors and plywood sides. The service club was finished about the time they left as were the first of the barracks. He later heard that Papago Park became a POW camp for either German or Italian POWs.

CSM Douglass recalled that the reason for the transfer from Papago Park to Camp Van Dorn was to participate in the 1943 Louisiana Maneuvers as preparation to be transferred to Italy to replace a regiment of the 92<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Division "that had been almost wiped out...."

There were no problems in the 364<sup>th</sup> at Camp Claiborne, however he heard that a member of the 758<sup>th</sup> Tank Battalion (all black) had a problem with a white person in the PX. That person (a Black soldier) was said to have gone to the Truck Park and gotten a light tank and then drove it through the PX. He also heard that the 758th had problems in the town outside the gate, but not the 364<sup>th</sup>.

Papago Park, AZ, Thanksgiving night, 1942: He was in Phoenix at the USO on Washington Street. Military Police came in and told all of the soldiers to report to the bus station to return to the camp. At the bus station he heard that an MP had shot a trooper in one of the café's in Phoenix. There were a lot of MPs, SPs and Phoenix Police around the soldiers waiting at the bus station. A three-quarter ton truck came around the corner of the bus station and the occupants were shooting at the MPs and everyone else. He took cover behind the curbing. He heard that there were altercations there for two weeks afterward and that troops from Ft. Huachuca came up to Phoenix to "round up the fellows fighting."

He heard that the people (2 or 3) involved in the shooting were court-martialed and received 50 years sentence at Ft. Leavenworth. However they "beat us out of the Army" because they were later allowed to volunteer to go overseas to a combat unit and were discharged at the end of the war. People from the 364<sup>th</sup> involved were three NCOs, one was a company First Sergeant, and the fourth was enlisted. He heard that the 3-4 soldiers went back to camp, broke into the armory and got ammunition for the weapons they had, including a light machine gun, which was they mounted on the ¾ ton's pintle. They then came back and shot at the MPs at the bus stop.

He was working in the PX in the evenings, which was next to the aid station. Every night an ambulance or jeep returned with one or several soldiers from Phoenix where the MPs had beaten them up. "Strangely enough" it was a Black MP Company in Phoenix and it was the one that was beating up on the Black troops of the 364<sup>th</sup>.

CSM Douglass was on regimental guard duty the night that Private Walker was shot. His specific duty was as a jeep mounted roving guard with two other soldiers from the intelligence section, HHC, 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion. He heard that Walker's body was dumped at the camp gate that night with a note saying: "You niggers stay out Mississippi, and Centreville." This was the cause of the problems with Centreville as far as the 364<sup>th</sup> was concerned. Walker was from Chicago and the body was returned to his family. Post MPs manned the main gate to Camp Van Dorn where the body was dumped and they notified the 364<sup>th</sup>.

The camp commander ordered the reconnaissance battalion of the division on post to surround the 364<sup>th</sup> Regimental area, in anticipation of an incident similar to Papago Park. COL Goodman (Commander of the 364<sup>th</sup>) told the camp to remove the unit "or things would happen." And they were removed. He heard a rumor that Senator Bilbo of Mississippi made a remark on the senate floor prior to Dec 1945 to the effect of "get that group out of Mississippi."

The 364<sup>th</sup> arrived at Camp Van Dorn in June 1943. They went on maneuvers for two weeks. He doesn't remember the date of the Walker shooting.

He said that he has read the book The Slaughter. The bolts were taken out of their weapons and stored in the company safe. That lasted two or three weeks, max. The bolts were then returned to the weapons because they had to go to the rifle range and qualify for POR and transfer overseas.

He heard a rumor that a group of individuals went to Centreville and shot up the sheriff's office, however he does not know if it was true. The rumored shooting up of the sheriff's office is the supposed reason for the rumored remark of Senator Bilbo.

All three battalions and the regimental headquarters of the 364<sup>th</sup> boarded trains on Christmas Day, 1943, departing Camp Van Dorn enroute to Fort Lawton, Washington and shipment overseas. He remembers this because he ate his Christmas box lunch on the train. They arrived at Fort Lawton on New Years Day, 1944.

Blacks were not allowed to attend white service clubs in the South. Dances at the services clubs for Black soldiers were few and far between. He does not remember any incident about a riot over a service club dance while at Camp Van Dorn.

During the Louisiana Maneuvers they stayed in pup tents. They did not have any problems. He heard that another division had problems during the maneuvers, but didn't know any specifics.

He knew of no problems with the MPs at Camp Van Dorn. The only place he remembers problems with MPs was at Phoenix. He ran the regimental PX at Camp Van Dorn and had no problems with it.

He stated that there were no problems between Black and white soldiers on Camp Van Dorn. There were problems with the "tractor trailer buses" which took the soldiers from Camp Van Dorn into town. The civilian bus driver tried to enforce segregation on the buses by putting the Blacks in back and the whites in front. The troops didn't care; they just wanted to go to town. The problem was solved by the Army setting up white and Black only busses.

He didn't see any difference between how Black and white soldiers were treated by military authorities. He ran the regimental PX at Camp Van Dorn after Colonel Goodman fired the Captain and Sergeant. He was a PFC clerk at the time. The colonel asked him if he could manage the PX, he said yes, and was put in charge of it. There was no problem with the white post PX officer. The only problem was from the southern civilians.

On Adak he again managed the PX and also spent time with special services umpiring sports. Their battalion team played against both Black and white baseball teams on the island. There were never any racial problems on either island he was at.

He remembers Colonel Goodman's arrival in either December 1942 or January 1943. He thinks that Colonel Goodman was one of the senior (permanent rank) colonels in the Army and "that gave him clout on post." That was the reason that Colonel Goodman always seemed to get his way in getting things done for the regiment, even when opposed by temporary grade Brigadier Generals. The colonel was a tremendous person. He remembers an incident on Adak Island where a DA Circular stating that all 2LTs with more than 1 year in grade would be promoted to 1LT. The regimental adjutant had hidden it and no one was promoted. The colonel found out about the Circular and that there were 16 Black 2LTs who qualified for promotion. He had them all promoted to 1LT that same day.

He does not remember anything specific about Chaplain Gibson. The Chaplain did chaplain duties; he does not remember anything that stood out about him.

He never heard about the allegation than 1000 men were killed until he read the book The Slaughter. He found many discrepancies in the book and he could not believe it. He wrote a letter to the Army Times about it and said that he did not remember anything like this happening during his time at Camp Van Dorn. He stated that all three battalions went to Alaska. His battalion only received five new replacements before they departed. As far as he knew all the men who arrived from Papago Park with the 364<sup>th</sup> departed for Alaska on Dec. 25, 1943.

