High points of the program include 7 new 1200ft locks at existing facilities. L25 is the first of those new locks to be funded. 
# Lakisha Vance Little Rock District Small Business Deputy



### **ABOUT THE USEPA**

Established in 1970, the USEPA mission is simply to protect human health and the environment, while ensuring that the nation has clean air, land, and water.



### **FOCUS OF PRESENTATION**

Although nearly half of the USEPA budget is spent on grants to support state environmental programs and other organizations, the focus of this presentation is on acquiring goods and services that directly benefit or that are used by the USEPA.

### **USEPA COMMITMENT TO SMALL BUSINESS**

Fiscal Year 2021 small business expenditures of \$679,000,000 exceeded the prior fiscal year by \$86,000,000! HUBZone spend reached a record breaking \$75,600.000, significantly contributing to the revitalization of underserved communities. USEPA also establishes subcontracting small business goals each year.

### UNDERSTANDING THE FEDERAL ACQUISITION ENVIRONMENT

Doing business with the Federal government is unlike operating in any other marketplace.

Complex rules and regulations govern all Federal agency buying. Public funds require fair opportunity to compete. Federal buyers cannot just use the companies they may prefer (exception: micro purchases of \$10,000 or less.

Typical selling and marketing practices may not yield the same results in this environment as in the private sector.

# SMALL BUSINESS ADVANTAGE IN FEDERAL ACQUISITION

All procurements under the simplified acquisition threshold (currently \$250,000) must generally be set-aside for small businesses meeting SBA size standards.

Small Disadvantaged Businesses (SDB), particularly those in the Business Development (8a) program, Women-Owned, HubZone, and/or Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Small Businesses (SDVOSB), may be eligible to receive preference for direct awards.

### **GOODS AND SEVICES PURCHASED BY THE USEPA**

Remediation services and environmental consulting services for the planning and execution of short-term and long-term environmental cleanup activities form the bulk of USEPA work.

The USEPA also purchases an array of other goods and services, including laboratory equipment and maintenance, IT equipment and maintenance, general consulting services, and research. The Great Lakes National Program Office, located in Region 5 Chicago, even has a research vessel!

Regional small business specialists assist with planning and executing these activities in their respective regions.

### FEDERAL SUPPLY SCHEDULES CONTRACTS (FSS)

Federal buyers often start here. GSA FSS contracts are a key tool for Federal buyers as they streamline the process.

### SYSTEM FOR AWARD MANAGEMENT (SAM) REGISTRATION

### EPA SMALL BUSINESS VENDOR MANAGEMENT SYSTEM REGISTRATION

### GOVERNMENT PURCHASE CARD

Acceptance of the purchase card should be notated on your SAM registration.

### OFFICIAL FEDERAL PROCUREMENT PORTAL (SAM)

SAM allows you to register for automatic notifications of solicitations. Use North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) code 562910 for remediation services and 541620 for environmental consulting services (key EPA contracting areas).

The SBA's Prime Contracts Program serves to strengthen the economy of the Nation by striving to create maximum practicable opportunities for Small Business (SB) and all other socio-economic concerns while increasing overall competition in the Federal acquisition process.



## PCR Responsibilities

- Assigned to a contracting activity to carry out SBA policies and programs
- •Recommend the set-aside of selected acquisitions
- •Recommend new qualified small business sources
- Appeal Contracting Officers' decisions which they deem adverse to small businesses
- •Provide advice to large businesses concerns to facilitate subcontracting opportunities for small businesses
- •Investigate issues upon the request of a SB, the activity, or SBA office



## **Subcontracting Assistance Program**

The SBA Subcontracting Assistance Program is to increase the utilization of SB concerns in Federal Government procurements by ensuring subcontracting opportunities are available for SB concerns. SB concerns include small, disadvantaged businesses (SDBs), woman-owned small businesses (WOSBs), Historically Underutilized Business Zone small businesses (HUBZones), veteran-owned small businesses (VOSBs), and service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses (SDVOSBs).



## **CMR** Responsibilities

- Ensure that Large Business (LB) prime contractors provide maximum, practicable subcontracting opportunities for SBs
- Review & monitor a LB prime's subcontracting programs & achievements and challenge prime's "good faith efforts" as stated in its subcontracting plan
- Assist LB primes to identify SB sources for new & existing subcontracting opportunities
- Counsel & Advise SBs on how to market LB primes


