

## **CARLYLE LAKE HUNTING FACT SHEET**

### **2011 – 2012 HUNTING SEASON**

#### **General Hunting Regulations and Rules**

- It is unlawful to possess or consume alcoholic beverages while hunting.
- It is unlawful to operate any type of vehicle off designated roadways.
- No hunting is allowed within 100 yards of a residence or from recreation areas.
- **ALL** hunters must sign in and sign out and record harvest at the nearest sign in box.
- Dumping of animal carcasses is prohibited.
- Portable tree stands or ladder stands are permitted but must be removed after each days hunt, no screw-in steps, spikes, nails or permanent tree stands are permitted.
- Permission must be obtained from adjacent landowners prior to entering private property.

#### **Deer Hunting (Archery)**

- Jim Hawn and East Spillway Areas are closed to archery hunting during all firearms deer seasons.

#### **Deer Hunting (Firearms)**

- Statewide regulations
- Jim Hawn and East Spillway Areas are closed to firearm deer hunting.

#### **Dove Hunting**

- Statewide regulations, except hunting hours are from Noon – Sunset September 1-10. After September 10, shooting hours are from Sunrise – Sunset.
- Steins field will be designated as handicap dove field on September 1 & 2, all hunters must register at the Carlyle Lake Project Office. A drawing will be held prior to the hunt to allocate blinds.

- Lotus dove fields will open the Tuesday following Labor Day, shooting hours will be Noon – Sunset until September 10, then it will be Sunrise – Sunset with statewide regulations applying.

### **Furbearer/ Trapping**

- If trapping in a designated waterfowl impoundment area, no land traps are permitted, and a special use permit from the project office is required.

### **Waterfowl**

- Statewide Regulations
- Shooting hours are one half hour before sunrise until 1 p.m.
- Bond Branch is closed to waterfowl hunting, signage on point 1 will indicate where this area begins. Bond Branch is open to hunting during early teal season.
- Peppenhorst Branch is open to waterfowl hunting however, hunting only from the west shoreline of the cove is permitted unless the hunter can hunt from his boat and not be docked on the eastern shoreline. All hunters must be a minimum of 200 yards from the Hazlet State Park entrance road.
- Jim Hawn Wetland Area is open Thursday through Sunday during the regular duck season. Post duck season, goose hunting will be allowed 7 days a week. All hunting is from designated blinds or pits, a maximum of 4 hunters per blind is allowed. All hunters MUST sign in and sign out and record harvest at the Hunter Sign-In box located at the Jim Hawn Parking Lot, once signed in hunters may access water blinds from land or by boat.
- All waterfowl hunters must be signed out of the Jim Hawn Area by 3:00 p.m., and may not enter back into the area until 12:01 of the next calendar day.
- Shooting hours for the final three days of Canada goose season will be one half hour before sunrise until sunset.

- Shooting hours for Early Canada goose and teal season are sunrise – sunset.
- Shooting hours for the Conservation snow goose season are statewide regulations.