He spent 36 years in the Army: WWII, Korea, Vietnam, and his final four years as an active duty reserve CSM at 5<sup>th</sup> Army Headquarters.

His friends from the 364<sup>th</sup> were: Edward Pennington, who was from Chicago and worked for him in the PX; Corporal Harris, company clerk; Corporal Johnson, battalion clerk; and Luven Belfield, from Los Angeles. He has been unable to locate any of them since

they were discharged. He has tried to get a reunion organized but it did not work out. He will try to locate Edward Pennington again.

He has some photographs that were given to him that were taken while the 364<sup>th</sup> was at Papago Park and in Alaska, but none from the period at Camp Van Dorn.

He spoke to a Lieutenant Colonel from the Pentagon about the allegations in the book. He was also interviewed by a camera team from Black Entertainment Television on it, but does not know if it was ever broadcast.

His 201 file did survive the 1973 fire at the St. Louis Records Center. He reviewed it there a couple of years after the fire. He is planning to go to the record center this summer and look at it again. He will see if there are any orders in it from when he was with the 364<sup>th</sup>.

## 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Interview

### Mr. Joe Harris

Mr. Joe Harris was interviewed via telephone at his home in Corrigan, Texas by Mr. Frank R. Shirer, CMH, on August 11, 1999.

Mr. Harris was drafted into the Army on January 14, 1942 from Polk County, Texas. He took basic training at Camp Wolters, Mineral Wells, Texas. After basic training he was sent to the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Yuma, Arizona. He was assigned to A Company as a rifleman. He was later promoted to Corporal (CPL) and made a Squad Leader. Corporal was his highest rank held. Except for basic training, he served with the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry until his discharge at Ft. Sam Houston, San Antonio, Texas on Oct. 5, 1945.

During World War II he was assigned to the following locations: Camp Wolters, Mineral Wells, Texas; Yuma, Arizona; Phoenix (Papago Park), Arizona; Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi; and the Aleutian Islands, Alaska.

He was assigned to A Company for his entire time with the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry. He remembered that he served under a Captain Messing, from New York, and a Captain Moran, from New Orleans.

He joined the Regiment at Yuma, Arizona. At Yuma they were guarding the bridges across the Colorado River. While he was stationed at Yuma he saw the evacuation of Japanese from California. After Yuma A Company went to Papago Park. For at least three months while at Papago Park he served as an MP for the Regiment. He was not a member of the MP company assigned to Phoenix. He did not recall any explanation as to why the regiment was moved to Camp Van Dorn.

He remembered that there were disturbances involving soldiers in both Phoenix and Camp Van Dorn. He was in the hospital at the time of the Thanksgiving Day riot in Phoenix. He remembers them "bringing in [to the hospital] fellows who were shot." There was an MP Battalion in Phoenix, he thinks it was a mixed white and Black battalion. The trouble was with these MPs.

Regarding the shooting of Private Walker, he "heard" that some fellow went AWOL [Absent With Out Leave], an officer and an MP jumped him and shooting started. He does not know who shot the soldier, either the MP or the officer. He said that Walker was in his company, and was from Chicago. He didn't remember if the "officer" was a civilian policeman or a military officer. He does not remember any trouble at Camp Van Dorn after Walker's death.

He did not hear of any other shootings of soldiers at Camp Van Dorn.

He remembers the service club at Camp Van Dorn, but doesn't remember any dances being held there or hearing about any disturbances. He does not remember anything special about being at Camp Van Dorn.

He remembers going to Louisiana for maneuvers in 1943. He thinks they stayed there or "two or three months." They were suppose to have "a company from up North" maneuver against them, "but they didn't show up."

He had nothing to do with the MPs at Camp Van Dorn.

The units were segregated during World War II, so he never had any contact with white units or soldiers at Camp Van Dorn. He doesn't know how white soldiers were treated, but he said he was treated all right.

He did not remember any other Black units at Camp Van Dorn, however, he remembers the 92<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Division at Ft. Huachuca was a Black unit.

Mr. Harris said he was treated fine in Centreville and other places in Mississippi. He did not know anything about the local sheriff.

He went to Adak Island in the Aleutians with his regiment. He remembered being on "outpost duty" on Adak and that it was cold. He said his unit did regular military duty. The huts they lived in were long tin buildings, 50 or 100 feet long. They did not live in tents at anytime in Alaska. They had oil heaters, which worked fine and kept them warm. He remembers the snow blowing and covering up the doors to some of the huts. He and others had to dig out the doors so that the soldiers inside could get out.

He remembers Colonel Goodman, and another regimental commander was named Weakman (phonetic). Colonel Goodman was with them in Mississippi and Alaska.

He remembers Chaplain Gibson and commented that "he was a fine fellow."

When I asked about the allegations in The Slaughter, he said: "No, Not while I was there." He said, "only Walker got killed" when he was at Camp Van Dorn. He said that it "might have happened to another unit...[but]...not the 364<sup>th</sup>."

He was glad he went into the service. He never had a rough time because he obeyed orders. He served 3 years, 9 months, and 5 days. His best experience was seeing some of the world. His worst experience was the operation on his rectum.

He was friends with a Warren Hewlett but never stayed in contact with him.

He has no letters or souvenirs from his Army service, except for his Discharge Certificate.

## 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Interview

### Mr. Jimmie Hawkins

Mr. Jimmie Hawkins was interviewed via telephone at his home in Newton, Georgia, by Mr. Frank R. Shirer, CMH, on August 19, 1999.

Mr. Hawkins was inducted into the Army on January 9, 1942 at Fort Benning, Georgia. He received basic training at Camp Wolters, Mineral Wells, TX. . He was discharged at Fort Benning on December 6, 1945.

His highest rank in the 364<sup>th</sup> was Private First Class. He was a rifleman, using a '03 Springfield and later an M-1 Garand.

He was assigned to 3<sup>rd</sup> Squad, 3<sup>rd</sup> Company G, 2<sup>nd</sup> Bn, 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry. He did not remember his company commander's name, however the First Sergeant was named Gordon, his platoon sergeant was named Crenshaw.

He did not remember serving at either Camp Livingston or Camp Claiborne, Louisiana.

He remembers being stationed at Papago Park, Arizona, especially "the party on the hill." During their time in Arizona, he guarded a bridge across the Colorado River and prisoners picking cotton. They took 30-mile hikes, and anyone who drank from irrigation ditches got company punishment, which he did and received.

