Mr. Dwyer said Mr. Feldman had asked if the Task Force were interested in recommending that DOE fund a survey of stakeholders around the downtown site (SLDS).

The working group decided the survey was not necessary. Mr. Dwyer said he would communicate the decision to Mr. Feldman.

The next meeting of the Communications Working Group is scheduled for 12:30 p.m. on November 2, 1995. The meeting adjourned at 2:50 p.m.
