Summary of August 11, 2000 Meeting

Members Present: Ric Cavanagh, Sally Price, Tom Manning, Tom Binz, Jon Langerak, Jack Frauenhoffer, Jan Titus

The following comments are in addition to the handouts provided by USACE (see attached).

Page 4 – The water is both treated and untreated. Selenium was totally unexpected. This could severely challenge the water treatment budget. This is a high priority issue. Some of the Selenium may be in the ground water table. On the whole, there have been a few more hot spots than expected (but actually less contamination than expected).

Page 5 – Trailers are off site, utilities capped.

Page 6 - 57/58 are the Allied Systems Property. PRAR = Post Remedial Action Report. 36 is the open area at Latty and Frost.

Page 8 – FS/PP – 30 days for regulators review, then thirty days thereafter. Public review is likely in late November, early December. (DOE at Grand Junction has also been sent a copy).

Jack Frauenhoffer et al. commented on DOE's Long Term Stewardship Confererence. Key ideas: don't take long term stewardship for granted; don't underestimate costs. The best route is to "clean up to clean standards" so that there is no long term stewardship required.

Tom Horgan from Rep. Talent's office commented that the House has supported \$140 million for FUSRAP (same amount as requested by the President) which reflects no cut in the budget. In the Senate, appropriations are tied up in a non-partisan squabble over fish and water issues. It might result in a continuing resolution (but shouldn't effect the work in St. Louis). He also commented that General Flowers from Ft. Leonard Wood would likely be the new head of the Corps of Engineers.

Page 9 – the new numbers will be effective 8/14

Dave Wagoner commented on a regulatory issue: high concentrations of contamination in the fill might cause a problem. Envirocare can't open a new cell until the old one is capped off. To do so will require more low level fill to top off cells.

Larry Erickson of MDNR commented that DOE Grand Junction will be visiting soon at Weldon Springs (next three to four months).


