Area Highlights

This area is mostly forested and contains several backwater sloughs.

Recreational Opportunities

Bird Watching – Bicycling – Fishing – Hiking – Hunting - Outdoor Photography – Wildlife Viewing

Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized fishing and hunting activities.

- · No fireworks.
- · No open fires.
- · No target shooting allowed.
- Dogs must be leashed or confined when not being trained or used for hunting. Special-use permits are required for field and retriever trials.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal use. Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited. Taking of wild greens from natural areas is prohibited.
- Motor vehicles are allowed on public roadways and in parking areas.
- · Bicycling is allowed on roads open to vehicles.
- Camping is prohibited.
- Swimming, scuba diving, water skiing, sailboarding, skateboarding, caving and rappelling are prohibited.

Fishing and Boating

Fishing and frogging are allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- Bullfrogs and green frogs may not be taken with firearms.
- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited.
- Salvage seining of non-game fish for personal use is permitted only with written authorization.
- Boats may be used for fishing and wildlife activities and may not be left unattended overnight.

Hunting and Trapping

Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:

- If entering from the L&D 25 recreational area, firearms must remain unloaded and cased until the Conservation Area is entered.
- Deer hunting is permitted under statewide seasons and limits.
- Only portable tree stands are allowed and only from September 1 through January 31. Unattended stands must be plainly labeled on a durable material with the full name and address, or Conservation Number, of the owner and be removed from the area before February 1. Use of nails, screw-in steps, and any material or method that would damage the tree is prohibited.
- Decoys and portable blinds are permitted but must be removed from the area daily. Blinds may be constructed on-site, but only from willows and nonwoody vegetation.
- Furbearer trapping is permitted by special-use permit.
