16. Pienic tables and lantern holders must remain on gravel surfaces at campsites with gravel impact areas.

15. All wheeled vehicles, including but not limited to mopeds, boat trailers, motorcycles, and other vehicles, must be kept on camping pads registered to vehicle users or in designated parking areas. All motor vehicles must be parked lengthwise on the camp pad except at sites with irregularly shaped pads. Parking on the grass, roadside or obstructing the first is prohibited. b. The total number of camping units for double capacity sites is limited to two recreational vehicles or trailers and six tents. If no recreational vehicles or trailers are on the site, a maximum of eight tents will be permitted.

a. The total number of camping units for single capacity sites is limited to one recreational vehicle or trailers and three additional tents. If no recreational vehicle or trailers are on the site, a maximum of four tents will be remitted

13. At Carlyle Lake the majority of sites are classified as single capacity sites. The only exceptions are designated buddy sites, which are double capacity sites.

12. A responsible person must register with the Park Attendant prior to placing any equipment on a campsite. All campers are required to present valid identification upon registration and designate their primary camping unit. Check out time is 4:00 p.m. Reservation sites will be available for occupancy when available, but no later than 50:00 p.m.

1. The operation of drones or other $\mathsf{UAV}\xspace's$ is prohibited on all Corps land without a permit.

Interpretive Programs

Hiking Trails

Enjoy a scenic hike at Carlyle Lake! Chipmunk Nature Trail (1/2 mile) is located near McNair Campground, Little Prairie Nature Trail (3/4 mile) in the Dam West Spillway, and Willow Pond Nature Trail (1/4 mile) is located by the Visitor Center. There are over nine miles of nature trails at Eldon Hazlet State Park.

Bike Trail

The Carlyle Lake Bike Trail is the perfect way to stay fit while enjoying the beauty of Carlyle Lake. The trail offers over 60 miles of federal, state, and county roads including a scenic view from atop the Carlyle Lake Dam and a trip through Southern Illinois wetlands. Day Use Fee

There is a \$5/day fee to use the boat launching ramps at Keyesport, Dam West, Dam East, Coles Creek, and Boulder. There is a \$5/day/vehicle fee to use the beach at Keyesport, Dam West, McNair, and Coles Creek.

Total day use fees will not exceed \$5/day/vehicle. The fees do not apply to children under the age of 16, or campers registered at Corps of Engineers campgrounds.

Fees can be paid at automated fee machines, which have been installed in all day use areas. These machines have taken place of honor vaults and only accept debit/credit cards. A Corps of Engineers annual pass is available for a \$40 fee. The pass is valid for a period of 12 months from the month of purchase. This pass is valid only at USACE projects for which a day use fee is charged. Annual passes are honored nationwide at Corps of Engineers managed facilities. A voucher for an annual pass can be obtained from any automated fee machine. Once purchased, the voucher must be brought to the Carlyle Lake Project Office or Visitor Center within seven days of purchase to receive

Annual pass or day use fees are no longer required if the individual is an America the Beautiful pass cardholder.

America the Beautiful Passes

America the Beautiful Passes (Senior Annual, Senior Lifetime, Access, Military, Every Kid Outdoors, and Volunteer) can now be obtained/purchased at the Carlyle Lake Project Office, Campgrounds, and Visitor Center. Reservations

You can reserve individual campsites at Dam West, Coles Creek, Boulder, and Dam East-McNair; group sites at Lotus and Coles Creek; and picnic shelters at Boulder, Coles Creek, Dam West, Dam East, Keyesport, Spillway East and Spillway West. All fees will be paid in full at the time of reservation. Reservations may be changed or canceled, subject to additional service fees, at the same phone number. A credit card may be used to pay fees by phone or on-line.

Campsite Registration

At Dam West, Coles Creek, and Boulder all campers must register at the fee booth to verify their primary camping unit and provide trailer/RV license plate number prior to placing any equipment on a campsite. If outside the fee booth hours, visitors should follow directions posted at the fee booth.

Check out time is 4:00 pm. Check in time is 5:00 pm.

As of November 1, 2021, campers will now be able to make reservations at Dam East - McNair Campground. All sites will be available to reserve from current day up to six months in advance. QR Codes are located on each individual site post, that can be scanned to check availability.

After completing registration, campers must place their primary camping unit on the site at the time of occupancy. If a tent is the primary camping unit on the site at the time of occupancy, then tent camping only is permitted on the site for the duration of the stay.

Group Area Reservations

Group reservations can be made for Group Area C at McNair Campground. If Area C has not been reserved, this area will be available on a first come, first serve

Group sites are available at Lotus and Coles Creek Area A (formerly Loop 2) and Area B (formerly Loop 3). R1S reservations for group areas must be made a minimum of three days in advance. Lotus Group Area and Coles Creek Area A and Area B may be reserved up to six months, to the day, in advance. If Coles Creek Areas A and B have not been reserved in advance of the three day minimum, the sites are available individually on a first come, first serve basis. The Lotus Group Area is available solely for group use.