He recalled disturbances in the 364<sup>th</sup>. One place they went in town to a show and troops were called in. The troops went back to camp and got machine guns and returned and shot up the place. This was "because the boys didn't want to sit in the back of the show." He stayed in camp during this time. He remembered Colonel Goodman taking over and telling them "I'm your brother and will insure you are treated right." He said that the Colonel spoke to the entire regiment several times.

In response to being asked about the shooting of Private Walker: He said he had heard rumors that one guy was shot down in town because of sitting in the front of a show.

He never went to any dances, just the party at Papago Park. He said that there may have been a problem with another company, but he did not remember one.

He recalled that his training was OK. He was the company barber, thus cut the soldier's hair after training, because of that he did not go into town. He later became the battalion barber. He later had a shop in the corner of the mess hall.

Regarding relations between white and black soldiers, he recounted an event that impressed him greatly. He was going home on furlough for his mother's funeral. The bus he got on was crowded and the driver told him he could sit on the wooden bench in

the back, stand in the aisle or wait for the next bus. There were two white GI's in the bus, one of them stopped the driver after a while and told him that Hawkins was a soldier just like them and he was going to ride in front with them. The white soldier then made room for him. He also remembered cutting a lot of white guy's hair while overseas.

He served on Adak Island for a while, and then went to Shemya for guard duty. Later on his company was sent to Attu Island, which was near Russia. He remembers the Russian ships coming to Attu to pick up ammunition.

There was a lot of snow and ice on the islands, and they had to get use to it, especially after being from the South. They lived in round top dugouts (Quonset huts). They dug out a place in the ground, put up a building in it; this digging in of buildings was to protect them from Japanese bombs and the snow. They had to shovel the snow off the top of the huts to keep them from collapsing. He was there 22 months but never got sick enough to have to go to the hospital. There were eight men per hut, with two pipes coming from them and two diesel fuel heaters, which they kept going summer and winter. The huts were warm and dry. From May to August was the only time the ground was clear of snow.

He recalled that there was a chaplain who conducted Sunday services, but the names of Chaplains Gibson and Davis did not come to mind.

Regarding The Slaughter: He did not remember it happening. The MPs at Van Dorn did guard duty. All of the men in his squad who arrived from Phoenix left Camp Van Dorn together.

He did not stay in contact with anyone from his squad after the war. He stated that they all came from different places and returned to them. The guys he knew before the war went into different units and he also lost track of them.

His memory of any Thanksgiving Day event, was that of Thanksgiving Day, 1945. They were on a ship enroute to Seattle, Washington from the Aleutians. There was a big storm and everyone was sick. He thinks that the ship's name was "Grant."

## 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Interview

### Mr. Cold Haynes

Mr. Cold Haynes was interviewed via telephone at his home in Orangeburg, South Carolina, by Mr. Frank R. Shirer, CMH, on August 19, 1999.

Mr. Haynes was inducted into the Army on May 7, 1941, at Ft. Jackson, South Carolina. He went through basic training at Camp Claiborne, Mississippi. He was trained as an infantry rifleman. He also served with the 62<sup>nd</sup> Ammo Company. His highest rank was Private. He was discharged at Camp Shanks, New York in September 1945.

He joined the 364<sup>th</sup> after basic training at Camp Claiborne. The 364<sup>th</sup> was also at Camp Claiborne. He was assigned to the 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion Headquarters Detachment. He does not remember the name of his battalion or company commander. He worked for a Lieutenant Barnville, as unit armorer. His duty was to "handle and take care of 45's and M-1's." He did not serve at Camp Livingston.

He remembers being at Papago Park, Arizona. It was an "alright" place. They did a lot of drill there. He does not remember being told why the regiment was being transferred from Arizona to Mississippi. While he didn't remember general problems with fighting in the unit, he did remember the disturbance on Thanksgiving Day, 1942. He had left town and returned to camp before the disturbance between the MPs and soldiers began. He thought it was because some of the soldiers got drunk and caused "a big row."

He recalls hearing about a soldier being shot at Camp Van Dorn but does not remember why or who did the shooting. He does not remember any dances being held for the regiment. He remembers "a row" between soldiers who went to town, but the sheriff was not involved.

He did not recall any contact or training with white soldiers at Camp Van Dorn.

He did not go to Alaska, but was sent to California as a rifleman with the 10<sup>th</sup> Cavalry. When asked about the date of the re-assignment he answered: "Some time in '42 or '43."

He did not remember COL Goodman or the chaplains.

When asked about the book The Slaughter, he did not recall hearing of such an incident.

He has not remained in contact with anyone he knew in the service.

## 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Interview

### Mr. Mozell Howard

Mr. Mozell Howard was interviewed via telephone at his home in Columbus, Mississippi, by Mr. Frank R. Shirer, CMH, on August 20, 1999.

Mr. Howard was inducted into the Army on Dec 11, 1942 at Camp Shelby, Mississippi. He did not go through a regular basic training center, but was sent directly to the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment at Papago Park, AZ. He was 20 years old when he enlisted, thus others in the unit considered him 'young' and nicknamed him "baby soldier." He said this was a combination of his age, which was younger than the other men in his unit and his youthful appearance. He grew up on a farm and returned to farming after the war.

His highest rank was Private First Class. He didn't make Corporal, and he was busted to private once.

He was discharged for the Army at Ft. McClellan, Alabama, on December 10, 1945. He had been home from Alaska on a 45-day furlough when the war ended. His orders were to report to Camp Shelby after the end of the furlough for transportation back to Alaska. Since the Japanese had surrendered, he was kept at Camp Shelby for a couple of months, instead of being returned to the 364<sup>th</sup> in Alaska. In Nov 1945 he was sent to Ft. McClellan and discharged.

He and 32 other soldiers arrived from Ft. McClellan in Jan. 1943. The regiment put them through a basic training of its own, after which they were assigned to different companies to fill vacancies. He and Ezell Norman were assigned to C Company. He was trained as a rifleman and carried an M-1 Garand.

He stated that his company had several commanders during the war. The only one he remembers was a CPT Profetti, or something sounding like that; he remembers 1SG Hayes and that SGT Brown was his squad leader.

C Company was assigned to Yuma, Arizona to guard the bridge over the Colorado River; it was the only bridge in the area that connected Arizona and California. He saw a lot of equipment being shipped through there that eventually went overseas.

He thought that Arizona was a beautiful place, though it was rough living in the desert. Being from Mississippi, he said that it took a while to get used to the climate, especially hot during the day and cold at night.

