#### Highlights of September 11, 1998 Meeting

<u>Committee Members Present:</u> Sally Price, Jack Frauenhoffer, Bill Brandes, Donovan Larson, Jan Titus, Richard Cavanagh

Please see the attached copies of handouts provided by USACE for the meeting. The following are additional comments from the meeting. Page numbers reference the page of the handout.

- Pg. 4 SLAPS east end construction to start 9/21, not 9/24. The rail spur stock pile is being shipped to Envirocare immediately.
- Pg. 5 Rail spur location may need to be changed due to unwillingness of land owner to allow access without significant financial payment. The HISS pile will be shipped in FY 99 after the rail spur is completed.
- Pg. 6 the Florissant work entails removal of sediment by the bridge. Two questions were raised and will be addressed at next meeting: 1) What is the degree of contamination of the sediment? 2) When were field characterizations done most recently?
- Pg. 7 ROD for SLDS is awaiting the General's signature. City properties will be done first in October, 1998.
- Pg. 8 a total of an additional \$4 million was available from other sites. However, St. Louis was only able to justify spending \$1.5 million since it had to be spent by the end of FY 98. USACE will attempt to establish arrangements and have contracts in place for the end of FY 99 so that St. Louis can get more money at the end of FY 99 (if available).

GAO visited USACE staff as a follow up of initial audit done in June at the request of the House Commerce Committee with the knowledge of the Water and Energy Committee. Questions focused on the budget, clean up standards, justification of the use of rail versus truck, etc.

The Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with DOE deals with long term monitoring, land ownership, etc.

Pg. 9 - again it was stressed that HISS/Latty Ave work is dependent on the construction of the rail spur. It was also clarified that N/A for SLDS does not mean that there would be no additional funds to be utilized for SLDS. (FY 99 Capability column refers to amount above budget).

Pg. 10 - meeting with Coalition of Black Trade Unionists was the result of a NIOSH study on employees of Mallincrodt. NIOSH mistakenly thought that Mallincrodt was no longer in business and wanted to discuss potential effects on employees of Mallincrodt between 1942-1966. Since Mallincrodt is still in business, NIOSH needs to talk directly with those employees who are still alive.

Pg. 11 - There has been no meeting with Anna Ginsberg as of the date of the meeting.

#### New Taskers:

- get dollar amounts to be spent on VP's
- what was the level of contamination at St. Denis bridge
- provide NIOSH report to committee when available
- inform Jan Titus as to how much longer to complete the characterization of the ballfields
- State wants to know when wells are being drilled so that they can have a geologist on site

#### Final Comments

No digging is expected in January and February due to weather. Hope to have stockpiled dirt so that shipping can continue year round.




