Discussion of Stakeholder Survey The working group agreed to review and comment on a draft new release about the near-term priorities recommended by the Task Force at its September meeting.

David Feldman, senior research associate and principal investigator at the Energy, Environment and Resources Center at the University of Tennessee-Knoxville proposed a second survey of St. Lour. Site stakeholders to assess perceptions of radioactively contaminated site cleanup. Mr. Dwyer said Mr. Feldman and asked in the Task Force were interested in recommending that DOE fund a survey of stakeholders around the downtown site (SLDS).

The working group decided the survey was not necessary. Mr. Dwyst said he would communicate the decision to Mr. Feldman.

The next meeting of the Communications Working Group is scheduled for 12:30 p.m. on November 2, 1995. The meeting adjourned at 2.50 p.m.