He does not remember being told why they were transferred from Papago Park to Camp Van Dorn. He said that when the train arrived at Centreville, there were MPs all over the place, they had machine guns and were "ready to fight." The reason was that a rumor had spread through the town that the 364<sup>th</sup> was coming to Camp Van Dorn to "straighten

them (town's people) out" for what had happened to a Black unit that had been there before them. He did not want to fight anyone. He did not remember what was supposed to have happened to the other unit that the town's men thought the 364<sup>th</sup> was coming there to avenge. He had heard talk, when he was in Arizona, that the 364<sup>th</sup> had been sent there from the east because of fights that its soldiers had been in. He was told that the 364<sup>th</sup> had been a part of the 92<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Division and was suppose to be going overseas to combat. However, the story went, because of the fights the men of the 364<sup>th</sup> got into, it was sent to Arizona, and another regiment was assigned to the division to replace them.

He remembers hearing about the fight between the MP battalion or company and members of the 364<sup>th</sup> in Phoenix. He did not remember the date, but said it could have been around Thanksgiving. He was in the garrison when it happened. He did not go into town on pass, he preferred to stay in the company and regimental area.

Regarding the fatal shooting of Private Walker of A Company: He did not know the name but heard that someone was shot and killed. Some of the guys he knew wanted to retaliate, but did not have weapons. Their weapons had been taken and put in storage when they arrived because of the rumors that had spread through the town. They later got their rifles back so they could go to the range.

He did not remember going to Louisiana on maneuvers.

He had no contact with the military police at Camp Van Dorn.

He does not remember having any contact or training with white soldiers/units while at Camp Van Dorn. He does not remember that Black and white soldiers were treated differently. He remembers that there were a lot of rumors about things happening, but he did not witness any of them. He said that there were certain nights of the week for Black troops and white troops to go to the movies.

Adak was the first island his company was on in the Aleutians. Their duty there was to unload and load ships with supplies. They did not spend all of their time as stevedores but also conducted regular training. Their next assignment was to the island of Amchitka. There they stood guard and watched the coast for enemy ships and submarines. Most of the company was on outpost duty for three months, was then relieved and did regular training.

Living conditions in the barracks was OK. They lived in Quonset huts, which were dug into the ground. The huts had good heaters. The only problem was going outside into the weather, however they had warm clothing. There was snow to be seen year round. He does not recall anyone being lost in snowstorms. He recalled that the only way to get supplies to the outpost was by a caterpillar tractor pulling them. He applied to drive one and was chosen. The first time he did so, he realized that he didn't know how to start it. He went into the barracks to find out who last drove it and said there was something wrong so he could observe how the man started it. After that he regularly drove the tractor.

On Amchitka, the companies operated independently from the battalion, that is, they didn't have operations where the battalion or regiment acted as a whole. They never had to do any fighting, just stood lookout.

He recalled Colonel Goodman. He stated that "could not have found a better colonel to be over a Black outfit than him." He knew how to take care of his men. Mr. Howard only saw Colonel Goodman when he reviewed the troops; he never had to "go before him."

Regarding The Slaughter: He read about the book in the newspaper. It is the "furthest thing from the truth.... Couldn't have killed that many men without it being known." "If it had happened, then I would probably have been one of them [killed]."

Mr. Howard enjoyed being in the Army. The group of 32 soldiers who were trained together became like brothers. He thought he was well trained to be an infantryman. The 364<sup>th</sup> was a great regiment. "We did with pride what they ordered us to do, even though we weren't sent to fight."

The only person he has remained in contact with is Mr. Ezell Norman [also interviewed] who lives in Columbus, Mississippi.

He had had a photo book from his time in the Army, but it was lost in a fire. There were a couple of rowdy guys in Company C, but otherwise they "were a band of angels." "There was no massacre of the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry." He also stated that they were a regiment, not a division as one newspaper said.

His cousin was also in the 364<sup>th</sup>. He got sick and didn't go to the Aleutians. After he got well he was sent overseas to the 92<sup>nd</sup> Inf Div as a replacement. He was wounded in combat in Italy. His cousin lived for a long time after the war, but is dead now.

## **364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Interview**

### **Mr. Hubert J. Jackson**

LTC Charles Graul interviewed Mr. Hubert J. Jackson over the telephone on August 17, 1999. Mr. Jackson currently resides at the Soldiers and Airman's Home in Washington, D.C.

Mr. Jackson enlisted in the Army December 1, 1941, in Washington, D.C. and was sent to Basic Infantry Recruit Training in South Carolina. He spent his entire Army service in the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry beginning in 1942 at Camp Claiborne, Louisiana (then the 367<sup>th</sup> Infantry), and continuing through his discharge in 1945 in Tacoma, Washington, upon his return from the Aleutians.

He had little recollection of Camp Claiborne, because he spent little time there. His experience in Arizona was very clear to him and he enjoyed his time there. He heard about the trouble in Phoenix but did not participate in any of the events or witness them. He did recall someone coming from Washington after the trouble and asking the men what they wanted (probably the inspection visit of Brigadier General Benjamin O. Davis, Sr. in November 1942). The men all said they wanted Black officers in their companies – shortly thereafter he remembers they arriving.

He knew that the regiment was sent to Camp Van Dorn to prepare for overseas movement. He heard about the shooting of Private William Walker, but did not recall any particular disorder afterward. He did not know of any particular trouble involving the 364<sup>th</sup> at a Service Club Dance. He never left the post himself because he was afraid about how he would be treated by white civilians in the south. He did not go off post at Camp Claiborne when stationed there for the same reason – to avoid trouble. He had no recollection of going to the Louisiana Maneuver area in 1943, but remembers leaving for Washington, enroute to the Aleutians.

He spent most of his time in the 364<sup>th</sup> as a Browning Automatic Rifleman in G Company. He remembered his company commander, Captain Smoke, as a southerner with prejudice against the ability of the men in the company. He recalled Corporal Clifton Moffat, a member of his squad who fell out on a march at Camp Van Dorn and died. He remembered Colonel Goodman, but never had any contact with him.

Shortly after arriving at Adak he was reassigned to a Port Battalion and spent the balance of 1944 and 1945 with this battalion and had no contact with the rest of the regiment.

He had heard of the book that alleged the murder of men of the 364<sup>th</sup>, but said he couldn't believe it. He did not think it possible that it could have happened without the whole regiment knowing about it. He also believed that the men's families would have done anything they could to find out why someone disappeared – they would not have kept silent.

