Bucket/Snow Surveys	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Injury to the worker</li> <li>2. Illness to the worker if bit or stung by an insect or snake.</li> <li>3. Auto accidents.</li> <li>4. Frostbite or other cold weather related illnesses.</li> <li>5. Vehicle could become stranded.</li> </ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. When driving onto private properties, if the owner or their animals appear hostile leave at once. Large dogs and geese have been known to attack bucket survey parties.</li> <li>2. When investigating buckets, remain alert to hazards such as barbed wire fences, snakes, and poisonous plants.</li> <li>3. Do not read a map and drive at the same time.</li> <li>4. Dress for cold weather and be alert to signs of frostbite</li> <li>5. Have a winter survival kit in the car.</li> <li>6. Observe winter driving conditions.</li> <li>7. Do not venture unplowed isolated roads.</li> </ol>
