	JOB STEPS	HAZARDS	ACTIONS TO ELIMINATE OR MINIMIZE HAZARDS	RAC
X	Walking	Being mistaken for a threat to personal property	Make yourself identifiable as a Corps Ranger by displaying patches or wearing uniform. When practical avoid walking on private property.	L
X		Hunters	Wear blaze orange vest during hunting season. Avoid displaying white items during deer season.	L
X		Injuries due to slips or falls, etc	Choose path to be walked carefully. Concentrate on walking. In areas where terrain is rugged, wear lugged sole shoes with good ankle support.	L
X		Blisters on feet	Possible measures: wear two pairs of wool socks. Wear shoes or boots with good ankle support. Cover spots being rubbed with mole-skin or bandaids.	L
X		Scratches from thorny plants	In areas where thorny plants can't be avoided, briar-proof chaps can be worn	L
X		Dehydration	Carry and drink plenty of water	L
X		Hypothermia	Dress for the weather, know signs of hypothermia. Carry matches or lighter.	L
X		Possibly become injured and unable to walk	Carry communication devices with you and call for help with a portable radio or cell phone if any issues arise	L
X		Getting lost	Before leaving office let co-workers know what area you plan to work in, carry a map and a GPS with you to assist in navigation	L
X		Getting bit by dog, wild animal, ticks, poisonous snake or spider. Getting stung by bees.	Stay alert. Watch where stepping. Be aware of proper first aid procedures. Put tick deterrent spray on clothes before leaving office. Carry pepper spray. Carry portable radio to contact help.	L
X		Contact with poisonous plants	Be able to identify plants so that they can be avoided. Wash areas of possible contact. The degree to which a person is allergic should determine precaution taken. Long sleeves should be worn. Put on poison ivy block before leaving office.	L
X	Painting monuments, and witness trees	See painting AHA	Follow Painting AHA	L