## **364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Interview**

### **Mr. James A. McNeil**

Mr. James A McNeil was interviewed via telephone at his home in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, by Mr. Frank R. Shirer, CMH, on August 11, 1999.

Mr. McNeil was drafted into the Army on January 26, 1942 at Fort Jackson, South Carolina. He took basic training at Ft. McClellan, Alabama. After basic training he was sent to the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment at Camp Claiborne, Louisiana. He was assigned to G Company as a rifleman. He was later promoted to Sergeant and made a Squad Leader. Sergeant was his highest rank held. Except for basic training, he served with the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry until his discharge at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, on November 19, 1945.

During World War II he was assigned to the following locations: Ft. McClellan; Camp Claiborne; Douglas Arizona; Phoenix (Papago Park), Arizona; Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi; and the Aleutian Islands (Attu & another name not remembered), Alaska.

Mr. McNeil said that he joined the 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry in the winter of 1942, possibly February; however, it was sometime after basic training at Ft. McClellan. He was initially assigned to G Company as a rifleman. He remained in G Company for the duration of the war. He said that there were a couple of different Captains who commanded it, but he does not remember their names. He remembered that one was a tough commander, but a good man. At Camp Claiborne the company received its' first Black officers, giving them an integrated group of company officers for the first time. Originally there had only been white officers in G Company

He was not at Camp Livingston, but joined the 364<sup>th</sup> when it was at Camp Claiborne.

He said that his company was sent to Douglas to help guard the border there. They lived in a tent camp, patrolled the border and conducted combat training. They were given furloughs and used them to visit the border towns. They were later transferred to Phoenix. He does not remember the name Papago Park, but that his company was in a camp near the city and Camelback Mountain.

He was with the 364<sup>th</sup> when it was transferred to Camp Van Dorn. He was not officially told why they were transferred from Arizona to Mississippi, but "unofficially" it was because "of run-ins with the MPs." The rumor for the move was that they "were being punished." He was in town that night (Thanksgiving Day, 1942), but "missed the riot." There was a "shoot-up in town." The MPs were mad at the 364<sup>th</sup> because they took "their girls." The Black MP Company had been stationed there before the 364<sup>th</sup> arrived. He did not specifically remember the date, but said it was probably correct. No one that he knew was hurt in the riot.

Regarding Private William Walker, he does not remember either him or the shooting. He did say that the soldiers of the 364<sup>th</sup> were "ill treated by civilians" in the town of Centreville and the local area.

He did not hear of any other shootings of soldiers at or near Camp Van Dorn. He said that there was conflict between the Black soldiers and white civilians, but no shootings.

He did not recall hearing or witnessing any trouble at a dance. He said the only problem was when his company basketball team played a team from a white church in town. They had a pretty good company team and the church team lost. They were not pleased that they lost and made some comments.

He did not remember going to Louisiana for maneuvers. He stated they took a lot of 25-mile hikes, and may have gone into Louisiana on one of them. He did recall going to Louisiana on furlough.

He remembered that on one hike, possibly back in basic training, that one of the soldiers in his company was sick. The sergeant-in-charge thought he was "gold-bricking" and made him go on the march. The soldier took sick on the march and died. That was the only soldier he remembers dying while he was in training.

He had no memories of the Military Police at Camp Van Dorn.

There was no connection (relations) between white and Black soldiers at Camp Van Dorn. All the training he did was with his company, and there were no white soldiers in it, officers excepted. Neither does he know if the Black and white troops were treated differently.

He recalled that there were other Black units at Camp Van Dorn, but did not have any contact with them.

He does not remember the Sheriff of Centreville, Mississippi or anything about him. He re-stated that the families did not treat them well. He recalled that there was one "integrated" family that was on the route they marched by. The daughters caught their attention, and the soldiers tried to visit them. Their father nipped it (soldiers visiting his daughters) in the bud.

He served on Attu in the Aleutian Islands. He was also on 2 other islands but does not remember their names, though one may have been Kenya. I asked if "Shemya" sounded familiar and he said "No." He recounted the story of an avalanche he heard in the distance, while he was unloading a ship. He said that a couple of guys were killed in it when the snow destroyed their hut. Troops had to dig through the snow to find them.

The troops lived in Quonset Huts in Alaska. They were warm.

He did a lot of loading and unloading boats, supplies mainly. They also did a lot of patrolling and guard duty. There was not much walking guard due to the snow.

They listened to Tokyo Rose and the music she played. She told them about how cold it was where they were, while their girls were back home, where they were warm and "with Jody." The music was good, but her words hurt morale.

He remembered Colonel Goodman. He said that he was a good commander and "had respect for his companies."

He also remembered Chaplain Gibson. He served a lot with him, assisting him with services and trying to get the troops out to church services. He also knew him after the war. They lived near each other in Philadelphia and occasionally saw each other.

Regarding the book The Slaughter and the allegation of murder he said: "Sounds phony to me." He stated that no one in Company G was killed and he didn't know anyone that was, other than the guy in basic and those in the avalanche in Alaska. He had never heard any rumors of any similar incident, and doubted that it happened.

His main memory of his Army service is of the conflict in Arizona and being shipped back south; that it was a penalty they did not deserve. The MPs were the cause of the incident. He also said going from the "hottest place to the coldest place" (Camp Van Dorn to Alaska) was another memory. He had some scars from the cold.

He is still in contact with John A. Malone (supply sergeant) who lives in North Philadelphia. He also has had intermittent contact with James "Jimmy" Hines in Coatsville, Pennsylvania.

He recounted that he departed Alaska before the rest of his company. He came back in August 1945 on home furlough. He got married "to the gal who is looking in the refrigerator right now" while on furlough. He was crossing Montana by train returning to Alaska when the war ended. He was stopped in Montana and given orders to report to Fort Bragg, North Carolina. He was discharged after reporting to Fort Bragg, he never did return to Alaska.

He is interested in the details of what happened in his unit and in seeing a history of it, when it is written. He also recalled one guy being killed when a rock fell on a hut, and, after the spring thaw, finding the bodies of two men who got lost in the snow during the winter.

## **364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Interview**

### **Mr. Giles W. Morton**

Mr. Giles W. Morton was interviewed via telephone at his home in Grand Rapids, Michigan by Mr. Frank R. Shirer, CMH, on August 17, 1999.

Mr. Morton was drafted into the Army in J, 1941 from Meridian, Mississippi. He received three months of basic training at Camp Wolters, Texas. After basic training he was sent to the 367<sup>th</sup> Infantry at Camp Claiborne, Louisiana. He was assigned to Service Company as a personnel clerk. He was later promoted to Sergeant. Except for basic training, he served with the 367<sup>th</sup> and 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry until his discharge at Camp Shelby, Mississippi in 1945.

