### **TRAILS**

Lick Creek Trail - An 8-mile multipurpose trail located off Route J across from the Ray Behrens entrance extending to the Duane Wheelan Recreation Area.

Joanna Trail - A multipurpose trail containing three loops: Prairie Loop (4 miles), Log Cabin Loop (11 miles), and Pioneer Loop (5 miles). All of which comprise a 32-mile scenic trail with trailheads at the John F. Spalding Boat Ramp entrance and Hunter/Fisherman 11.

### The Northeast Missouri Vietnam Veterans Memorial

Located in the M.W. Boudreaux Recreation Area Complex, the 40-foot diameter sundial with an 11-foot tall marker in the center casts a shadow on the monument's concrete plaques representing the months of the year. The names of 45 area men who died in the Vietnam War are on the plaques stating the months in which they died. The Memori-al honors men from the Missouri counties of Monroe, Ralls, Shelby, Marion, Macon, Pike, and Lewis.

### M.W. Boudreaux Picnic/Eagle Trail Area

As you enter the Complex, enjoy the prairie restoration along the sides of the road. Big bluestem, Indian grass, little bluestem, and switch grass are the most abundant. During spring and summer, the prairie is a canvas of colorful wildflowers!

Please feel free to walk Northeast Missouri's first ADA compliant nature trail. Enter the shaded oak and hickory forest and pause at the bench atop the limestone-capped bluffs overlooking the lake.

# **VISITOR REGULATIONS**

Rules and regulations governing public use of U.S. Army Corps of Engineers water resource development projects are published in Title 36, CFR and are posted on bulletin boards or are available from a park ranger. The following additional regulations are in effect for all U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, St. Louis District Projects as authorized in Title 36, CFR 327.12a.

### GENERAL

- 1. The operation of drones or other Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS's) is prohibited on all project lands, unless specifically authorized by the Operations Manager.
- 2. The operation of powerless flight devices including, but not limited to sail planes, gliders, balloons, parasails, and hang gliders is permitted. Powerless flight devices shall not be operated on any part of the dam, roads, bridges, or over beaches or other heavy use areas.
- 3. The use of all kite tubes, defined as a "towable, inflatable device designed to be airborne", are banned from use on Corps managed waters throughout the St. Louis District.
- 4. All waste water must be collected in a container and disposed of in authorized disposal facilities. In primitive areas where sanitary facilities are not provided, human waste must be buried 100 feet from any body of water and/or campsites.
- 5. The use of America the Beautiful Senior Pass, America the Beautiful Access Pass, Golden Age or Golden Access Passports by someone other than the person to whom the pass was issued is prohibited.
- 6. All motorized vehicles operated on roadways on public land administered by the Corps of Engineers must be licensed and operated by licensed drivers.

## **PICNIC AREAS**

7. Picnic areas, designated by the Operations Manager and marked with appropriate signs, close at 10:00 p.m. Other areas, which are not posted, will remain open to public use.

### BEACH

- 8. Alcohol is prohibited on the sand and water portions of all swimming beaches and other nearby facilities normally associated with beaches which are marked with appropriate signs. These facilities include, but are not limited to, picnic areas, parking lots, picnic shelters, etc.
- 9. All glass and other dangerous objects, including but not limited to, lawn darts and horseshoes, are prohibited on the sand and water portion of swimming beaches.
- 10. To avoid unsanitary conditions, all food, pets, and waste materials are prohibited on the sand and water portions of swimming beaches.
- 11. Beach users must stay within designated swim area.

### CAMPING

12. A responsible person must register and pay fees within a reasonable time after a camp is established or when the fee booth opens. Check out time is 4:00 p.m. Reservation sites will be available for occupancy when available, but not later than 5:00 p.m. The maximum number of campers per site is eight.

## DAY USE FEES

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers charges use fees in developed recreation areas for facilities including fourlane boat ramps and public beaches. The following fee charges apply:

Boat Ramps - \$5.00/day · Beach Use - \$2.00/day (Maximum Fee \$5.00/vehicle/day) There is no charge for children under 16 years of age at the beach.

Annual Passes may be purchased for \$40.00 at the M.W. Boudreaux Memorial Visitor Center and the campground fee booths. Annual Passes expire one year from the date of purchase and are honored nationwide. **DAY USE FEES DO NOT APPLY TO REGISTERED CORPS CAMPERS.** 

The USACE Annual Pass is valid only at USACE recreation areas where a day use fee is charged. A USACE Annual Pass is no longer required if you have an America the Beautiful Pass.

### SHELTERS

All shelters have electric, picnic tables and plenty of parking places. There are nine shelters found on the project. They are located at the Ray Behrens Day Use Area, Indian Creek Group Camp, Indian Creek Day Use Area, John C. "Jack" Briscoe Group Camp, Frank Russell Day Use Area and Bluff View Recreation Area. The John F. Spalding Recreation Area has three shelters, with the third having a restroom. Reservations accepted a maximum of 12 months and a minimum of 1 day before planned arrival. All shelters can be reserved, or if not reserved, used on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Individual Campsite Reservations accepted a maximum of 6 months and a minimum of one day before planned arrival (day-of-arrival reservations are accepted at Frank Russell Campground). Group Campsite Reservations accepted a maximum of 12 months and a minimum of one day before planned arrival. A two night minimum stay is required for all weekend campsite reservations. A three night minimum is required on holiday weekends.

**Picnic Shelters** are available on a first-come, firstserve basis if a shelter is not reserved for that day. Reservations are accepted a maximum of 12 months and a minimum of one day before planned arrival. Reservation fee is \$30.00.

- 13. The total number of camping units per site is limited to one recreational vehicle or trailer and three additional tents. If no recreational vehicles or trailers are on the site, a maximum of four tents will be permitted. The maximum number of people permitted to stay overnight on a site is eight.
- 14. Campground roads and facilities are to be used by registered campers and their visitors, only. Interfering with, or restricting the use of the shoreline by boaters or other lake users is prohibited.
- 15. All wheeled vehicles, including but not limited to mopeds, minibikes, boat trailers, motorcycles, and other vehicles, must be kept on camping pads registered to vehicle users or in designated parking areas. All motor vehicles must be parked lengthwise on the camp pad except at sites with irregularly shaped pads. Parking on the grass, roadside, or obstructing traffic is prohibited. Empty boat trailers may be stored on the grass, provided that they are moved onto and off the grass by hand.
- 16. Picnic tables and lantern holders must remain on gravel surfaces at campsites with gravel impact areas.
- To avoid tree damage, hanging lanterns are to be suspended a minimum of 8" from the side of trees and 24" from overhead limbs. Do not drive axes, nails or other objects into trees.
