Subject: Special Task Force Working Session Thursday, February 29, 1996

A special working session of the St. Louis Site Remediation Task Force has been scheduled for 4 p.m. **Thursday, February 29, 1996**, at the Hazelwood Community Center, 1186 Teson Road, Hazelwood, Missouri, 63042. **Please note the special time and location.** The session is expected to run until approximately 9 p.m. Dinner will be served. Directions are enclosed.

The Task Force agreed at its regular meeting this past Tuesday to schedule a work session to identify and define potential remediation options for each component of the St. Louis FUSRAP Site. I have enclosed a sample matrix form that I propose be used to organize this effort and to record conclusions. The objective will be to develop specific language to fill in each box of the matrix, with a separate matrix to be developed for each of the following contaminated areas:

- St. Louis Downtown Site (SLDS)
- St. Louis Airport Site (SLAPS)
- Hazelwood Interim Storage Site (HISS)
- Latty Avenue Vicinity Properties and Haul Routes
- Ballfield
- Coldwater Creek

Once that task has been completed, the Task Force will have identified four options, ranging from "no action" to "complete excavation and remote disposal," for each of the focus areas. Those options can then be used, in a subsequent meeting, as a framework for discussion leading to specific recommendations for each area. That information will then provide the basis for the initial draft of the Task Force report to DOE.

Please note that, at next Thursday's working session, participants will not be debating the relative merits of the options. The task will be simply to describe the

actions that would logically be a part of each option scenario for each of the defined areas. The merits of the various options will then be debated at a second meeting.

Your active participation in this important effort is strongly encouraged, as are any comments or suggestions you may care to offer.

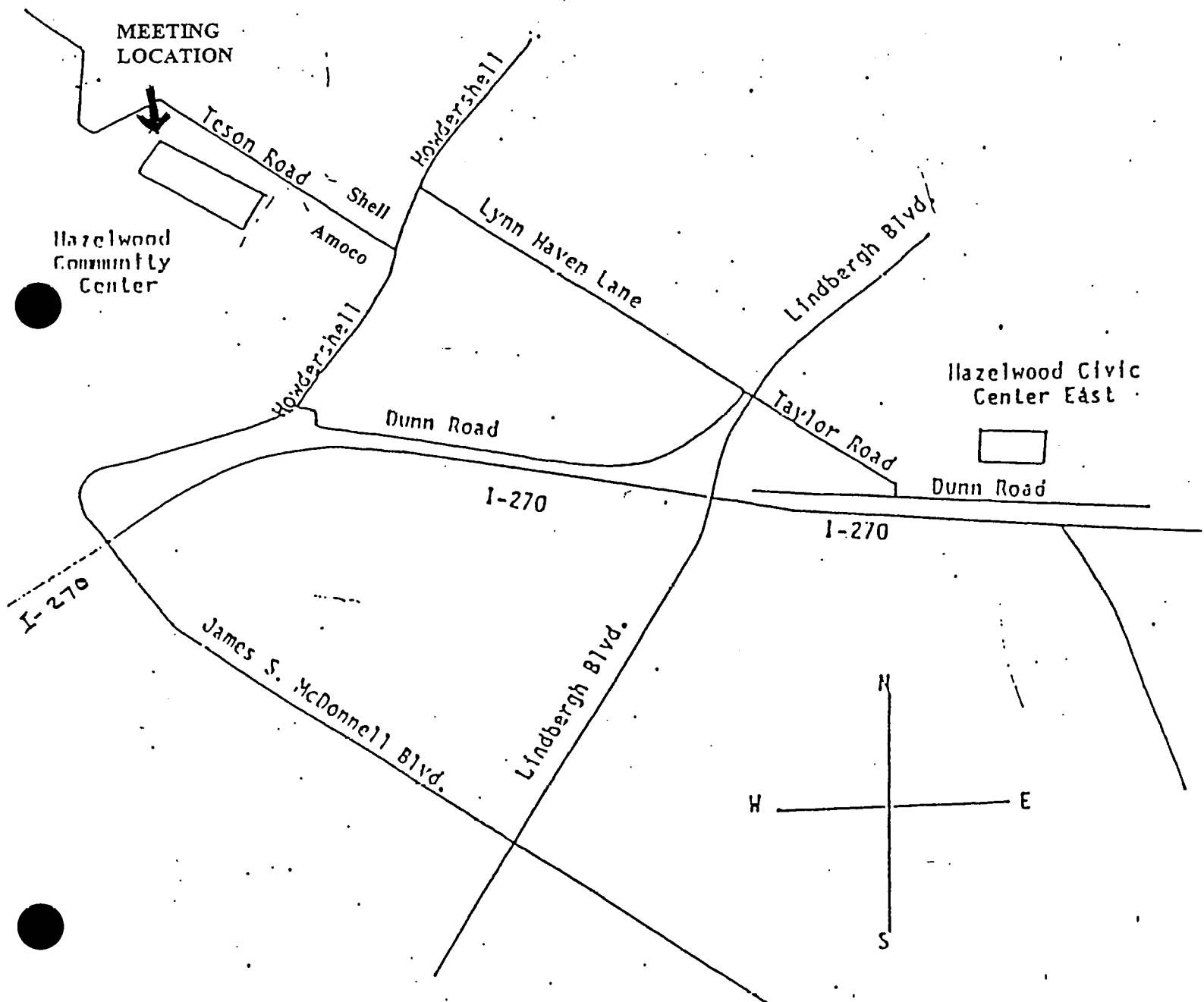
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Exit I-270 at McDonnell Blvd/Howdershell Road