His highest rank held in the 364<sup>th</sup> was sergeant. He eventually retired as a Master Sergeant (E-7) from the U.S. Air Force after 22 years service.

The Service Company commander was Captain Reddell. He was OK, however he was more a figurehead, since the members of Service Company worked for various Regimental Staff Officers. Service Company had the better-educated troops in it. They were the clerks and also the maintenance men and mechanics that took care of the regimental vehicles were in Service Company.

During his Army service he was at the following locations: Camp Claiborne, Louisiana; Phoenix, Arizona; Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi; Ft. Walton, Seattle, Washington; and Adak, Aleutian Islands, Alaska.

He did not serve at Camp Livingston, but was at Camp Claiborne. They were the largest (2500 men) Negro Army unit at Camp Claiborne; the other Black units were company-sized. The regiment trained in the field every day. Service Company stayed in garrison and did its daily work on records and personnel issues. Mr. Morton was with the regiment when it moved to Arizona in 1942, but does not remember the date.

They were the only unit at Papago Park. They had newly built standard barracks there. The married soldiers' families came out there to live and the married soldiers were able to live off post. He was surprised when they were transferred to Mississippi. He does not remember a reason being given for the move. He vaguely remembers "things being said" as to why they were moved after they were at Camp Van Dorn.

He does not remember a fight on Thanksgiving Day, 1942; however, he said that there were problems with the MPs (white) in Phoenix. There were fights in town, but not in garrison. He said that he "was kept in the dark" about what happened between the line company troops and the MPs. He said there was never a problem with the civilians in Phoenix. When the regiment was transferred to Camp Van Dorn it took 3 trains to carry them, and it was a 3 day and night journey.

He said there were problems with the civilian authorities in Centreville. He does not recall specifics; also he does not recall Private Walker of A Co. being shot. He does not remember any trouble around Camp Van Dorn, including any trouble at dances.

He never thought much about Camp Van Dorn while he was there. His home was 130 miles north of there, so he was able to get home on leave and pass.

He distinctly remembered going on maneuvers in Louisiana. He said that the line companies did combat training while Service Company set up for their regular personnel duties and performed them in the field as they did in camp.

He does not remember coming in contact with the MPs at Camp Van Dorn. He does remember "skirmishes" between the 364<sup>th</sup> and "the folks in town." He defined "skirmish" as when soldiers from the 364<sup>th</sup> tried to get served in places in town, where the locals posted "Whites only." He stated that Senator Bilbo petitioned the War Department to get the 364<sup>th</sup> moved from Camp Van Dorn because they were "Northern boys who didn't know how to act in the South." He said that they were not all from the North, but many like him were from the south. The Northern blacks had not lived with the overt segregation that existed in the South in the 1940's. He and his friends went to Baton Rouge on weekend pass and avoided Centreville.

He said that he never came into contact with white soldiers at Camp Van Dorn, that it was a segregated Army back then. He said that there was trouble when some 364<sup>th</sup> soldiers went into the PX's of white units that the MPs came to keep them out. As far as billeting, they lived in standard army barracks for the period; there was not any difference between those of Black and white units.

He served his entire Aleutian Islands tour on Adak Island. The 364<sup>th</sup> was a combat unit but it did port battalion work on Adak, i.e. it loaded and unloaded ships. The other battalions were assigned to the islands of Shemya and Amchitka; he does not know what they did there. He said that other units had recaptured the islands from the Japanese, so he guessed that there was validity to their being there to keep them from coming back.

They lived in Quonset huts on the island, not tents. They had decent living conditions; they could fix up the huts to make them more livable. They were heated with stoves that burned diesel oil. There was no hardship there, except if you wanted hard liquor, only 3.2 beer was available. The weather was either rainy or snow; however it was never as cold as one would think Alaska would be.

He remembered Colonel John F. Goodman. He said that Colonel Goodman was assigned to command the regiment after the disturbances in Phoenix. He was regular army and would often speak to the men, and morale began to improve with him in charge. He was perceived to be a fair man. He got some Black 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenants assigned to the regiment.

He also remembered Chaplain Elmer P. Gibson very well. He was assigned to the regiment when it was formed. He was a United Methodist minister, as is Mr. Morton. He was regarded as "a company man" because others thought he was afraid to speak out against certain injustices in the regiment. Chaplain Gibson was Black. There were two other Chaplains assigned to the regiment (both Black), one was Chaplain Booker Davis, who transferred to the USAF after the war and made it a career. Mr. Morton saw Chaplain Davis sometime in the 1950's at Lowery AFB. He does not remember the other Chaplain's name.

He told me that he had heard about the book The Slaughter, and had read it. If the incident really happened, he does not know about it, did not witness it, nor ever heard any rumors that there were a thousand soldiers killed. He made it clear that if it had happened "folks would have talked about it," also that his personnel section would have known about it from the morning reports. Furthermore, the regiment never received any massive replacements that would have been needed before it left for combat. He stated that the book is mainly fiction.

In retrospect he could not think of anything he could classify as his best or worst experience in the Army in World War II, "even while being stationed at Camp Claiborne or Camp Van Dorn." Serving in the Army was something he had to do as an American. He has not kept track of anyone after he was discharged in 1945, though he may have seen one or two in addition to Chaplain Davis. His friends in the unit were: William Anderson, from California; Clarence Forman, Memphis, Tennessee; Kellis from Mississippi; Clyde Johnson, from Louisiana; Master Sergeant Jones, the Personnel Sergeant Major; and Master Sergeant English, the Regimental Sergeant Major.

He recalled that the 367<sup>th</sup> was an old regiment from World War I, and he does not know why it was re-designated as the 364<sup>th</sup>. He does not have any letters or photos.

## **364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Interview**

### **Mr. Frank J. Moultrie**

Mr. Frank J. Moultrie was interviewed via telephone at his home in Odenton, Maryland, by Mr. Frank R. Shirer, CMH, on August 19, 1999.

Mr. Moultrie was inducted into the Army on January 31, 1941 at Fort Benning, Georgia. He received basic training at Ft. McClellan, Alabama. He originally said that he went directly to Camp Van Dorn from Ft. McClellan; however he later remembered that he went to Camp Claiborne instead. He also served at Papago Park, Arizona and on Attu in the Aleutian Islands.

