Towing Equipment	 Backing trailer Trailer coming lose from vehicle Hooking trailer to vehicle 	 Use caution when hooking up trailer. Train employees on how to pull/ back/ turn a trailer. Be aware of what's behind you when backing up; use all mirrors. Make sure the right size ball is being used along with the proper use of safety chains. Check trailer lights several times per day. Carry spare bulbs, fuses and light lens. Keep trailer wheels lubed. Be aware of needing longer braking distance and wider turning distance. 	Section 18.G Section 18.J

9. Always use safety chains attaching the boat to the trailer during transport.	
10. Carry a block to assist in raising the trailer in the event that the trailer needs to be detached from the vehicle.	
11. Carry wheel chocks for blocking trailer wheels when parked.	
12. Annually check the carpet attached to the trailer wheels when parked.	
13. Check and replace when necessary the non-slip grip tape on trailer fenders.	
14. Trailer wheel jack; unhook light (trailer) before backing trailer in water.	
15. All towing devices used on any combinations of vehicles shall be structurally adequate for the weight drawn and shall be properly mounted.	Section 18 F
A locking device or double safety system shall be provided on every fifth wheel mechanism and tow bar arrangement to prevent the accidental separation of towed and towing vehicles.	
Every trailer shall be coupled with safety chains or cables to the towing vehicle. Such chain or cable shall prevent the separation of the vehicles in case of tow bar failure.	
Trailers equipped with power brakes	

	shall be equipped with a breakaway device that effectively locks-up the brakes in the event the trailer separates from the towing vehicle.
