When cleaning or inspecting, be aware of wildlife such as snapping turtles, rats, muskrats, and wasps.</li> <li>2. Use gloves to protect against animal bites</li> <li>3. Wear steel-toed boots (snakes)</li> <li>4. Gage house: carry hornet spray and, if possible, deal with them in the colder months</li> <li>5. If bit by any animal, you should be checked for rabies</li> <li>6. Beware of farm dogs- some bite.</li> <li>7. Use good judgment</li> <li>8.