His highest rank held in the 364<sup>th</sup> was Staff Sergeant (Rifle Squad Leader). He eventually retired as a First Sergeant (E-8) from the U.S. Army after 27 years service. He was discharged at Jacksonville, Florida, in December 1945. He was recalled to active duty from the Army reserve in 1949 and stayed in until he retired in June 1972.

He was assigned to Company L, 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion, 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry. He did not remember his company commander's name, however the First Sergeant was Curtis Michael Moore.

After Camp Claiborne the regiment went to Papago Park, near Phoenix, Arizona. He said that it was in the desert, they had no place to live, and had to build their own camp. They put up tents to live in. It was hot, 115 degrees, and there was no shade except for their tents. While in Arizona their company spent part of its time guarding a bridge over the Colorado River that connected Arizona and California. He could not remember the name of the location.

His memories of various disturbances have coalesced around Camp Van Dorn whether they took place there or at Papago Park. He remembers the taking of the firing pins from their rifles because of the unrest at Camp Van Dorn after the shooting of Private Walker. He said they had problems with the MPs at both locations, and no problem with the local citizens in either Phoenix or Centreville. He remembers there being a "row" in town (he would shift from it being in Phoenix to Centreville). It started between a white unit and a black unit, in town and the white MPs went after the black troops.

He does not remember any dances being held at Camp Van Dorn. Whenever he got a pass he went to Baton Rouge. He rarely went to the service club or the PX; he mainly stayed in the company area and day room.

He does not remember going to Louisiana on maneuvers in 1943. He stated that they went on maneuvers a number to times, but thought they were all on or near Camp Van Dorn.

The Army was segregated during WWII; there was some contact with white soldiers, in the PX, which was also segregated. He does not remember his unit training with white units. He did not think that the men of the 364<sup>th</sup> got the same type of food as the white troops, thought they probably got better food.

Mr. Moultrie did not recall any other black units at Camp Van Dorn.

He served on Adak and Attu in the Aleutian Islands, Alaska. His unit built roads while on Attu. They also conducted regular training.

They lived in Quonset huts, one squad (11 men) per hut. They had a front door, 1 window on each side, were warm, and partly buried in the ground to keep them warm from the snow. It was cold nine months of the year.

He remembered the name of Colonel Goodman as the regimental commander, but never met him. He did not recall either Chaplain Gibson or Chaplain Davis.

Regarding the book The Slaughter, he did not hear of any attack or 1000 men of his regiment being killed.

He remembered that the 364<sup>th</sup> had a good cadre.

His friends in the regiment were Rufus McCan and Manning from Florida, Curtis MacLemore, who was a warrant officer when he saw him in Vietnam. He has not stayed in contact with anyone from the 364<sup>th</sup>.

## **364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Interview**

### **Mr. Ezell Norman**

Mr. Ezell Norman was interviewed via telephone at his home in Columbus, Mississippi, by Mr. Frank R. Shirer, CMH, on August 9, 1999.

Mr. Ezell Norman lives in Columbus, Mississippi, the city from which he entered the Army in 1941. The Veteran's Administration records show his Entry on Duty (EOD) as December 11, 1942. He says that he registered for the draft in 1939. His two years in Alaska color his memories and he kept returning to his service in Alaska. He made no mention of any riots or problems while in Alaska.

He received his basic training at Camp Shelby, Louisiana. He was assigned to C Company after he joined the 364<sup>th</sup> in 1942. He says he did not serve in any other regiment. He remembered performing duties as the company barber, working in supply, the mess hall and unloading food for distribution to the other units while stationed in Alaska. His highest rank was Private First Class (PFC). He said he was discharged from the Army in Alaska in 1945.

Mr. Norman does not remember either his company commander's name or have any memories about him.

He remembers being at Camp Livingston, Louisiana. It was a "rough time there." The troops were in "quarantine" and "couldn't go anywhere." The reason for the quarantine was because of the 393<sup>rd</sup> Infantry. It was broken up in to several units and some were sent overseas, to Alaska. He was in the part that was made into the 364<sup>th</sup>.

He remembers Papago Park in Phoenix, Arizona, as a "nice post, you could go across the border." He remembers their being fights there and "a big riot." However he was not in the riot and doesn't know how or why it began. He did state that it involved the 93<sup>rd</sup> Infantry Division. They were rushed away from Phoenix because of it, in a train that was guarded by armed guards at the station and they were not allowed to look out the windows.

At Camp Van Dorn he remembers about Private William Walker being shot, but does not remember by whom. He said that the 364<sup>th</sup> was kept on post because of bad feelings about the 93<sup>rd</sup> ID and folks thought they were part of it. He remembers "a riot downtown" happening while he was at Camp Van Dorn, but no specifics. He doesn't remember anything else from Camp Van Dorn, to include going on maneuvers in Louisiana.

He stated that there were no white soldiers in his company other than the commander. He also doesn't remember any white soldiers being at Camp Van Dorn. There were other

Black units at Camp Van Dorn (at Camp C, Camp E). He does not remember anything about the Sheriff of Centreville.

He described his service in Alaska as "rough." The weather was changeable and it was cold, "but the Lord took care of us." While in Alaska he worked as barber and in supplying food to the other companies. He helped unload the supply ships in all sorts of weather. They had a lot of snow and had to go out searching for guys who got lost and died in the snowstorms. "We had to crawl to the barracks it was blowing so hard," he said.

He remembers Colonel Goodman, and said he was a good man. Chaplain Gibson's name "rings a bell" but he does not remember anything else.

When told about allegation of 1000 men of the 364<sup>th</sup> being killed by MPs at Camp Van Dorn, he heard rumors. However, he stated that all of his friends left with him, though "a couple" were assigned to another unit in the regiment. None of the men he knew were shot or missing.

His worst experience was the 31-day trip by boat from Seattle to Alaska; the ship had unremembered problems that caused the voyage to take so long.

His friends from the 364<sup>th</sup> were: Mozell Howard, who also lives in Columbus, Mississippi, and they visit each other; Sylvester Jones and William Butler were two buddies who he lost track of, and thinks they are probably deceased.

He does have a picture from his time in the Army.

## **364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Interview**

### **Mr. Magie Shumate**

Mr. Magie Shumate a former member of the 364th Infantry was interviewed by Leo Hirrel on August 3, 1999, regarding his experiences in WWII. Mr. Shumate is now living in California.

Mr. Shumate enlisted in the band, and needed to obtain parental permission because of his age. He served with the 364th in Arizona and Mississippi, but not in Alaska.

During the time in Arizona the band played for various functions with the Arizona and California area. He did not perform the field duty with the rest of the regiment.

