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Summary of May 11, 2001 Meeting

The following comments are in addition to the handouts provided by USACE at the meeting (see attached).

Chairperson Ric Cavanagh reported that he had talked with Anna Ginsberg, Co-Chairperson of the Oversight Committee, regarding her continued involvement with the project as a result of the election of a new mayor for the City of St. Louis. Since the transition to a new mayor was just under way, she stated that she would seek clarification from Mayor Slay's office and report back as soon as possible.

Page 4 - USACE will provide a flow chart of the review and approval process at our next meeting. There probably will only be between 45-50,000 cyds of rail shipments (not 60,000) due to funding restrictions.


Page 5 - Sharon Cotner reported that last Friday, two rail cars arrived at Envirocare with ripped or torn covers. Fortunately, the content of the cars was low level materials. This is the first time such an incident has occurred. It may be the result of faulty bags (1% of bags may have some defects). Tom Binz asked if this was a DOT reportable incident. Staff could not provide an answer but will do so at next month's meeting. As part of the beginning of the Long Term Stewardship planning process, a Friendly Neighbor letter signed by Col. Morrow will go out to property owners in the FUSRAP area advising them to contact the FUSRAP office before doing any work on their property. Tom Manning asked if there are any contaminated areas that might be effected by the construction work on I-270 and I-170 that is supposed to begin in the fall. Staff will check on this and report back at our next meeting.

Page 7 - Correction: PSC is done. Plant 2 PRAR no longer on hold (will go forward as is). Rail shipments will exceed the 7500 planned

Page 8 - Regarding Long Term Stewardship, neither the federal or state governments have the power to place deed restrictions on properties. The Long Term Stewardship

Committee will seek to clarify the role of the city and county in such proposed activities. It may require legislation on the local level.




