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FUSRAP St. Louis Site Remediation Task Force Alternate Sites Workgroup February 28, 1995

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A meeting of the Alternative Sites Workgroup was held on February 28, 1995 at 9:30 AM at the Hazelwood Interim Storage Site trailer. In attendance at the meeting were:

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The meeting started with a discussion and clarification of how the "I. Site Suitability" category of the matrix will be used.

Dave Adler, DOE was then included by telephone and he provided site information on the DOE Nevada Test Site, Oak Ridge Reservation, and Hanford Reservation regarding 1) disposal capacity, 2) has 11e(2) material already been accepted from offsite? 3) can the site accept 11e(2) material? and 4) cost for disposal. Dave informed the workgroup that the St. Louis Site is the largest FUSRAP site in the nation in terms of volume, area of contamination, and total activity. Dave also addressed the status of the Weldon Spring Site with regard to acceptance of off-site waste, and advised that DOE has made a commitment to St. Charles County to not accept any waste from off-site for disposal at the Weldon Spring Site.

After Dave Adler terminated his call, there was further discussion of Weldon Spring and other DOE sites. The discussion was kept short, and the group agreed that the likelihood of these sites being used should be discussed only after the group has completed the task of filling in the matrix.

Kay Drey brought a copy of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 and pointed out the definition of 11e(2) by-product material that includes the FUSRAP St. Louis Site wastes. That definition will be with the alternative sites matrix. The meeting then turned to the task of filling in the alternative sites matrix. It was decided that the ranking system would be as follows:

- 0 unacceptable
- 1 bad
- 2 poor
- 3 neutral
- 4 satisfactory
- 5 good
- ? unknown at the time to working group fill in when information obtained

Jan Titus will clean up the matrix and definitions according to our discussion.

Then Jim Dwyer facilitated filling in consensus numbers for the category "I. Site Suitability." The remainder of the matrix will be filled in at subsequent meetings.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:00 PM.