He said that the riot in Phoenix was provoked by a fight over prostitutes. After the riot the regiment was confined to camp; so they smuggled women into the camp by hiding the women in garbage cans.

He went with the regiment to Mississippi. He heard of a soldier being killed by the sheriff, but not much about the specifics. He seemed to think that other soldiers might have been killed in town.

As a member of the band, Mr. Shumate continued to travel and play, without the field duty of the infantry soldiers.

The band played at regimental dances. He didn't remember any trouble at any dances.

He left the regiment at Fort Lewis, before they went to Alaska.

He heard about stories that soldiers from the regiment were killed; but he didn't believe them. He didn't believe that a thousand soldiers could be killed.

## 364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Interview

### Mr. Samuel D. Smith

Leo Hirrel interviewed Mr. Samuel D. Smith over the telephone on August 17, 1999, at approximately 3:00 PM. He resides in Michigan.

Mr. Smith enlisted in the Army from Michigan, and performed his basic training in Alabama, at Fort McClellan he thinks. He served with the 364th in Arizona, Camp Van Dorn and Alaska. He served in Echo Company.

He had few specific recollections of Papago Park, although he seemed to have few complaints about the park. In Arizona his company maneuvered throughout the state, especially at Ft. Douglas. He remembers the duty as being hot and difficult.

He was not present during the riot in Phoenix.

The regiment moved to Mississippi by train, and he remembers that several soldiers wanted to get off at McComb, Mississippi. The town people were hostile, and the company commander kept the troops on the train.

He remembers a riot after a soldier died in Centreville. He credits the regimental commander with seeking to resolve the soldiers' complaints and quieting the riot. After that he does not remember any particular trouble. He does not remember any trouble at a dance.

He remembers training at Mississippi and Louisiana as difficult in the hot weather.

His most vivid memories are about the service in Alaska, at Adak. The regiment served as stevedores and did guard work. The wind was so bad that soldiers were forced to walk at an angle towards their destination, otherwise they would be blown off course and lost in the snow.

Regarding the officers, he seems to have a high opinion of his company commander and the regiment commander. He remembers the Captain Wooster would praise the soldiers for their performance on the rifle range. He remembers that Colonel Goodman as being fair to the soldiers and praising their work.

He mentioned that some soldiers had trouble adjusting to the Army and some were cycled through the stockade. Some of these soldiers were transferred to the 92d Division.

He never heard of a book about a supposed massacre of the regiment.

## **364<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment Interview**

### **Mr. Robert Thompson**

Leo Hirrel interviewed Mr. Robert Thomson about his service as a lieutenant with the 364th Infantry from summer 1942 to September 1943 over the telephone on June 29, 1999. Mr. Thomson joined the 364th shortly after his commissioning, July 4, 1942, and he served with the regiment in Arizona and Camp Van Dorn. He left the 364th to volunteer for parachute duty with the 517th Infantry. He served with the 517th in Italy and France.

Mr. Thomson was born in Virginia and was one of the white officers serving in this regiment. He felt that his relations with the enlisted personnel were good, but that relations with the Black officers were distant.

While in the 364th he served with D Company, K Company, and the Antitank Company. He stated that the quality of soldiers was best with the Antitank Company. In Phoenix he also commanded the "Rehabilitation Detachment" which was for habitual offenders instead of a special court martial.

His recollections of Arizona were that the regiment lived under harsh conditions. He believed that white soldiers would not have tolerated such poor conditions. Frequently the soldiers were on duty in the desert under harsh field conditions. They patrolled the Mexican border or were on maneuvers in the Superstition Mountains. He believed that the soldiers performed well in the field conditions; and he attributed this performance largely to the quality of the Non-Commissioned officers. Many of the senior officers were veterans of the Black cavalry units that had served along the Mexican border before the war. These veteran NCOs retired before the 364th moved to Camp Van Dorn.

Lieutenant Thomson was the officer of the guard during the Thanksgiving riot in Phoenix. He believed that tensions were developing between the African-American MP company and the 364th prior to the riot. Members of the 364th had been developing relations with the women in the Black/Mexican portion of Phoenix prior to their duty in the Arizona desert. When they returned to Phoenix they discovered that the MP's had become rivals for the same women within Phoenix.

On Thanksgiving Day the regimental commander had directed that all the officers eat with the unit, even if they had families in Phoenix. He also noted that additional beer was available. Following Thanksgiving dinner half the regiment was released on pass to go to town. Once in town trouble with the African-American MP company began; he believed that the MPs were responsible for the problems, as the MPs were armed and the 364th was not. After the trouble began, soldiers from the 364th returned to camp, got their weapons and went back to Phoenix. The situation then involved shooting on both sides and a general riot in Phoenix. Most members of the 364th were innocent, but they

could not return to their unit because of the riot. It took days for the regiment to collect its men.

He stated that following the riot the regiment recovered its sense of military discipline. The regiment marched in a rodeo parade and was well received by the citizens of Phoenix. They left for Camp Van Dorn in May.

He stated that most members of the regiment believed that they would only be in Camp Van Dorn for a short time before being shipped overseas. Conditions in the camp were exceptionally crowded. He believed that this overcrowding resulted from the belief that the 364th would only be in Camp Van Dorn for a short time.

Upon arrival in Camp Van Dorn all soldiers were informed that Centreville was off limits. Before the full regiment had arrived one soldier went into Centreville in order "to test the system," and was killed shortly afterwards.

Disorders occurred in the wake of the shooting. The only specific act of violence against an officer that Thomson knew about was an attack upon Lieutenant Strom from the 364 who was beaten up by his own men.

Following this riot morale plummeted didn't recover during his service with the regiment. The time was spent constantly doing various drill maneuvers.

Centreville was off limits to the soldiers from the post. Thomson believed that it was off limits to the members of the 99th Division as well. When on a Pass, soldiers passed through Centreville on their way to Baton Rouge. His wife was living in Centreville and he only had a few occasions to visit her. When questioned by LTC Graul he did not recall a disturbance at a dance, but later he recalled a minor disturbance at a dance.

Mr. Thomson had wanted to enter a parachute unit, but he had been turned down because of his height. After the disastrous jump in Sicily the parachute units started taking anyone. He received orders for parachute school in August or September 1943 and he departed around September 1943. He didn't maintain contact with former members of the unit except for a Lieutenant Colonel Hatcher. He wrote a manuscript history of the unit, which is at the Military History Institute.

He said that he had heard of the book by Carroll Case, and he could not believe that the story was true.
