#### **GRPHP** Overview

- Idea first developed when planning greenhouse at Riverlands
- Bridging gap in communication/collaboration amongst organizations working to enhance pollinator habitat
- Several goals:
  - Enhance and restore pollinator habitat in the Confluence and Greater St. Louis region
  - Promote education, outreach, and training programs
  - Provide best management practices (BMP) and sharing expertise on pollinator conservation
  - Support pollinator/native habitat research
  - Collaborate on grant opportunities



# Pollinator Survey Protocol

- Standardized protocol to guide partners on surveying pollinators and vegetation
- Includes a variety of survey methods
  - Targeted Hand-netting
  - Floral Sweep-netting
  - Bee Bowls
  - Vegetation Sampling
- Draft developed for review/feedback

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
# Other Research & Monitoring

  - Xerces

  - Monarch Joint Venture
- NGRREC Wetland Pollinator Monitoring



#### Riverlands Greenhouse

- 30' x 70' climate-controlled greenhouse located at the Rivers Project Office
- Propagation of plant material for restoration / enhancement of pollinator habitat
- Outreach, education, and research opportunities
- Partners can provide seed/volunteers to grow plants
- Groundbreaking August 2023



# Future Grant Opportunities

- NFWF Monarch Butterfly and Pollinator Conservation Fund
  - Habitat Improvement of at least 500 acres
  - Priority is Monarch habitat (milkweed)
  - 200k-250k in grants
- NEEF Biodiversity Conservation Grant
  - Project must impact at least 150 acres
  - Habitat enhancement project must be shovel ready (within 3 months of award date)
- Pollinator Partnership
  - Native wildflower Seed Grant (Seed collection opportunity)
- Taylor Geospatial Institute
- Handshake Grant (USACE)
  - 20,000-25000
