



Progress Report St. Louis Airport Site (SLAPS)



Gateway to Excellence

- Remedial Investigation
 - Walkover of Airport Authority property S of Banshee Road is complete compiling sample data to define the nature and extent of contamination.
- Remedial Design
 - Work Descriptions for Phases 4 / 5 and Phase 6 90% and 60% USACE comments provided to S&W to update document. Next step is regulator review for Phase 4/5 and USACE 90% review for Phase 6.



As you know, a great deal of radioactive waste left over from World War II has been removed from the airport in the last few years. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is preparing to announce a final plan for cleaning up the remaining soil in the North County area. The plan will be released soon and we will want to hear your comments. We know this plan will use a lot of words and ideas that are technical and complicated. To help you understand what is being suggested, the Corps is offering a free two-day training session to explain the terms used. It will answer the following types of questions:

- * What is radioactivity?
- * What risks are associated with radioactivity?
- * What sort of planning process will be used? How long will it take?
- * What do these documents mean to me?
- * How does this process protect me, my workers, local residents, etc?
- * What is a risk assessment?
- * How are cleanup areas identified?
- * What happens during and after cleanup?
