Feasibility (CAP Section 107)

Contact:

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Location: The project focuses on Terminal 2 located west of Baldwin, Illinois, near River Mile 18.5 on the Kaskaskia River Navigation Project, approximately 45 miles southeast of St. Louis, Missouri.

Description: As result of growing industries and increasing demands, the Kaskaskia Regional Port District (KRPD) Terminal 2 is at risk of experiencing limitations on future capacity needs. KRPD has requested assistance from the St. Louis District to evaluate needed navigation improvements. KRPD has experienced significant increase in tonnage and current facilities could limit future growth with potential impact to local and national economy.

Status: The St. Louis District office has recently expanded the study at the request of the sponsor. This will allow USACE to include the north oxbow to the study. The Project Delivery Team (PDT) hosted a public scoping meeting related to the north oxbow addition and is working toward a Tentatively Selected Plan (TSP).

Importance: With project and funding, better connectivity and channel improvements would support growing tonnage and capacity needs.

Authority: Section 107 of River and Harbor Act of 1960 (PL 86-645), as amended.
